

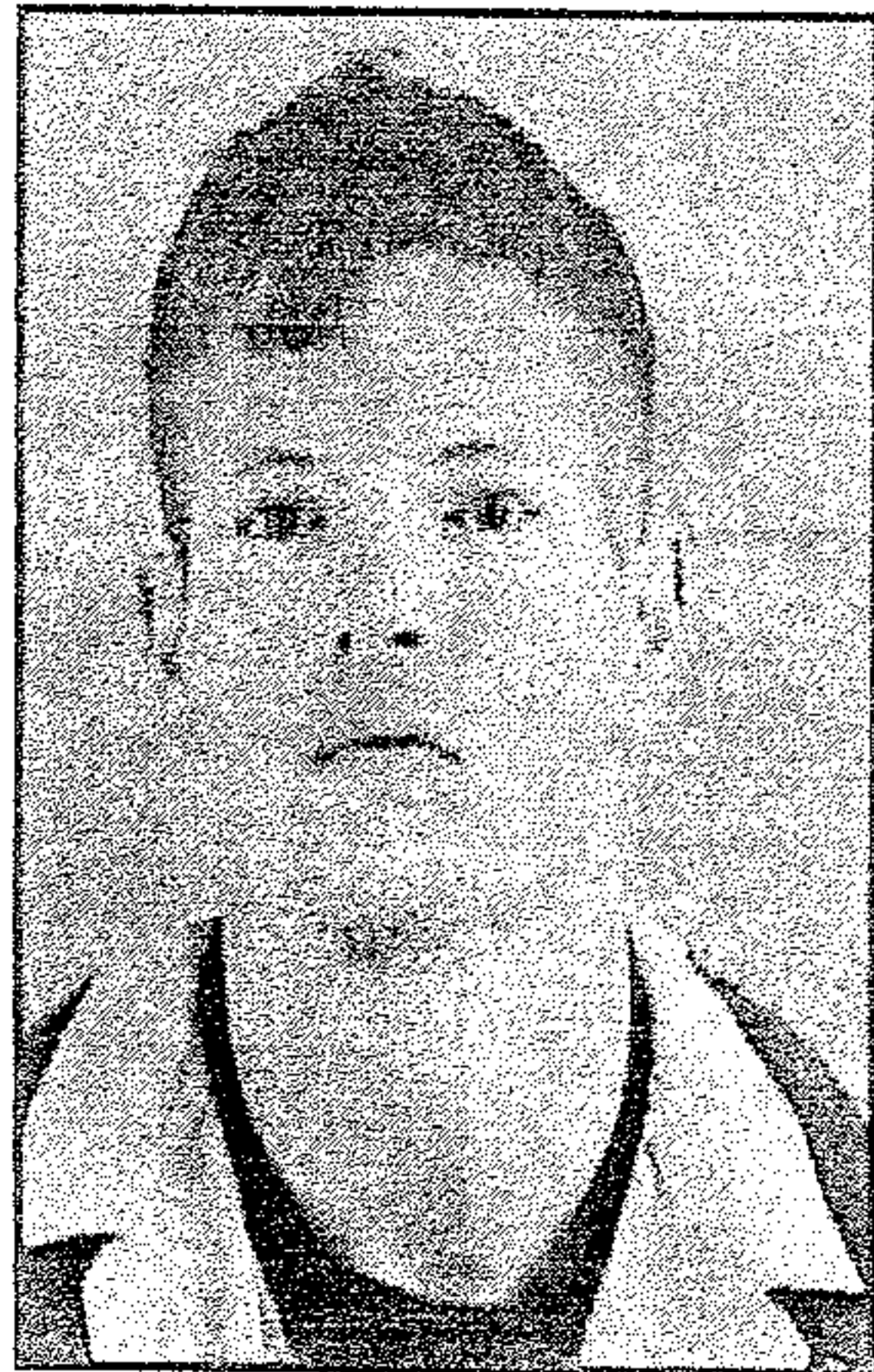
Amber alert victim rescued after LCSOs Chief Davis and Deputy Scarbrough after high speed chase

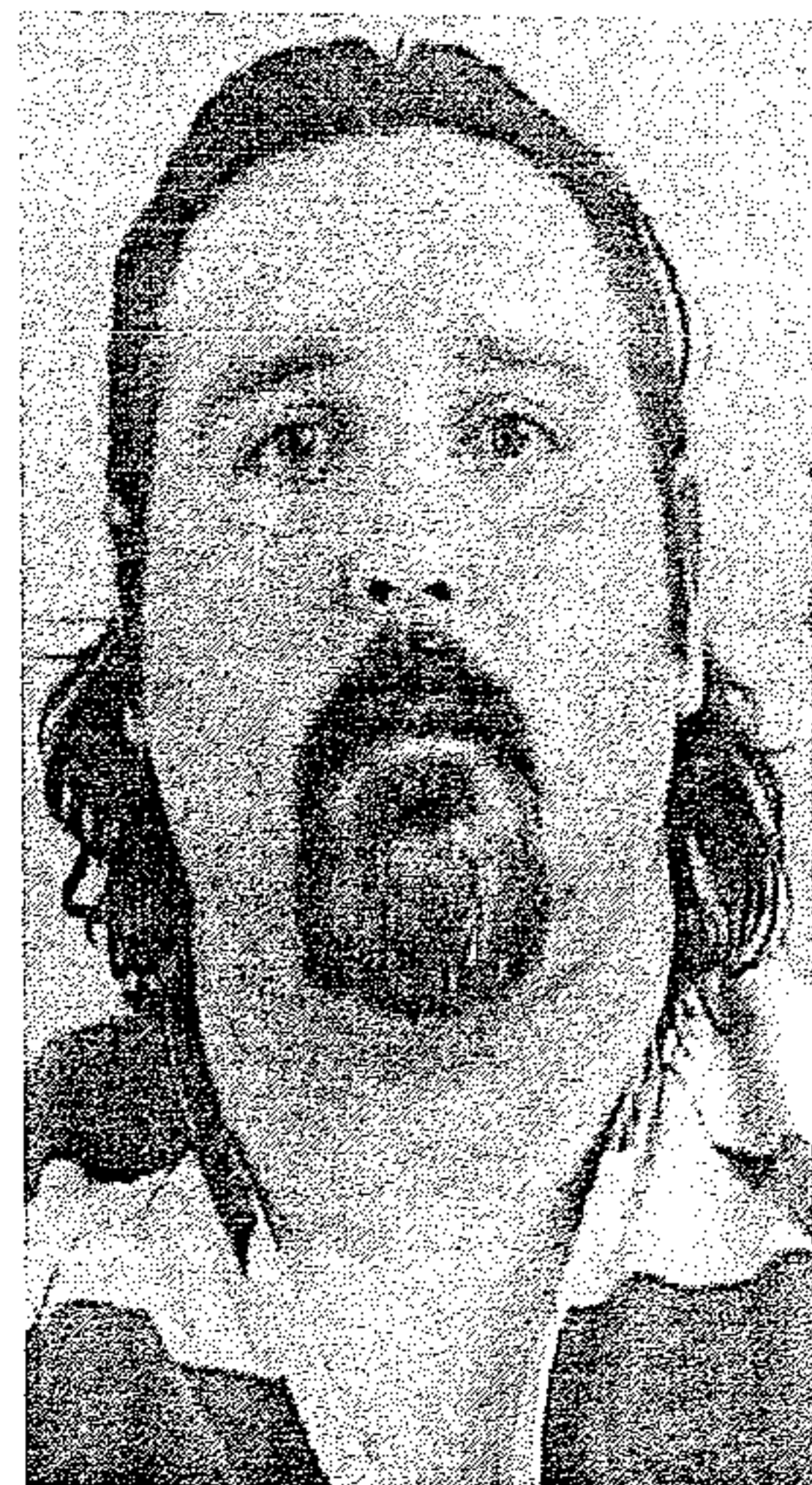

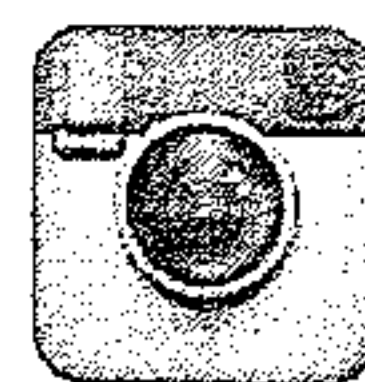
National Cyber Security Awareness Month Simple Steps for Internet Safety

In today's digital world, online safety should be of paramount concern for all individuals and organizations because the threats posed by cyber criminals can't be ignored. hicle. Dispatch also advised the vehicle matched the description of the Amber Alert issued out of Georgia. The deputy got behind the vehicle and noticed it didn't have any registration displayed. The deputy activated his emergency equipment and the blue Subaru sped up and refused to pull over. Speeds reached over 120mph in a 65mph zone. The blue Subaru went I40 east and got off at Watt Road and ran the red light at Watt Road and the exit

ramp, turned left, went across the interstate and got back on I40 westbound. Chief Jimmy Davis took over the pursuit at that point. The pursuit continued on I40 west and the blue Subaru got in the middle lane and at the last second went west toward Nashville. The pursuit went onto Industrial Park exit ramp and got back on westbound. The pursuit exited the 360 ramp, and turned left over the interstate on Buttermilk Road west. The pursuit continued on Buttermilk and was coming up on Industrial Park Drive

when the blue Subaru turned right onto a dirt road. The officers went up hill to a grassy area where it continued to attempt to get away. The vehicle was finally stopped and the deputy along with Chief Davis ordered the subject out

of the car and placed them in custody.

EMS came to the scene and checked all involved. The driver was identified as Emily P. Sherer. Mrs. Sherer is being charged with evading arrest felony. Amber Alert

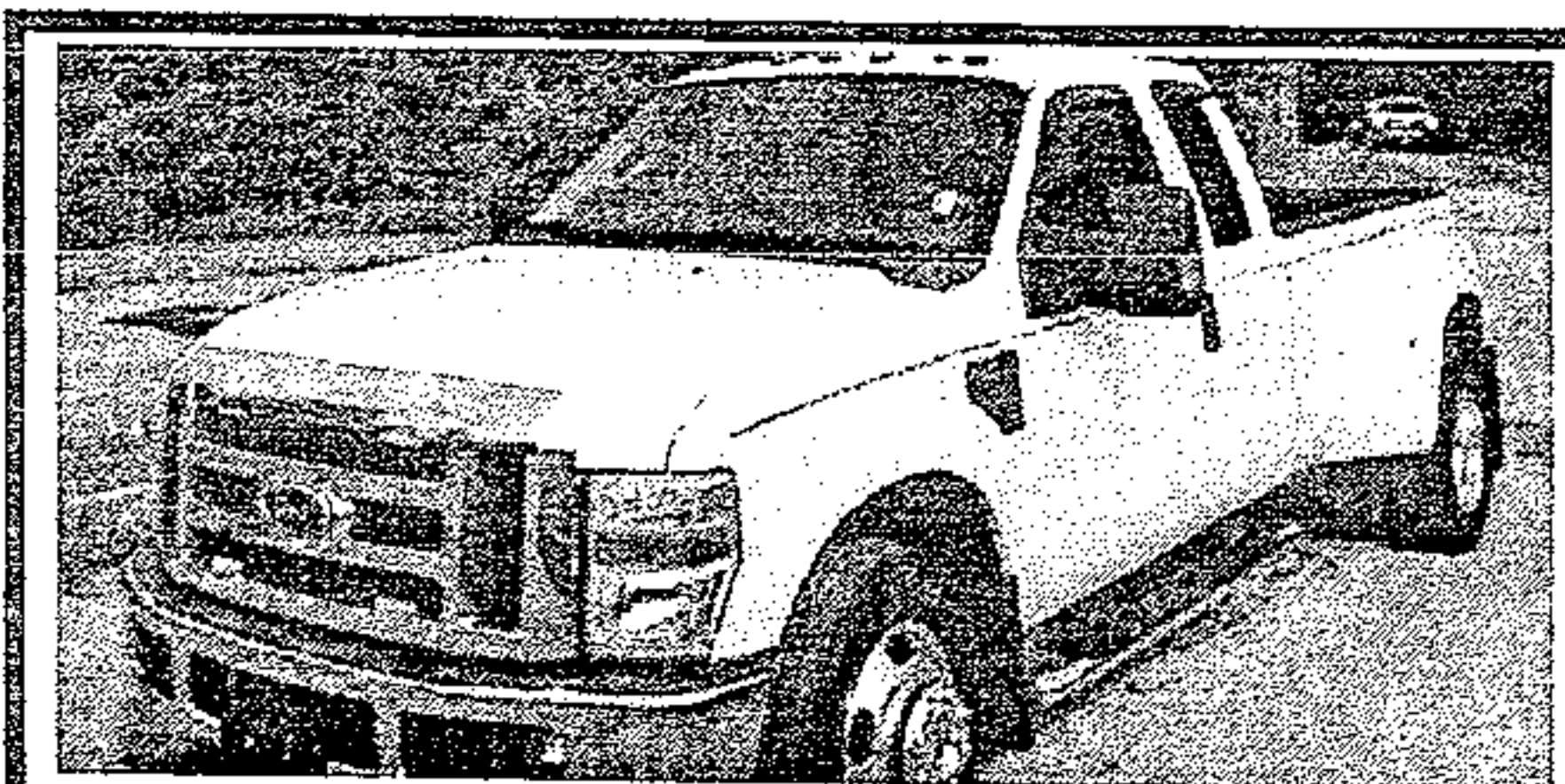

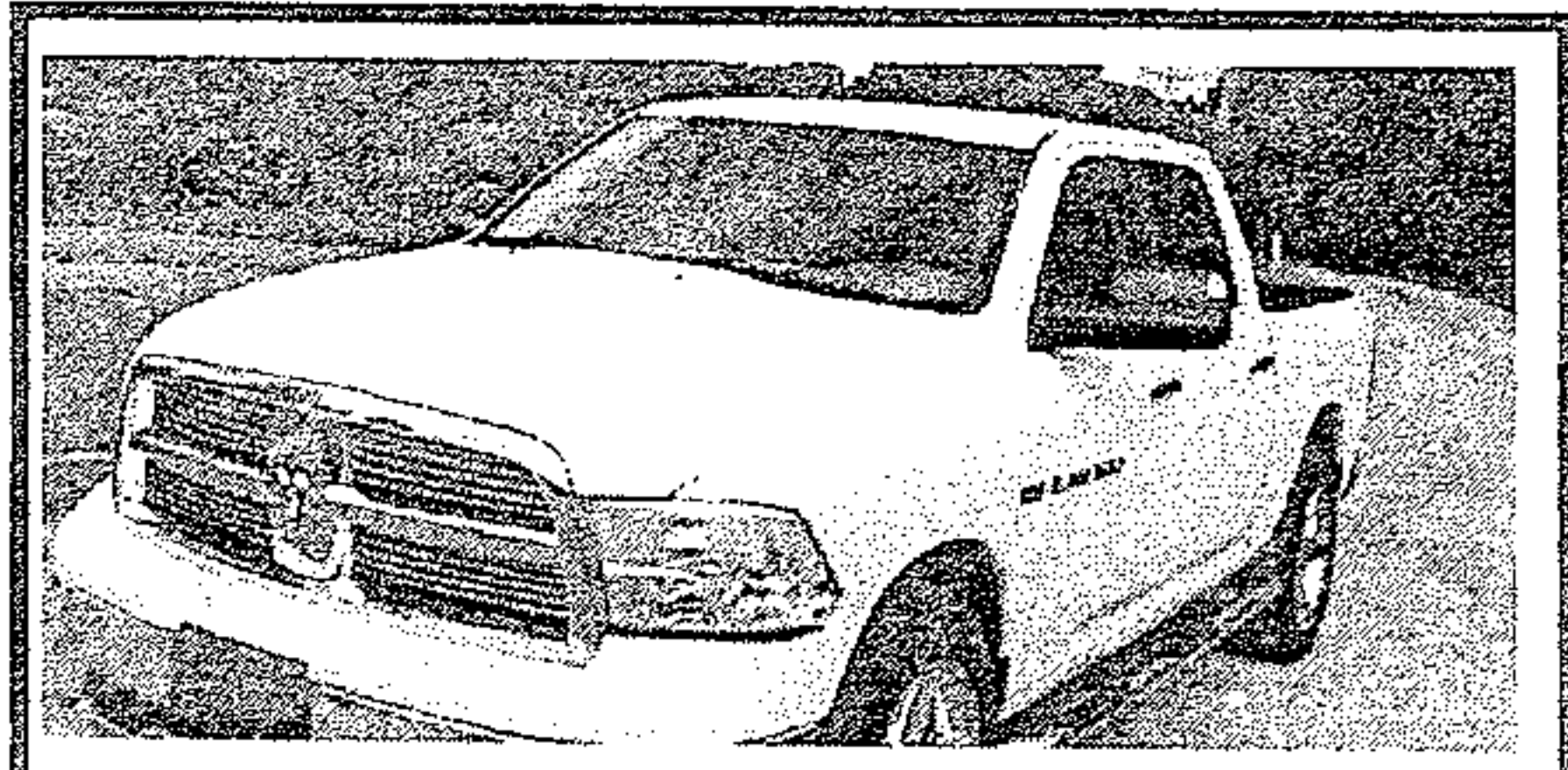

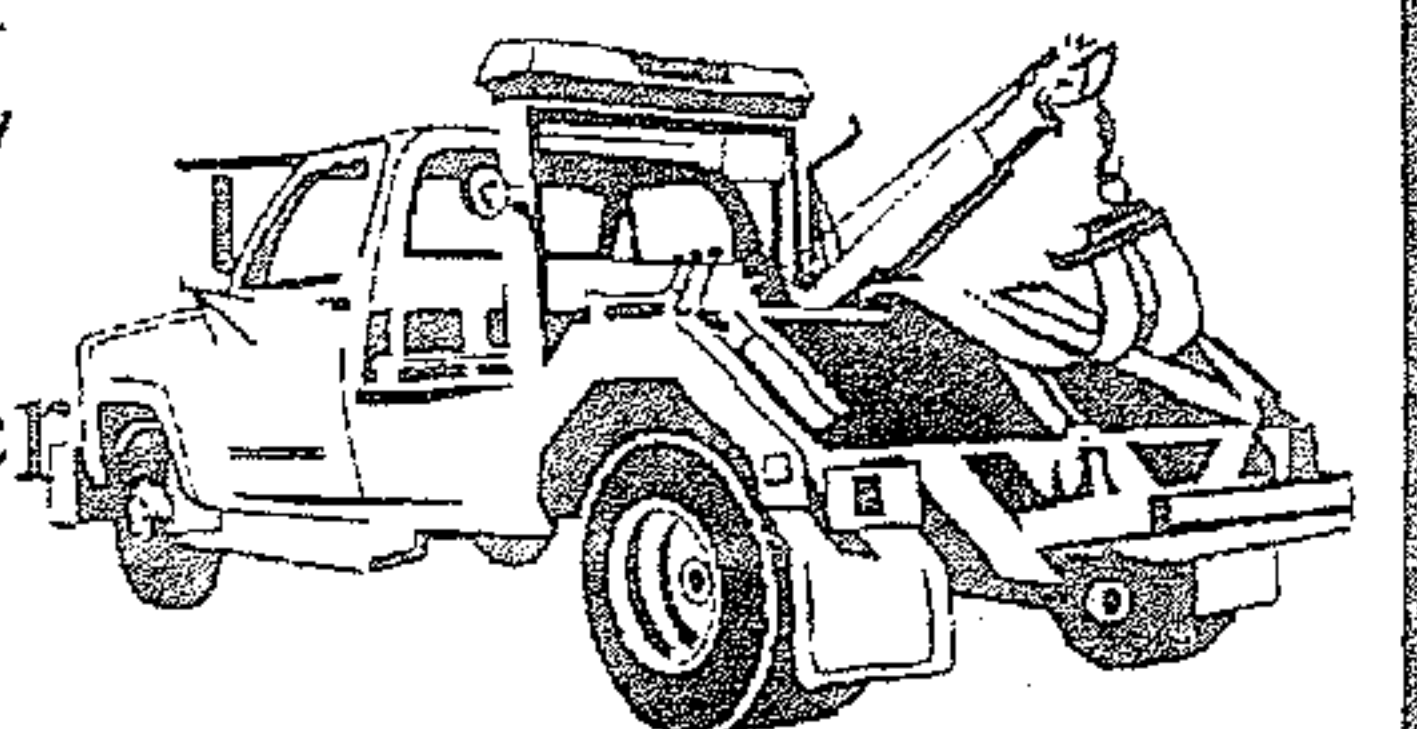

nology that increases security by incorporating requirements beyond a password, like a particular physical trait, a dynamic PIN, or the location or time of a login attempt. Many e-mail service providers and social media platforms offer TFA as a free service—most require a strong password and supply a PIN that changes periodically. Users can receive these PINs easily via mobile applications or text messages.

Observed each October, National Cyber Security Awareness Month is the perfect time of year for individuals, businesses, and other organizations to reflect on the universe of cyber threats and to do their part to protect their networks, their devices, and their data from those threats.

In terms of social media, remember that once personal or organizational information has been posted to a social

networking site, that information can no longer be considered private and can be—and sometimes is—used for criminal purposes. The highest security settings on an Internet account may not be enough to prevent a leak of sensitive data—for example, cyber criminals often can obtain personal passwords regardless of their complexity. In doing so, they can gain access to banking credentials and credit card numbers, get hold of social security information, download malware to a computer, or hijack a device to perpetrate further crimes. So be careful—post as little personal information as possible, use two-factor authentication, and beware of embedded links that—if clicked on—may lead to scam webpages and malware being downloaded to your computer or mobile device.

Another level of online security involves protecting your mobile devices from cyber intruders in public places. Not all WiFi hotspots at coffee shops, airports, or hotels have strong security protections. Persons in close proximity may be able to access that open network and collect your login information and the content of your online browsing. Securing your phone or tablet is as simple as

avoiding sensitive sites that require a login, so try to avoid signing into bank accounts, e-mail, or social media accounts while on a public WiFi hotspot. But if you have to, use a reliable personal virtual private network (VPN) service provider. A VPN enables data encryption and adds a layer of security to communications, making it more difficult for cyber criminals to spy on you.

An out-of-band backup is another useful cyber security technique. This involves backing up your data to a virtual, cloud environment or storing hard copies of digital data at a physical location elsewhere. Using this method is ideal in combating ransomware, a type of malware which restricts access to files or threatens their destruction unless a ransom is paid to the cy-

Kids, too, can learn steps to Internet safety through the FBI's Safe Online Surfing (SOS) program. SOS is a nationwide initiative designed to educate children from grades 3 to 8 about the dangers faced when surfing the web. SOS promotes good

cyber citizenship among students by engaging them in a fun, age-appropriate, competitive online program where they learn how to safely and responsibly use the Internet.

Bradley Russell, 18, Pike Street Lenoir City, was charged with Assault.

Zachery Russell, 19, Pike Street Lenoir City, was charged with

Aggravated Assault.

Bradley Russell did commit the offense of assault. Bradley Russell did intentionally and knowingly assault the victim, by spitting at Hoffman and striking Hoffman

with his hand. A reasonable person would regard the contact as extremely offensive. Russell and victim were having a verbal dispute, victim walks away and Russell spits at him. Victim spit

back at Russell, the two approach one another, Russell struck victim with his hand. It was determined Russell was the primary aggressor in the altercation and he did commit assault. Russell had

threatened victim with a knife just prior to this assault, and did spit at and strike victim first, thus causing victim to fear imminent bodily injury. A video of the incident was provided to Lenoir City Police Department and (Sgt. Lynette Ladd) did view the video. The video confirms that Russell committed assault on the victim. During the altercation Bradley's brother Zachery Russell, used the knife and stabbed victim several times. Victim was transported to the hospital for his injuries victim. This offense did occur in Lenoir City, Loudon County, TN.

ganizations from the risks of cyber crime, your best defense is understanding and implementing strong security practices and maintaining them regularly. Doing so can raise a perpetual firewall against cyber criminals and keep your sensitive data safe.

More Internet Safety Tips

Protect your computer. Keep your firewall turned on, and make sure your antivirus and antispyware software is up to date and your operating system is current. And be very careful what you download—opening an e-mail attachment from someone you don't know or even forwarded attachments from people you do know could potentially infect your computer with malicious code.

Beware of social media scams. One of those scams involves posts on social media sites appearing to offer vouchers or gift cards that require you to fill out a survey, but that survey is designed to steal

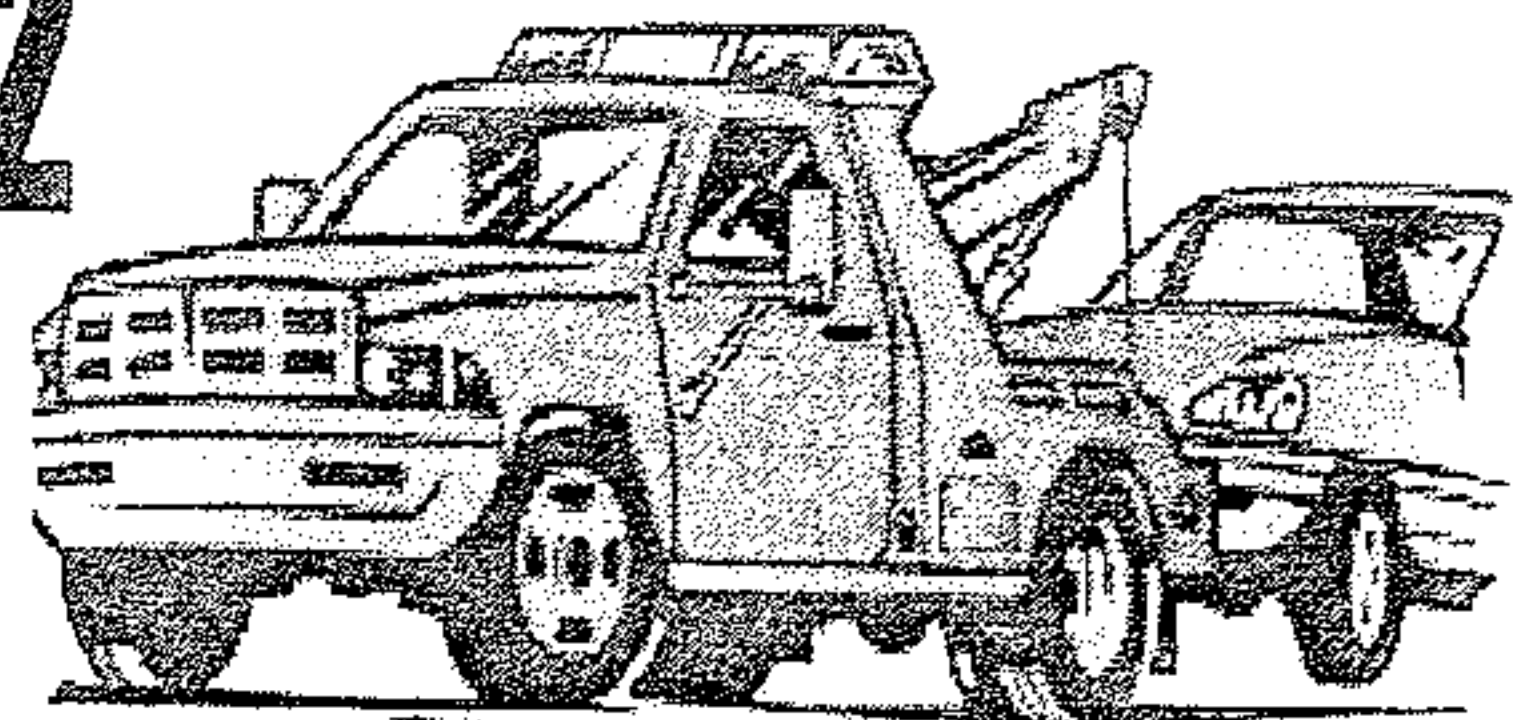

your personal information. Also, don't post pictures of theater, concert, or sporting event tickets on social media—fraudsters can create a fake ticket using the barcode obtained from the photo.

Smartphone App Scams. Before downloading an app from an unknown source, look for third-party reviews. Some apps, often disguised as games and offered for free, may be designed to steal personal information from your device.

Be on the lookout for online shopping scams. Scammers often defraud consumers by offering too-good-to-be-true deals via phishing e-mails or advertisements on un-

trusted websites—including offers for brand name merchandise at extremely low discounts or promises of gift cards as incentives to purchase products. You may end up paying for an item, giving away personal information and credit card details in the process, and receive nothing in return except a compromised identity.

Don't fall for work-from-home scams. You may see websites or postings offering work you can do from the comfort of your own home, but many of these opportunities have unscrupulous motivations behind them. Always carefully research the job posting and the individual or company offering you employment.

As always, if you suspect you've been the victim of a cyber crime, contact law enforcement and file a complaint with the FBI's Internet Crime Complaint Center.

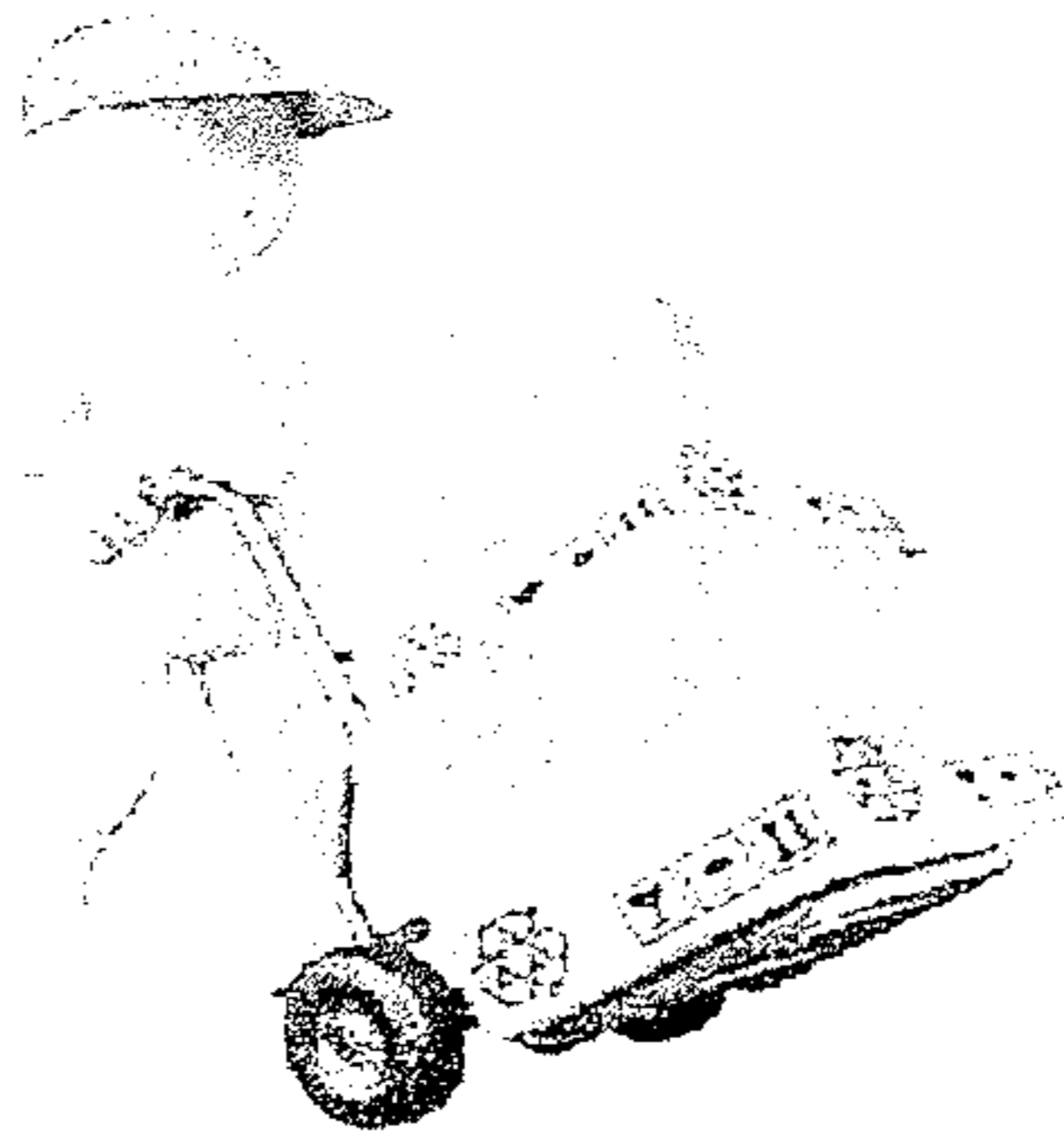
