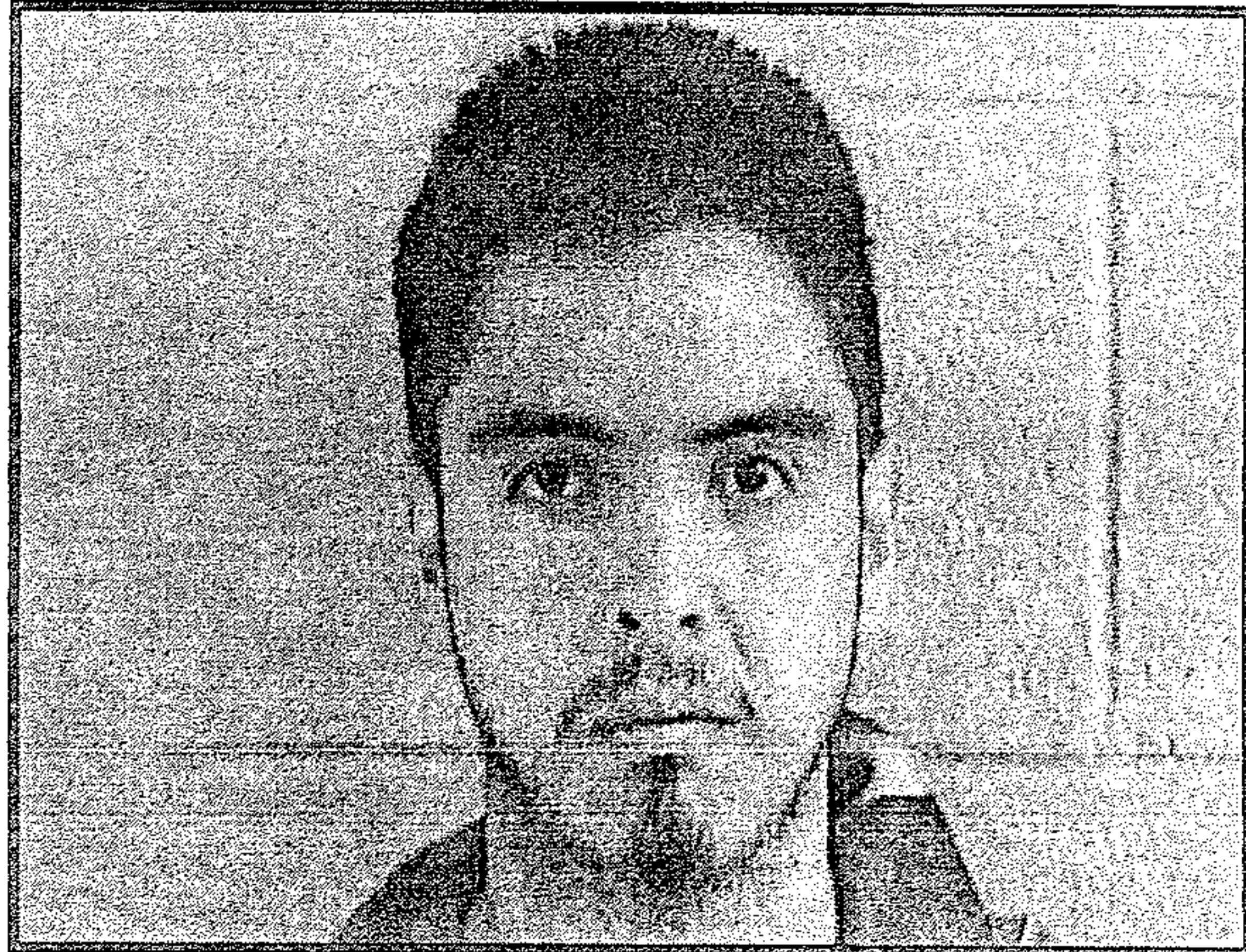

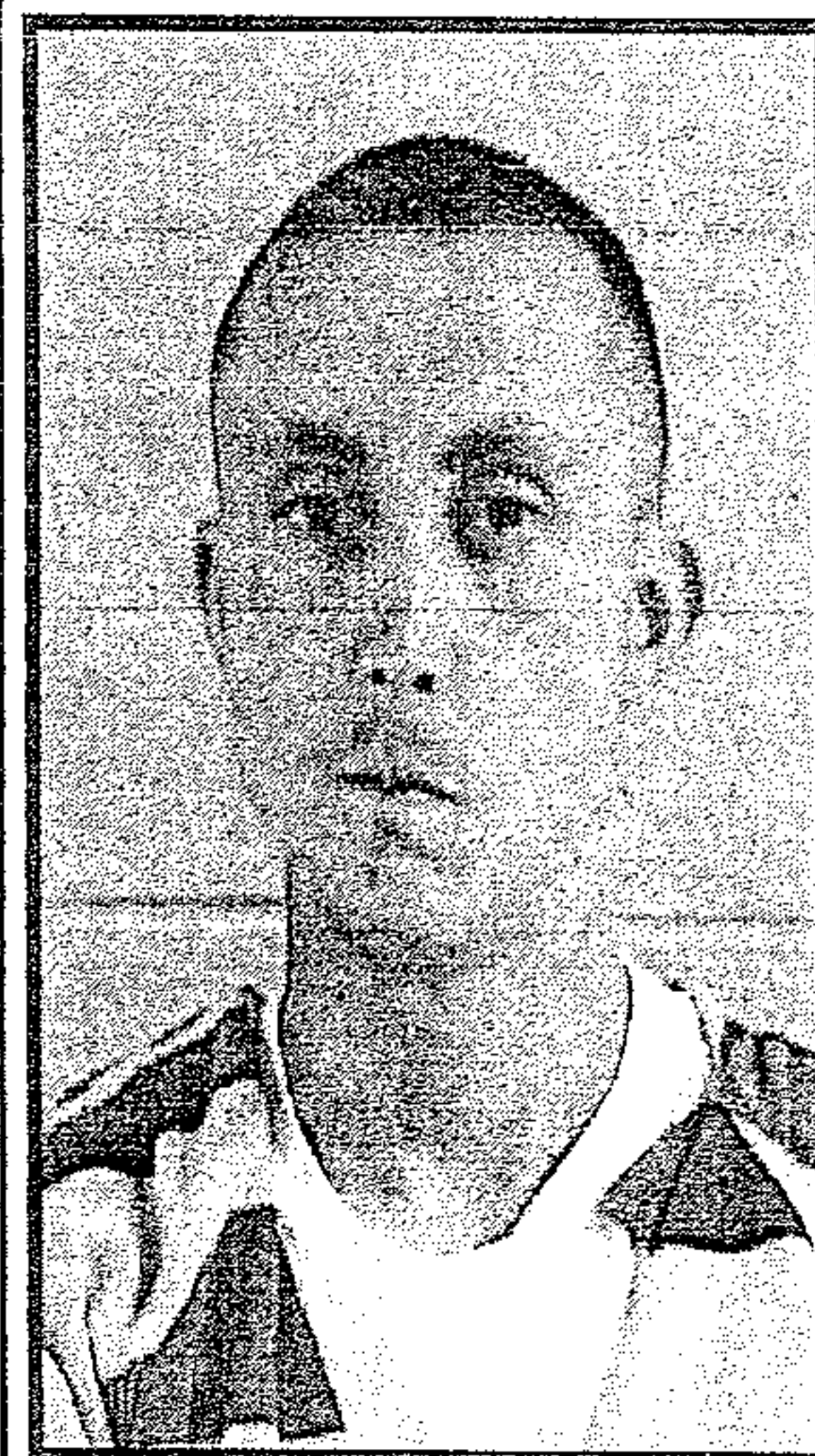

Receiving and distributing child pornography nets Michael Lee Cole 168 months in Federal Prison

On Wednesday, July 19, 2017, Michael Lee Cole, 39, of Maryville, Tennessee, was sentenced by The Honorable Thomas A. Varlan, Chief U.S. District Judge, to serve 168 months in prison, for receiving and distributing child pornography. Upon his release from prison, he will be supervised by U.S.

Probation for 25 years. In November 2017, Cole pleaded guilty to these charges, which were included in a federal indictment. In his plea agreement on file with U.S. District Court, he admitted to using the Internet and cloud based storage to trade child pornography with other collectors. As a result of

Gonzalez stabbed him in the head. Victim stated that they were arguing over a beer, when Gonzalez stabbed him in the head. Victim advised that he thought he was stabbed by a screwdriver. Victim has a small puncher wound to the right side of his head, in the shape of a

small flat head screwdriver. Cpl. M. Barnum and Deputy went to West Side Terrace in Loudon City where Loudon Police Dept. was out with the Suspect Junior Gonzalez. Deputy read Junior Gonzalez his Miranda Warning and he agreed to talk with him. Mr. Gonzalez stated that he and victim had a argument inside his vehi-

cle, the argument became heated and he told victim to get out of his vehicle, but he refused to do so they both put hands on each other, then Mr. Gonzalez said he hit victim in the head with a small screwdriver that he had in his

hand. Mr. Gonzalez said victim got out of his vehicle and he left victim residence. Victim was unarmed at the time of the incident. Mr. Gonzalez said the only wounds he





Everett perform field sobriety and did not indicate that he was under the influence. Mr. Everett stated that he did not own the vehicle that a male was the owner.

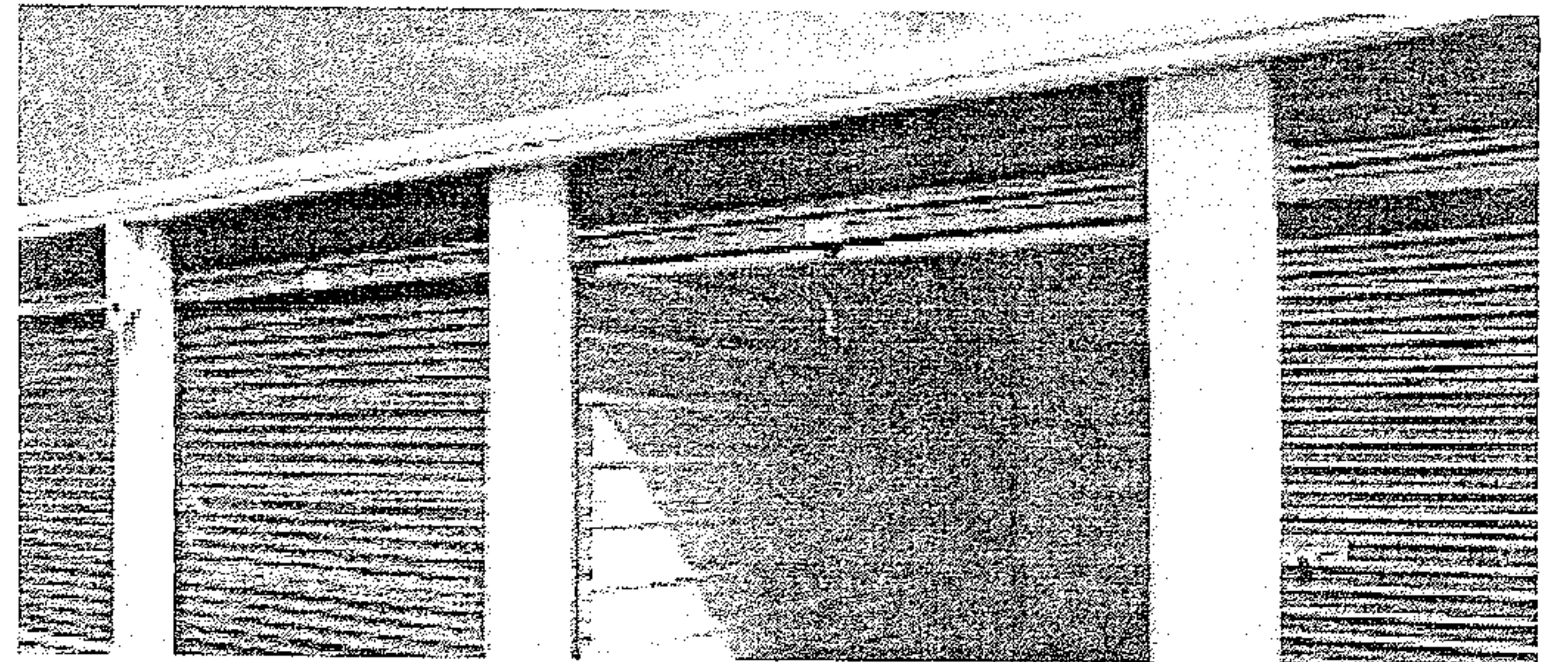
He stated that the male was aware that he was driving, but did not know he was driving on suspended license. Mr. Everett was then taken into custody and transported to Loudon

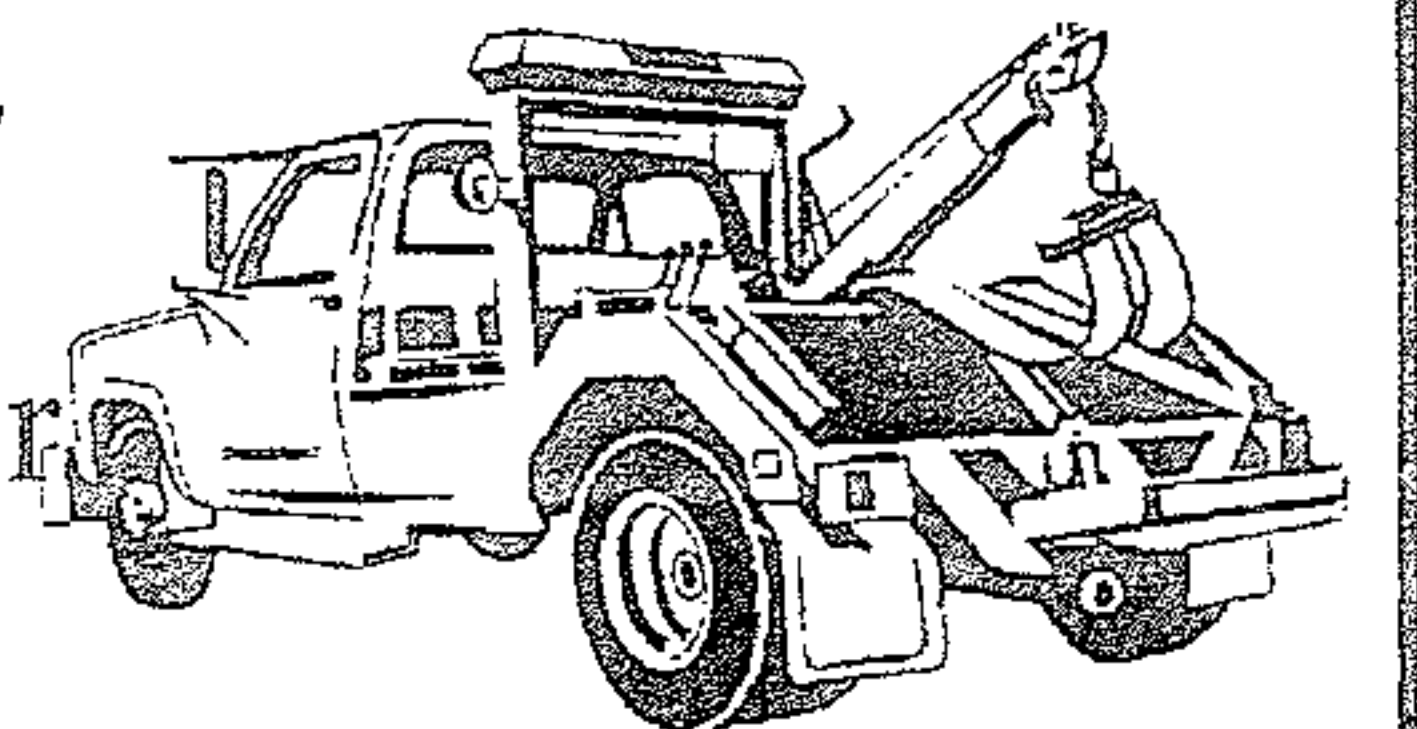

Cole their investigation, law enforcement agents seized a cell phone and laptop computer belonging to Cole that contained thousands of images and videos of child pornography, including the sexual exploitation and abuse of children younger than 12 years old.

"This case is a good example of how information sharing among local and federal agencies across geographic regions can bring dangerous criminals to justice. Every child deserves to grow up without the fear, humiliation, and trauma of being the victim of sexual exploitation. The U.S. Attorney's Office will continue to aggressively pursue the predators in this world who seek to abuse the most innocent among us," said Nancy Stallard Harr, U.S. Attorney.

The case was investigated by the U.S. Department of Homeland Security, and the Knoxville Police Department, Internet Crimes Against Children Task Force. Assistant U.S. Attorney

Bart Slabbekorn represented the United States.

This case was brought as part of Project Safe Childhood, a nationwide initiative to combat the growing epidemic of child sexual exploitation and abuse launched in May 2006 by the Department of Justice. Led by U.S. Attorneys' Offices and the Criminal Division's Child Exploitation and Obscenity Section, Project Safe Childhood marshals federal, state and local resources to better locate, apprehend and prosecute individuals who exploit children via the Internet, as well as to identify and rescue victims. CDC reminds travelers to Europe: Protect against measles

With the peak summer travel season under way, the Centers for Disease Control and Prevention (CDC) is reminding travelers to Europe and other

global destinations to take steps to protect themselves against measles amid outbreaks of the disease.

More than 14,000 cases of measles have been reported in Europe since January 2016, according to the European Centre for Disease Prevention and Control. In the past year, 35 people across Europe have died from the disease, according to the World Health Organization.

"Most measles cases in the United States are the result of international travel," said Gary Brunette, M.D., M.P.H., chief of CDC's travelers' health program. "Travelers get infected while abroad and bring the disease home. This can cause outbreaks here in the United States."

Measles cases have been reported in 15 European countries in 2017: Austria, Belgium, Bulgaria, the Czech Republic, Denmark, France, Germany, Hungary, Iceland, Italy, Portugal, Slovakia, Spain, Sweden, and the United Kingdom, according to the European Centre for Disease Prevention and Control.

CDC has issued

travel health notices for five European countries with measles outbreaks since November 2016; the most recent was France on July 7. The others are Belgium, Germany, Italy and Romania.

How to protect yourself and others against measles

The CDC recommends that anyone

who isn't protected against measles, either through vaccination or past infection, should get vaccinated, including before international travel. This simple step protects both travelers and people back home. Travelers should see their health care professional at least 4-6 weeks before

any international travel. You may need this much time to complete a vaccine series, and your body needs time to build up immunity.

Measles is one of the most contagious of all infectious diseases; approximately 9 out of 10 susceptible persons with close contact to

a measles patient will develop measles. The virus spreads when an infected person coughs or sneezes. The virus can live for up to 2 hours in the air or on surfaces.

People with measles usually have a rash, high fever, cough, runny nose, and red, watery eyes. Some people also get an ear infection, diarrhea, or a serious lung infection such as pneumonia. Although severe cases are rare, measles can cause swelling of the brain and death.

Any international travelers coming to the United States who develop measles symptoms should contact a doctor immediately.
