

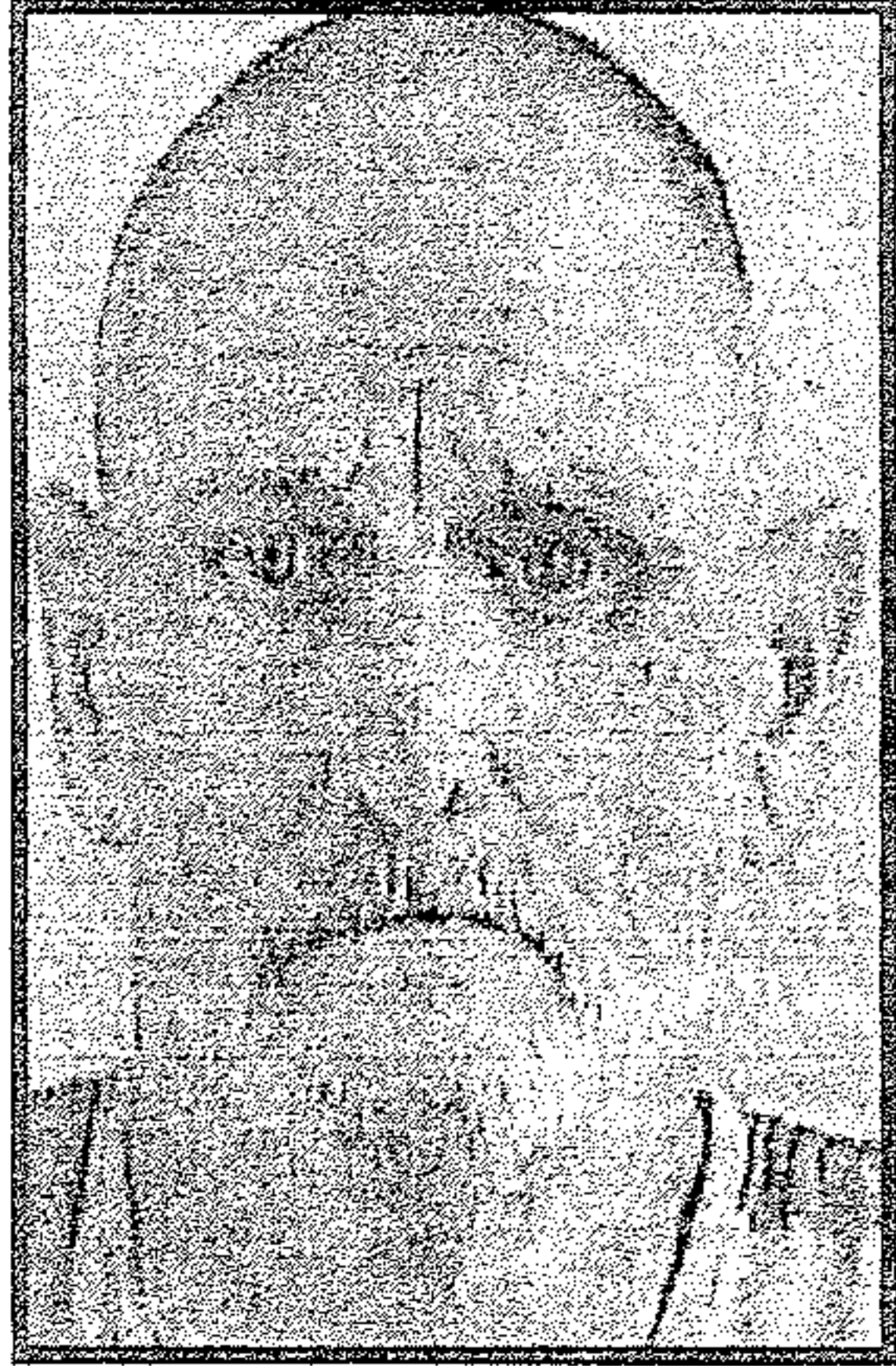

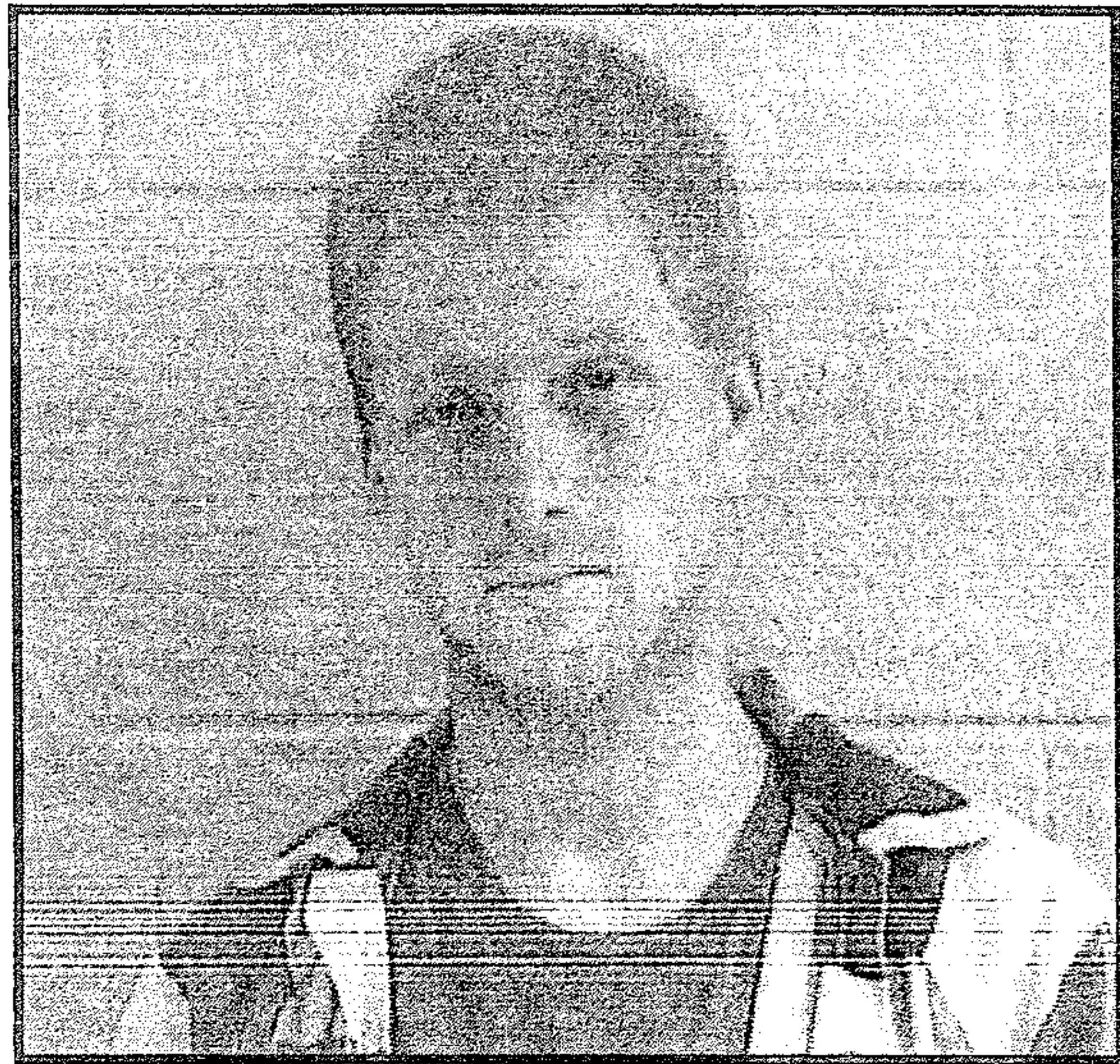

District court enters permanent injunction against TN Company and its CEO to stop distribution of unapproved and misbranded drugs

The U.S. District Court for the Eastern District of Tennessee entered a consent decree of permanent injunction against Crown Laboratories Inc. and the firm's Chief Executive Officer, Jeffrey Bedard, to stop the distribution of unapproved and misbranded drugs, the

Department of Justice announced today. The products at issue include urea creams and lotions intended to treat a variety of skin ailments.

The Department filed a complaint in the Eastern District of Tennessee on March 1, at the request of the U.S. Food and Drug

Robert Easter, 52, Pine Top Road Loudon, was charged with Criminal Conspiracy, and Tampering/Fabricating with Evidence.

Tiajaunia Easter, 51, Pine Grove Providence Road Loudon, was charged with Criminal Conspiracy, and Poss. of Drug Para.

Kimberly Dalton, 48, Houston Street Lenoir City, was charged with Criminal Conspiracy, Poss. of Drug Para., and Simple Possession.

Agents with the 9th Drug Task Force observed several individuals in the parking lot of Taco Bell on Hwy 321 that appeared to be involved in suspicious drug activity. Two

of the individuals were identified as Tiajuana Easter and Robert Easter, both of whom have prior drug charges for sale and delivery of a controlled substance. Agents observed Tiajuana get out of a red sedan and get into a sil-

ver suv. Tiajuana then went back to the red sedan where she placed something in the car and then returned to the suv. Agents then approached both vehicles and detained all parties. The driver of the suv



Administration (FDA). The complaint alleged that the defendants violated the federal Food, Drug and Cosmetic Act by, among other things, introducing unapproved and misbranded drugs into interstate commerce. Specifically, the complaint alleges that defendants sold a series of dermatological creams, despite the absence of FDA approval or a sufficient showing that these products were safe and effective.

"The public has a right to assume that drugs in the marketplace are safe, effective, have obtained proper approvals, and are labeled with the information necessary to allow for proper use," said Acting Assistant Attorney General Chad Readler of the Justice Department's Civil

Division. "Where drug manufacturers violate these fundamental requirements, the Department of Justice will continue to work aggressively with the FDA to ensure that the pharmaceutical industry follows the rules. Doing so is necessary to protect American consumers."

As detailed in the complaint, Crown manufactures a variety of prescription and OTC drugs including prescription urea cream and lotion. The products referenced in the complaint include Rea Lo (Urea 40 percent) Cream, Rea Lo (Urea 40 percent) Lotion, Rea Lo 39 (Urea 39 percent) Cream, Dermasorb XM Complete Kit (Urea 39 percent cream and moisturizer), and Sodium Sulfacetamide 10 percent and Sulfur 5 percent (Sodium Sulfacetamide).

As noted in the complaint, the various urea based products were sold as products intended to treat a series of dermatological conditions, such as dry, rough skin, xer-

osis, ichthyosis, skin cracks and fissures, dermatitis, eczema, psoriasis, keratosis, and calluses. Sodium Sulfacetamide is intended to see injunction ctd. pg.5





Cesar Cabello, 25, Maremont Road Loudon, was charged with Driving on Revoked /Suspended License.

Deputy Kevin Dailley LCSO, observed a white 1999 Ford Explorer turn onto Chrisman St off Highway 11. After turning in behind the vehicle it turned up Tinnell Rd where it appeared to be turning into Tinnell Ln however it stopped in the roadway briefly where it continued straight turning into the backside of Highland Park Elementary. Traffic stop was initiated due to the time, confusion of the vehicle, and location due to the high crime area in particularly drugs. Contact was made with the driver Cesar Cabello, through normal procedure Deputy attempted to identify him where he stated he did not have a license but did have an ID. After checking the subject through dispatch they advised he was suspended. He was taken into custody with Malone's towing the vehicle. He was

transported to Loudon County Jail without incident. This all did occur in Loudon County, Tennessee.

treat acne vulgaris, acne rosacea, and seborrheic dermatitis. As products designed to provide dermatological treatment, these drugs required FDA approval for their intended uses – approval that was lacking for all of these products. Distributing unapproved drugs in interstate commerce is a violation of the federal Food, Drug, and Cosmetic Act.

In conjunction with the filing of the complaint, the defendants agreed to settle the case and to be bound by a permanent injunction. The injunction requires Crown to stop the manufacturing, selling and introducing into interstate commerce any Rea Lo (Urea 40 percent) Cream, Rea Lo (Urea 40 percent) Lotion, Rea Lo 39 (Urea 39 percent) Cream, Dermasorb XM Complete Kit, Sodium Sulfacet-

amide, or any drug labeled similarly to such drugs and containing the same active ingredient(s), unless and until an application has been filed with the FDA and approved by the agency.

was identified as Kim Dalton. Agents observed money laying in the front seat of the red sedan that Robert Easter was in and a search of his vehicle produced a ledger of money that was owed to Mr. Easter. A search around the drivers side area of the vehicle located a bottle containing 43 pills identified as Alprazolam. While Agents were approaching the vehicles Mr. Easter had thrown the bottle containing the 43 Aprazolam out of his vehicle into the parking lot of Taco Bell in an attempt to conceal or destroy the evidence from Agents. After further investigation Agents determined that all three parties involved were meeting at the Taco Bell to conduct an illegal drug transaction. Mr. and Mrs. Easter had just

picked up a prescription of 120 1 mg Alprazolam at Walgreens pharmacy on Hwy 321 in Lenoir City. They both then had contact via telephone with Ms. Dalton about purchasing part of that prescription and all agreed to meet at Taco Bell in order to make the exchange. A search of Ms. Daltons property produced a plastic case

contained several blue pills identified as Alprazolam, a Sch IV narcotic, which she had just purchased from Mrs. Easter. The money was located in Mr. Easter's vehicle was determined to be the money that Mrs. Dalton had gave to Mrs. Easter to purchase the Alprazolam. These actions did occur in Loudon County.

the defendants are required, among other things, to give FDA written notice that they are prepared to destroy all Rea Lo (Urea 40 percent) Cream, Rea Lo (Urea 40 percent) Lotion, Rea Lo 39 (Urea 39 percent) Cream, Dermasorb XM Complete Kit, Sodium Sulfacetamide, and any unapproved drug labeled similarly to such drugs and containing the same active ingredient(s).

The government is represented by Trial Attorney Mary M. Englehart of the Civil Division's Consumer Protection Branch, with the assistance of Associate Chief Counsel for Enforcement Susan Williams of the Department of Health and Human Services' Office of General Counsel's Food and Drug Division.

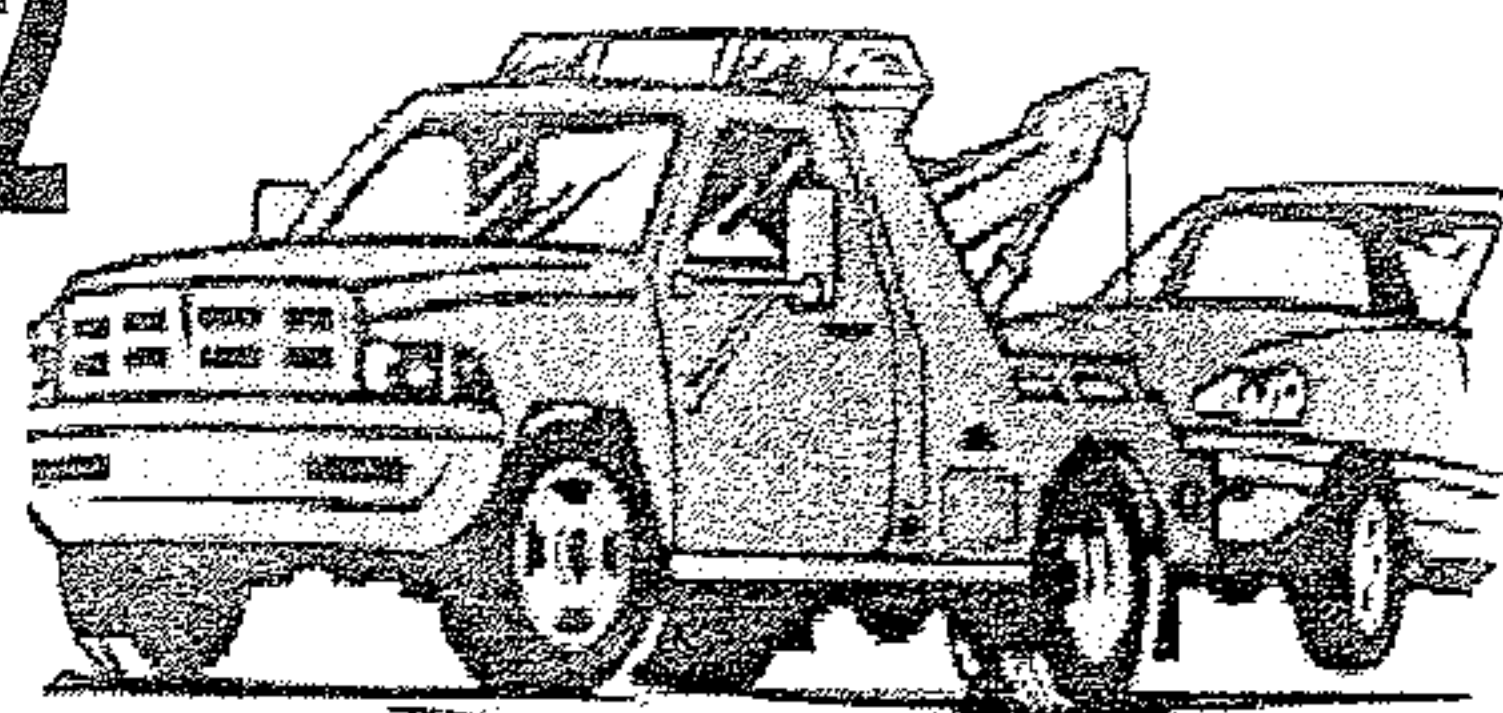
