ry and Major General Max Haston for a ribbon cutting ceremony. The first class of approximately 100 cadets is set to begin July 9.

“This is an innovative approach to help teens who may be headed down the wrong path change the trajectory of their lives. It sets them up for success by helping them earn high school diplomas and making them eligible for Tennessee Promise, which is right in line with our Drive to 55 goals,” Haslam said. “It’s a great example of the departments of Military and Children’s Services collaborating in an inventive way to serve young Tennesseans.”

The program is voluntary and open to youth with no criminal record. It consists of a 22-week residential phase during which cadets focus on core components in a quasi-military envi-

ronment while setting goals and creating a life plan. Graduates return to their communities for a 12-month post-residential phase under supervision of caring adult mentors who serve as role models.

“For the past 15 years, the Military Department has attempted to establish a Youth ChalleNGe program,” said Maj. Gen. Max Haston, Tennessee’s adjutant general. “Through our collaboration with the Department of Children’s Services we have done so. Our goal is to provide cadets with the opportunity to complete high school, or the high school equivalency test, and get a job while learning life, leadership, and social skills they can use for the rest of their lives as productive citizens. I can’t say ‘Thank you’ enough to Gov. Haslam, Deputy Gov. Henry, and Commissioner Bonnie Homrich for making this a reality.”

The Tennessee Volunteer ChalleNGe Academy was approved by the U.S. Department of Defense and is the 40th in the country. Its implementation is one of the steps in the governor’s Public Safety Action Plan.

Funding for the program was part of Haslam’s FY2016-17 budget, consisting of \$4.35 million from new federal funds and a \$1.35 million state investment.

**Haslam Highlights Cut in Grocery Tax Provided by IMPROVE Act**

*IMPROVE Act creates the largest tax cut in state history*

Tennessee Gov. Bill Haslam highlighted the 20 percent reduction to the grocery tax included in the newly implemented IMPROVE Act by visiting local grocery stores in Elizabethton and Mount Juliet.

Effective July 1, the IM-

PROVE Act, “Improving Manufacturing, Public Roads and Opportunities for a Vibrant Economy,” creates the largest tax cut in state history while delivering a safe, reliable and debt-free transportation network.

The IMPROVE Act cuts \$125 million in sales tax on groceries by reducing the tax rate from 5 to 4 percent and is a net tax savings for average Tennessee families – a fact confirmed by

the Americans for Tax Reform, an organization that opposes all tax increases as a matter of principle.

"We've reduced the cost of government, and we're returning those dollars in tax cuts. The sales tax on food is a tax that all Tennesseans pay, and the IMPROVE Act is a conservative and responsible plan that puts dollars back into the pockets of all Tennesseans by cutting the grocery tax and directly addresses how we fund our roads and bridges for the first time in 30 years," Haslam said.

The IMPROVE Act cuts business taxes for manufacturers by \$113 million and has already helped attract manufacturing jobs to the state. In May, Nokian Tyres cited IMPROVE as a major factor in its decision to invest \$360 million in a new tire manufacturing facility in Dayton that is expected to create 400 new jobs.

When fully executed, IMPROVE will cut more than \$500 million in taxes annually, bringing the total amount of tax cuts by the Haslam administration to more than \$800 million. Since 2011, the governor has worked with the General Assembly to cut more than \$500 million in on-going expenses out of the state budget, and Tennessee continues to have the lowest taxes in the nation as a percentage of personal income.

Senate Majority Leader Mark Norris (R-Collierville) and Reps. Barry Doss (R-Leoma) and Bill Dunn (R-Knoxville) carried the legislation through the legislative process.
