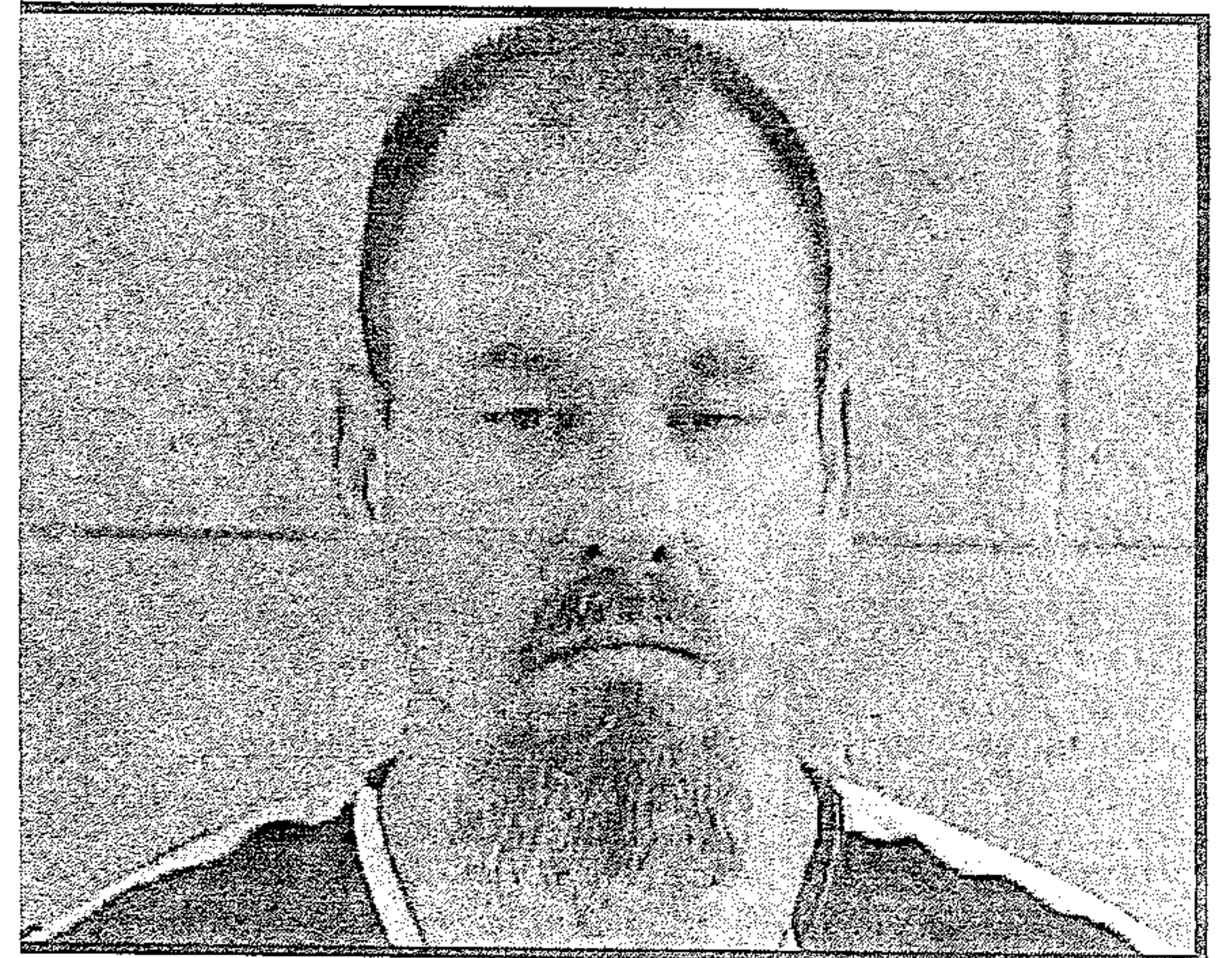

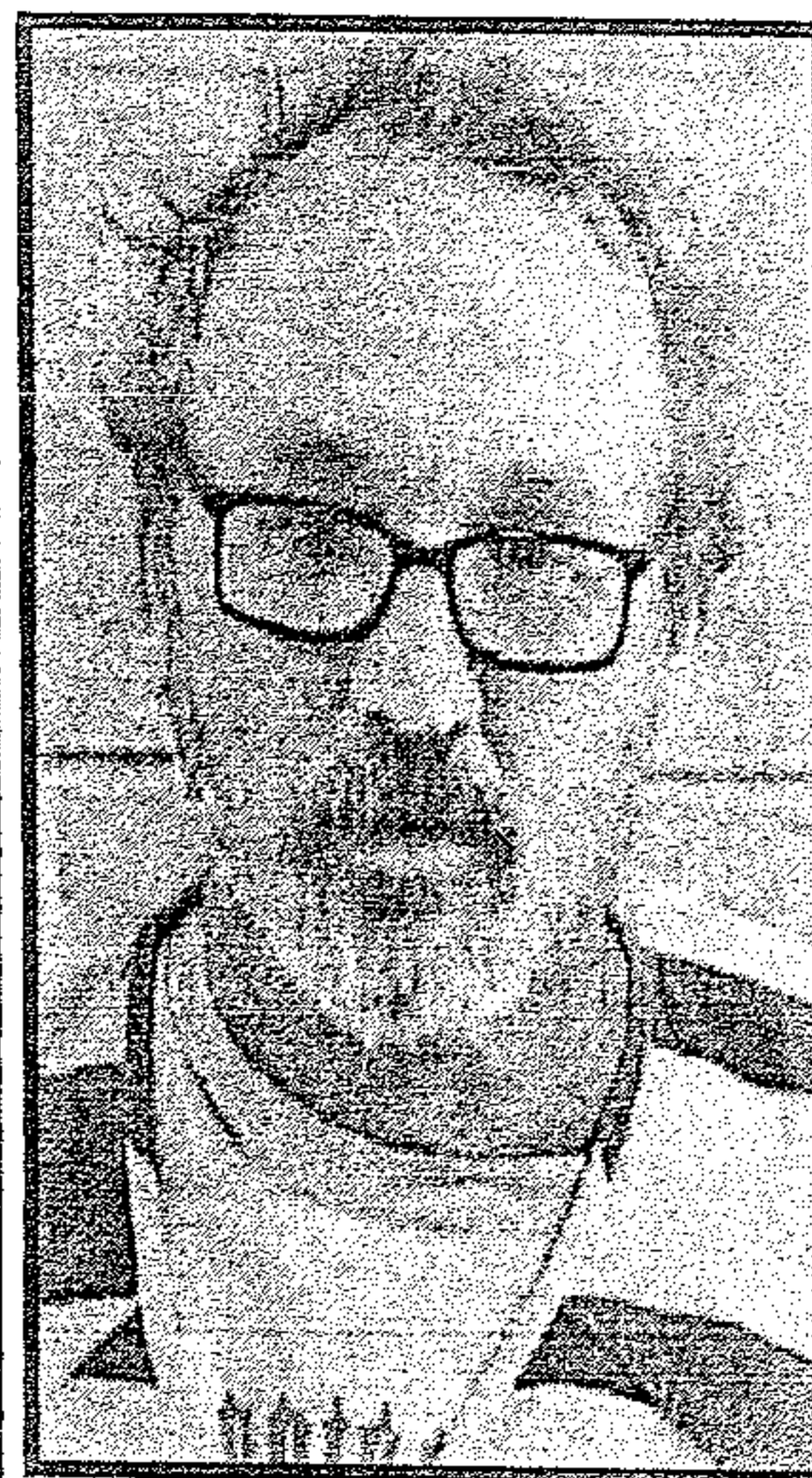

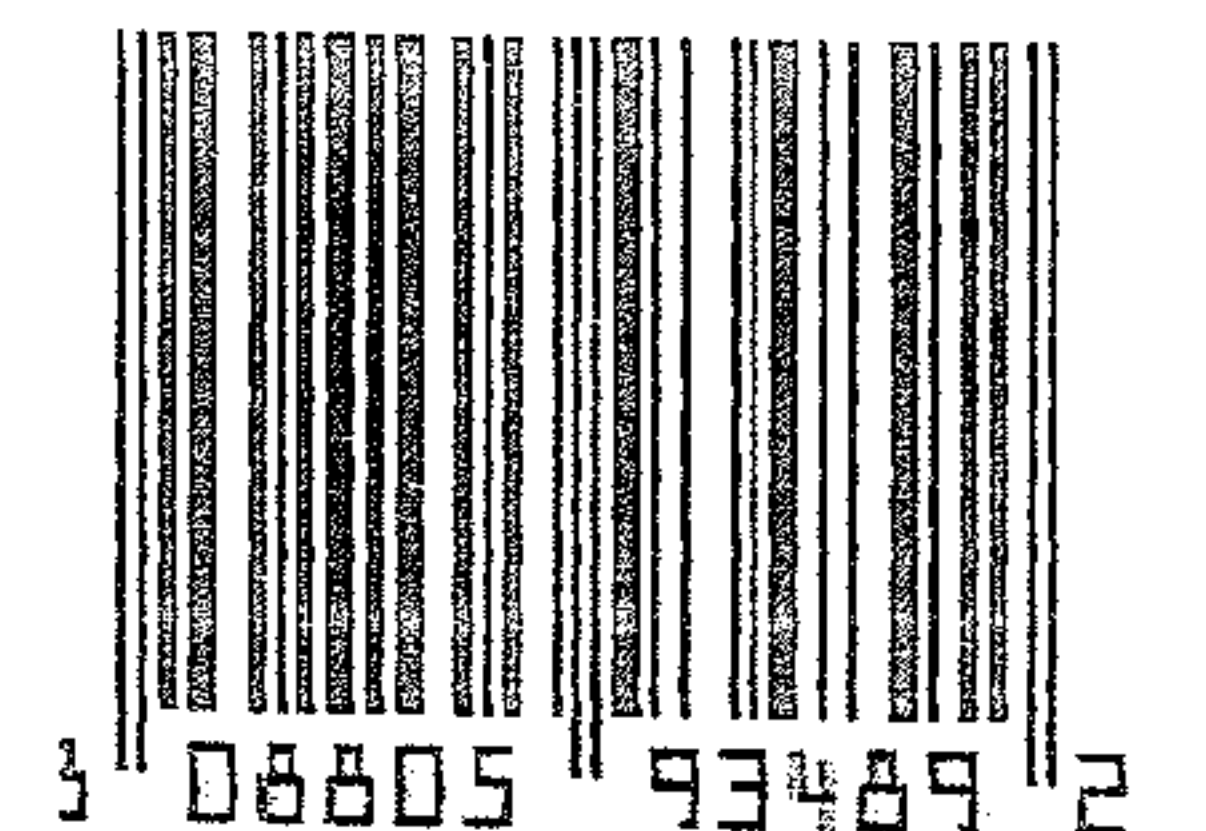

to a Burglary in progress. Members of Loudon County Sheriff's Office assisted in gathering information when the information was turned over to Investigator Charlie Cosner. Investigator Cosner advised Deputies Brian Smith and TJ Scarbrough to detain both female's, Malina

Akin and Joye Starritt, and to take them to the Loudon County Jail. Malena Akin's vehicle was in the driveway to the residence and a wrecker was called to tow the vehicle from the property. An inventory of the vehicle was done and Malena's purse was found inside the vehicle. Deputy did take the purse in to my possession to

take it to her at the Loudon County Jail to be placed in her property. The purse was searched prior to entering the Loudon County Jail for contraband. Inside the purse Deputy did find three different "travel pill bottles" were

found.

Inside the white unmarked bottle were one white rectangle pill with the imprint GG249 believed to be 2 mg Alprazolam a Schedule IV

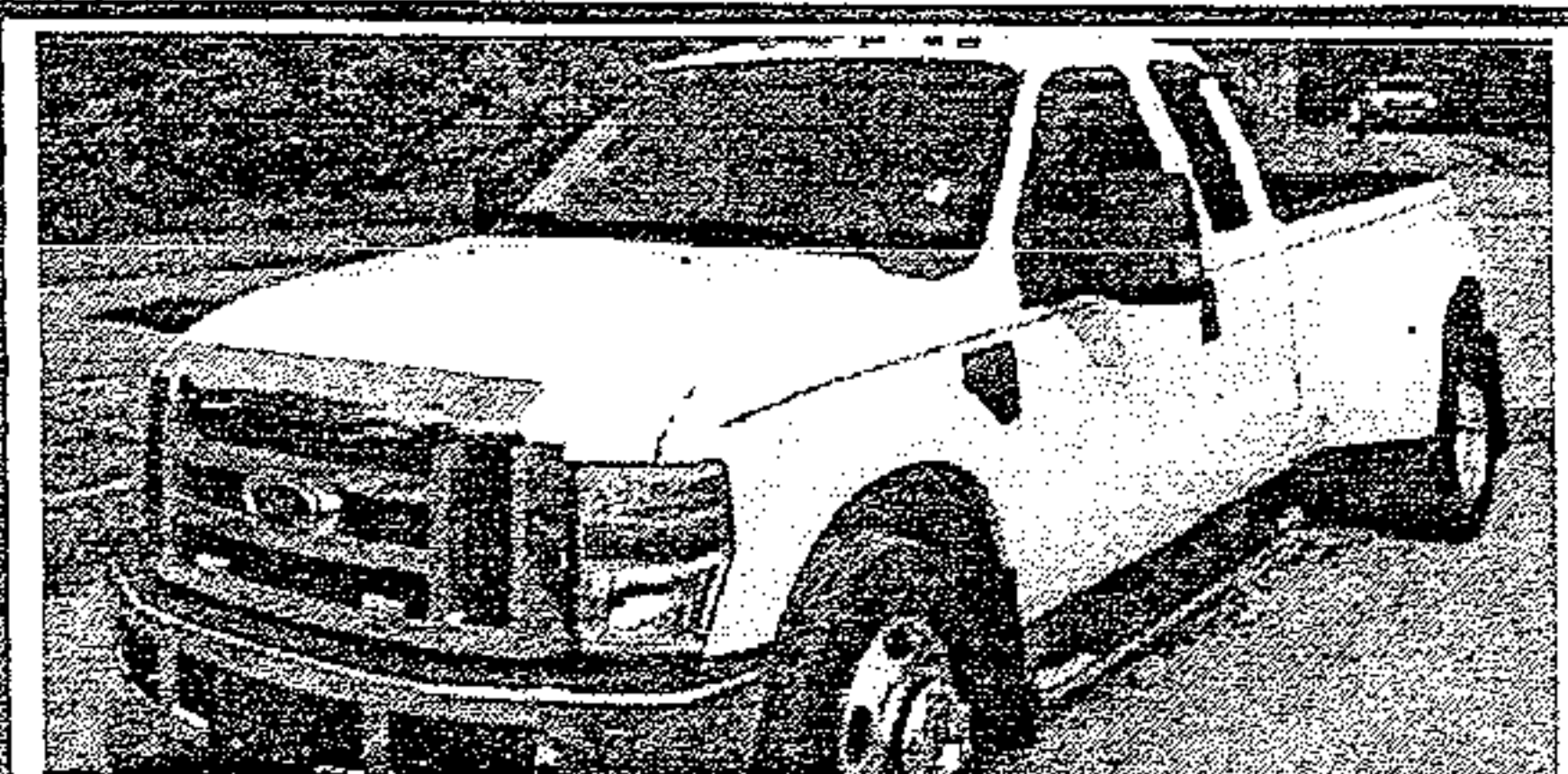

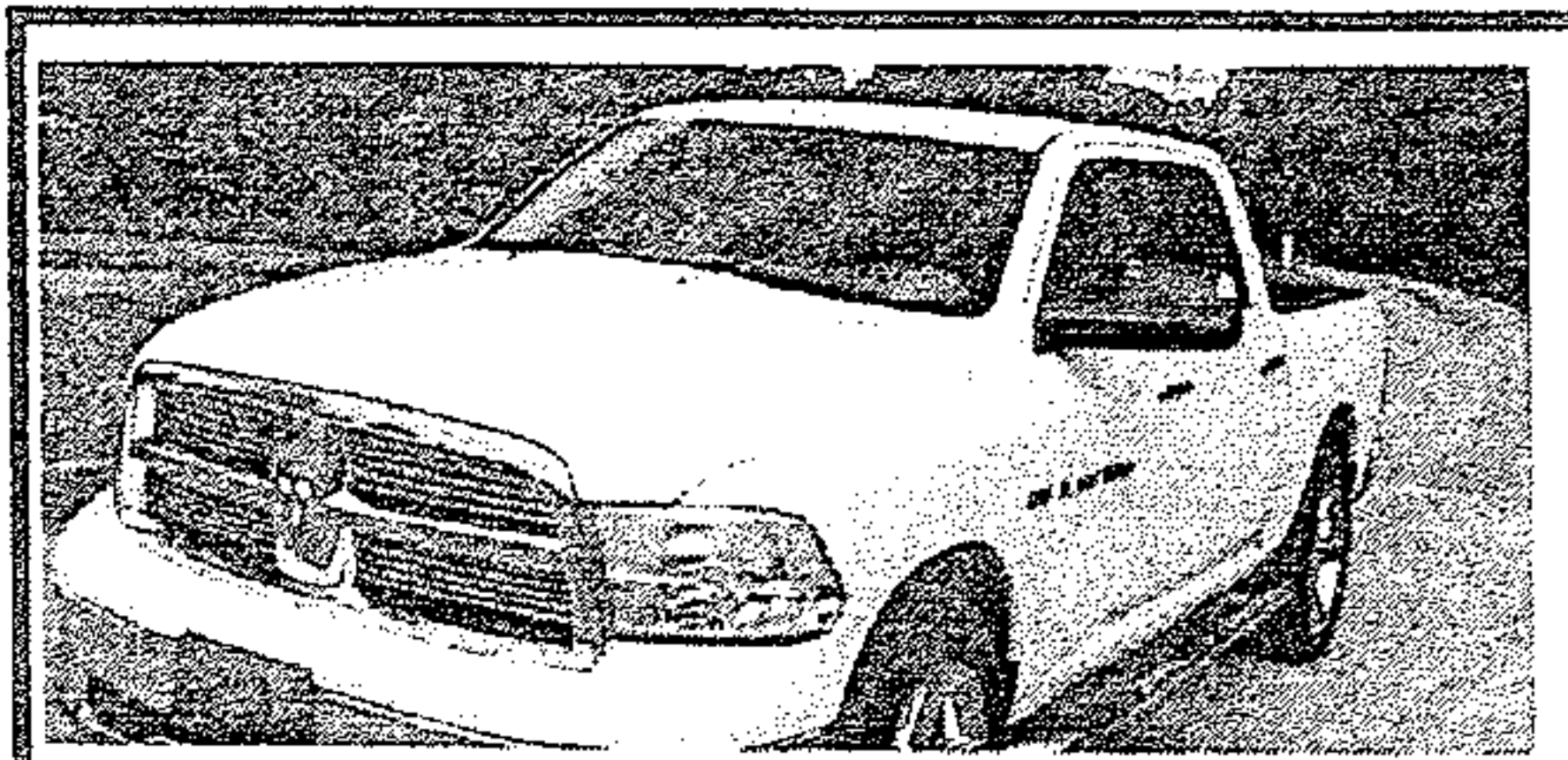

drug, and five white round pills with the imprint 54 411 believed to be 8mg Buprenorphine Hydrochloride a Schedule III drug. Inside the pill bottle with a faded green label were three orange capsules that had Ad-

derall XR 20mg printed on them believed to be Adderall XR 20mg a Schedule II drug, and six orange round pills with the imprint U30 believed to be 20mg Amphetamine Dextroamphetamine a Schedule II drug. Inside the second pill bottle with a faded green label was one blue round pill with the imprint C1 believed to be 1mg Clonazepam a Schedule IV

drug. Malina did not have the pills in the proper bottle and there was no prescription for those pills found in the vehicle. Malena Nanette Akin was charged with two counts of Possession of Schedule IV, two counts of Possession of Schedule II and one count of Possession of Schedule III. This did occur in Loudon County, TN.

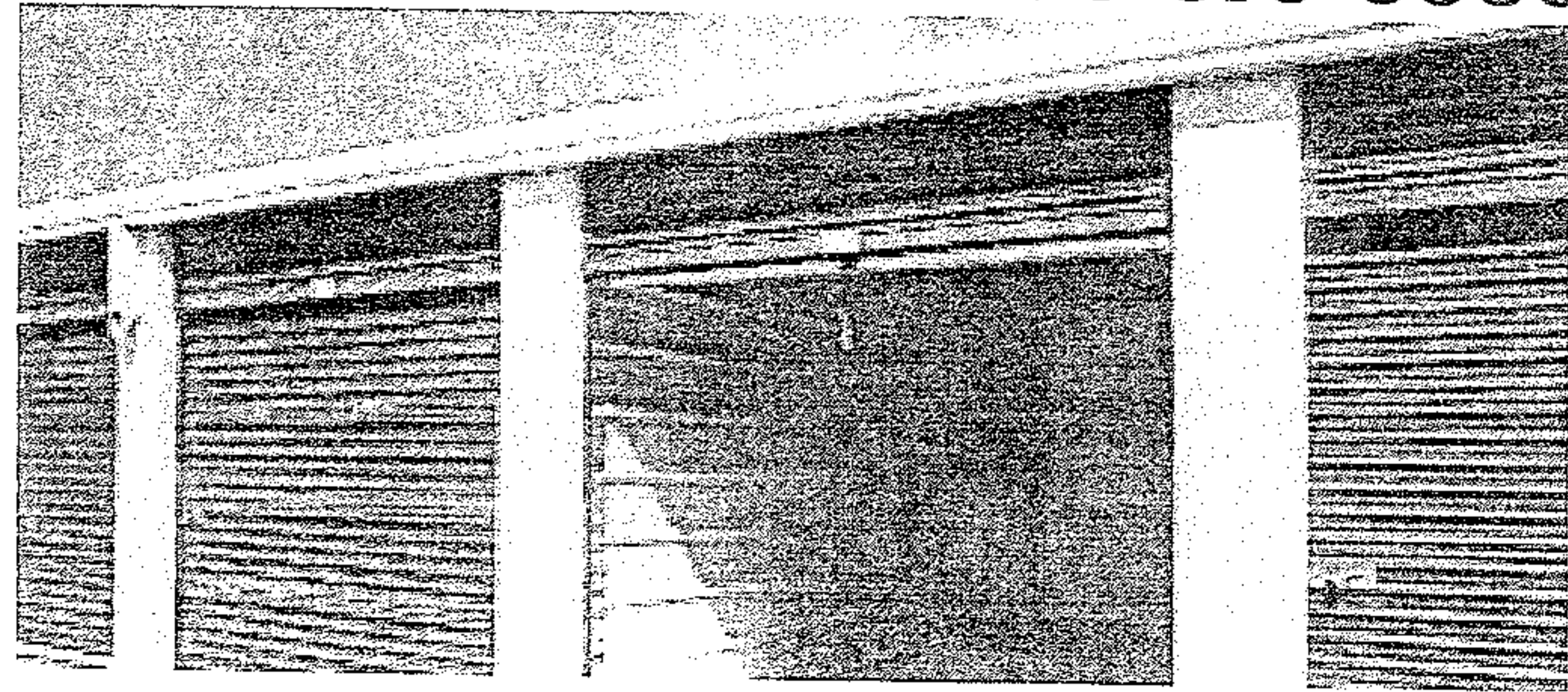

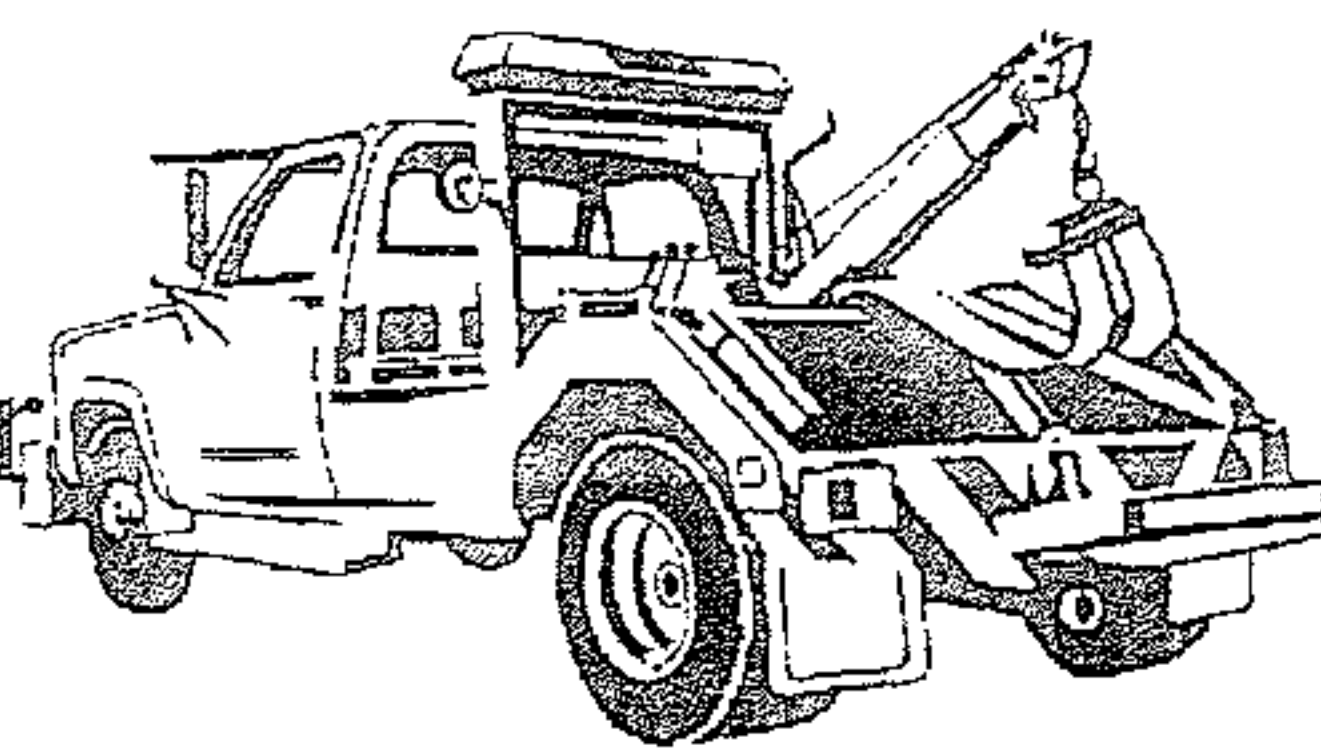

joining the event for the first time. They will be playing standard jazz music from the 40's to present day jazz. You will find them on the corner of A Street and Broadway.

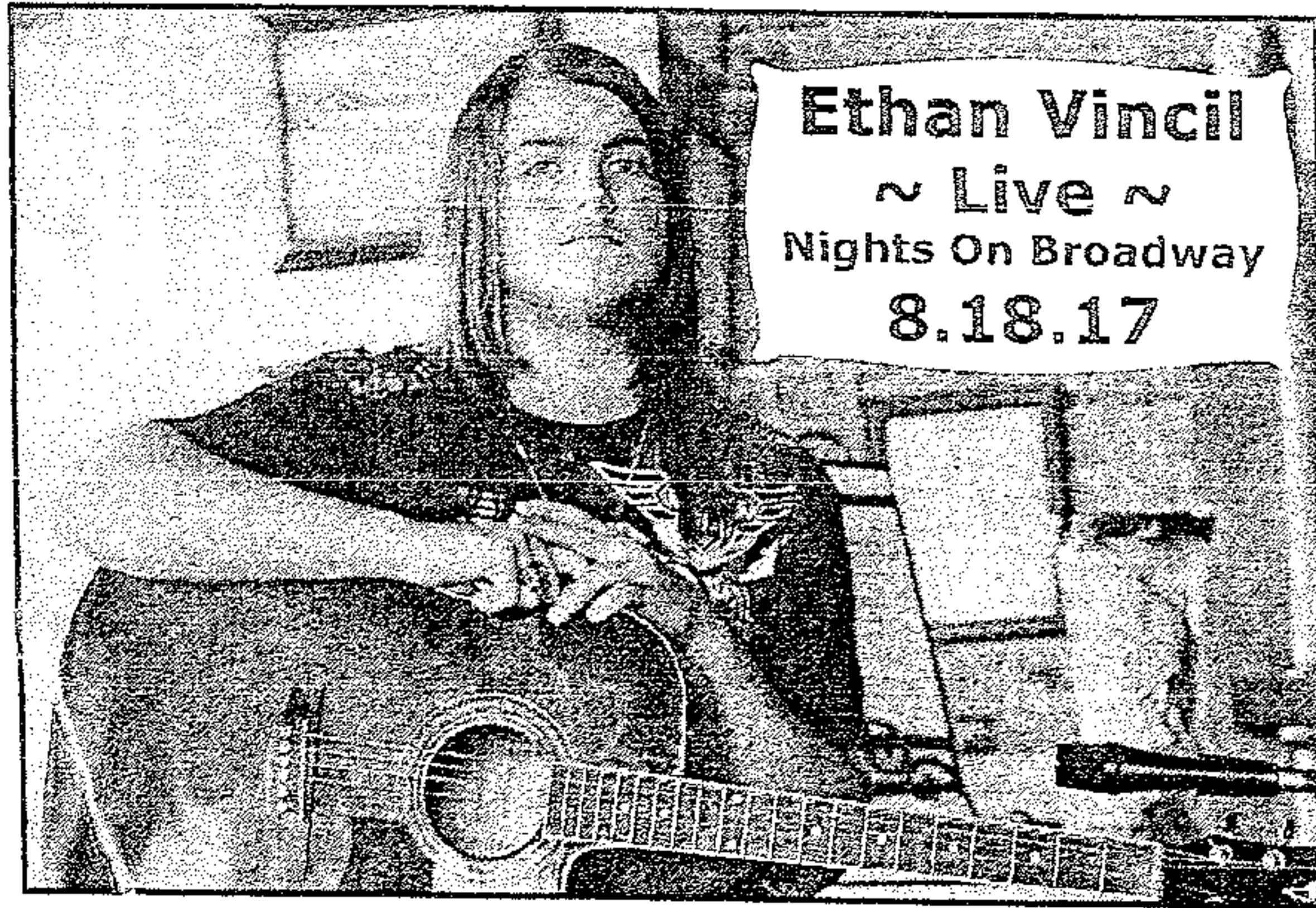
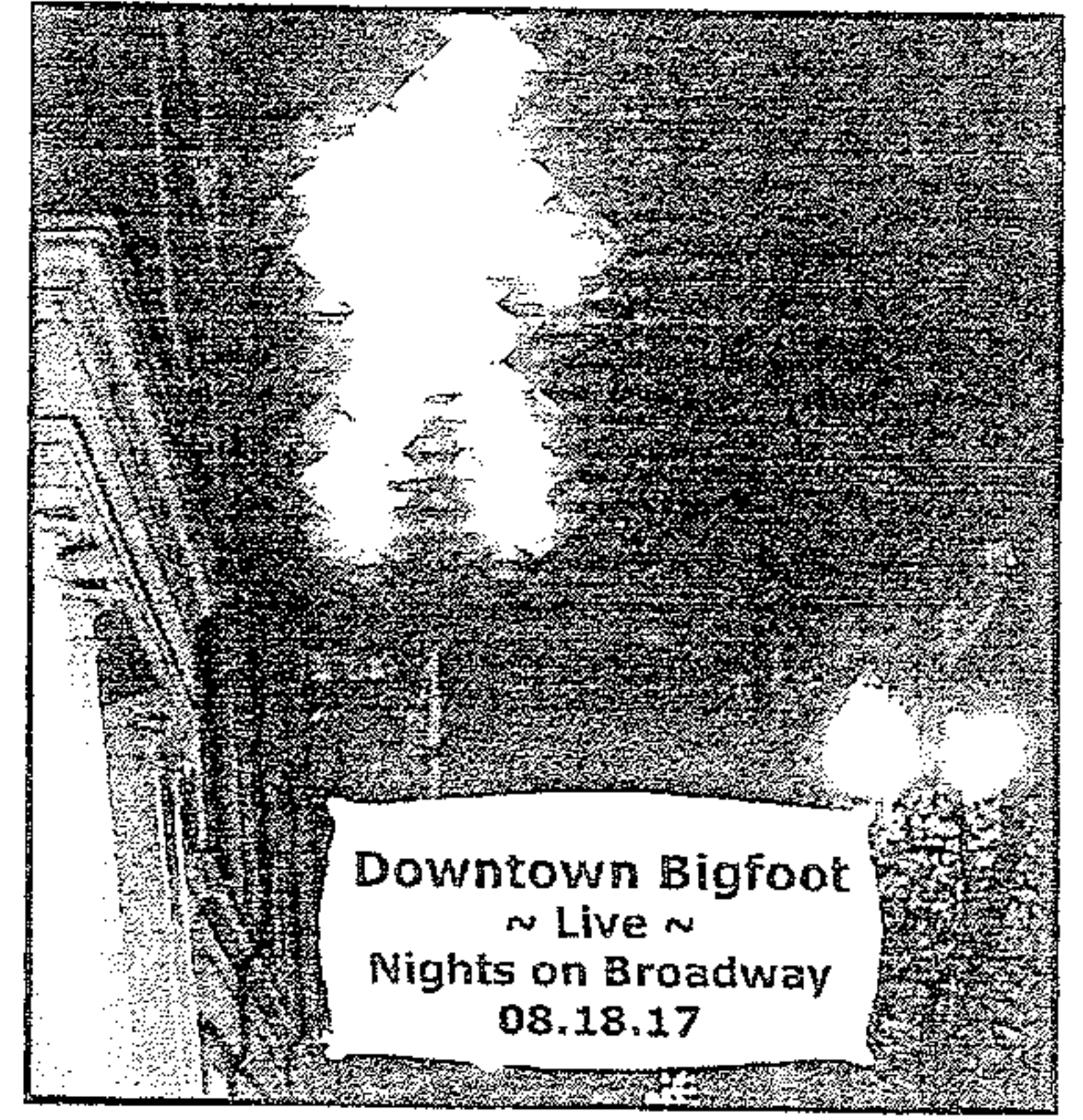
