





Trespasser call ends | Cold Case Homicide Law Enforcement Hopes Advances in Technology Can Help Solve Tammy Zywicki's Murder

This week marks the 25th anniversary of the tragic kidnapping and murder of Tammy Zywicki, but the FBI and the Illinois State Police have never stopped searching for the young woman's killer—and they are actively pursuing new investigative strategies that could help solve the case.

1992, Zywicki was a 21-year-old college senior who played sports and was passionate about photography. She had driven her brother to college in Evanston, Illinois, and was on her way to Iowa, where she was in her final year at Grinnell College. Her mother called the Illi-

who were possibly stealing from inside the store. Upon arrival Officer made contact with manager who pointed out the females to Officer.

During investigation he observed female later identifed as Kerstin R. Lively walk to a gray cheverolet spark and sit down in the passenger seat of vehicle unload items

into the car, then got into a gray ford explorer and leave the property with two males. Sgt. Ailor stopped that vehicle leaving the parking lot for identification of the males and miss Lively. The other female inside the store was identifed as Leslie Anderson.

Local warrants were ran on all subjects, of which two had active Roane County

warrants (Leslie Anderson, Rodney Wells) and were detained for Roane County. The Cheverolet Spark that Lively was in was left unattended and was not registered to any of the subjects on scene at this time.

During a check of that vehicle and where miss Lively was sitting approximately 1.1 grams of a Crystal like substance believed to be methamphetamine was found, and approximately

Victim then told her husband to leave and he refused so she slapped him, Mr. Arden then grabbed victim by the throat and pushed her against the wall. Mrs. Arden

had visible red marks on her throat from the attack.

Mr. Arden also pushed his granddaughter against the stair rail causing her to hit her head and Officer could feel a knot on the side of her head at the time of the report.

ing together." She added that her daughter's tragedy "has brought a lot of attention to how many cold cases we


have, and that's important."
