Angel Plemons, 25, Corinth Church Road Loudon, was charged with DUI, and Reckless Endangerment.

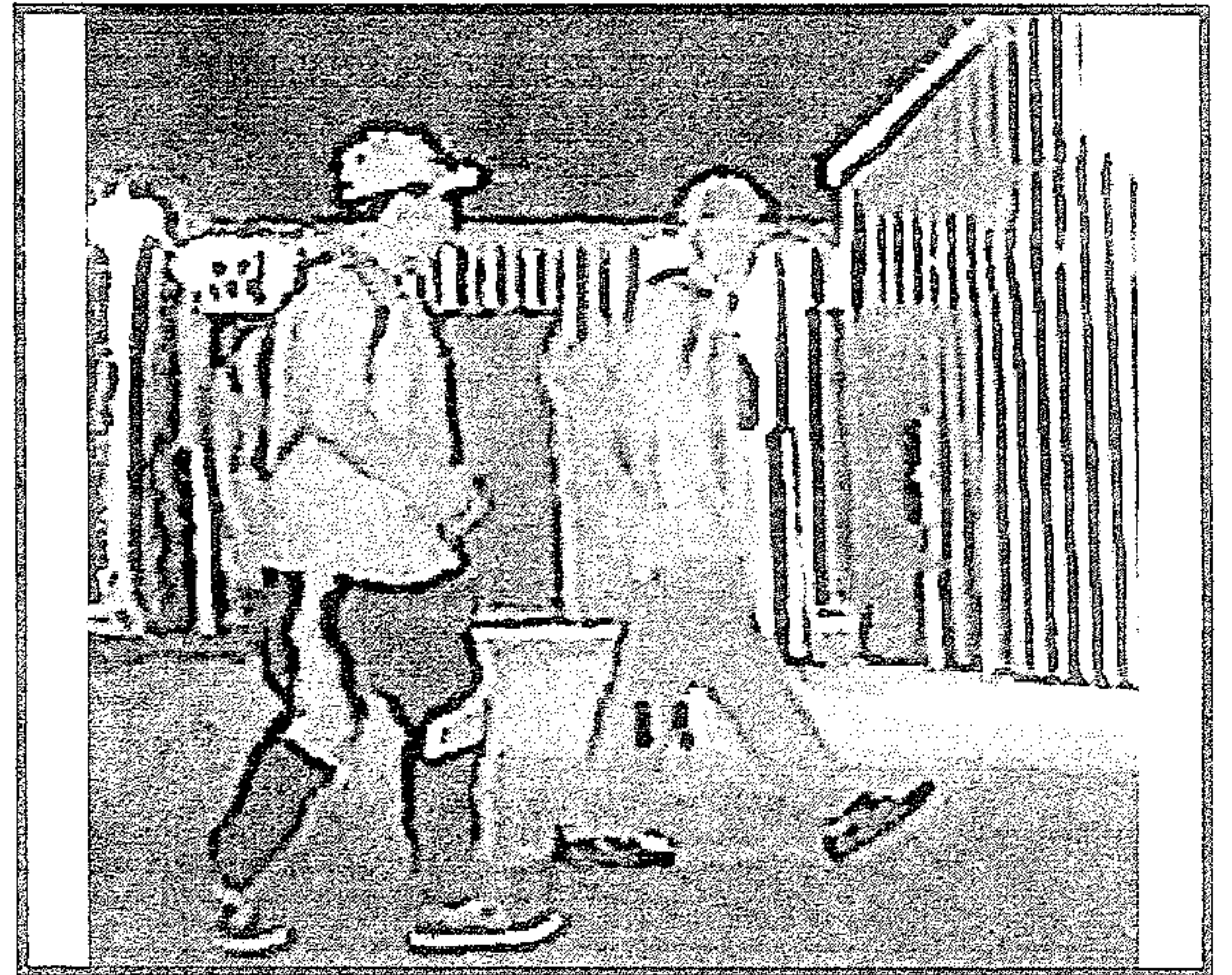

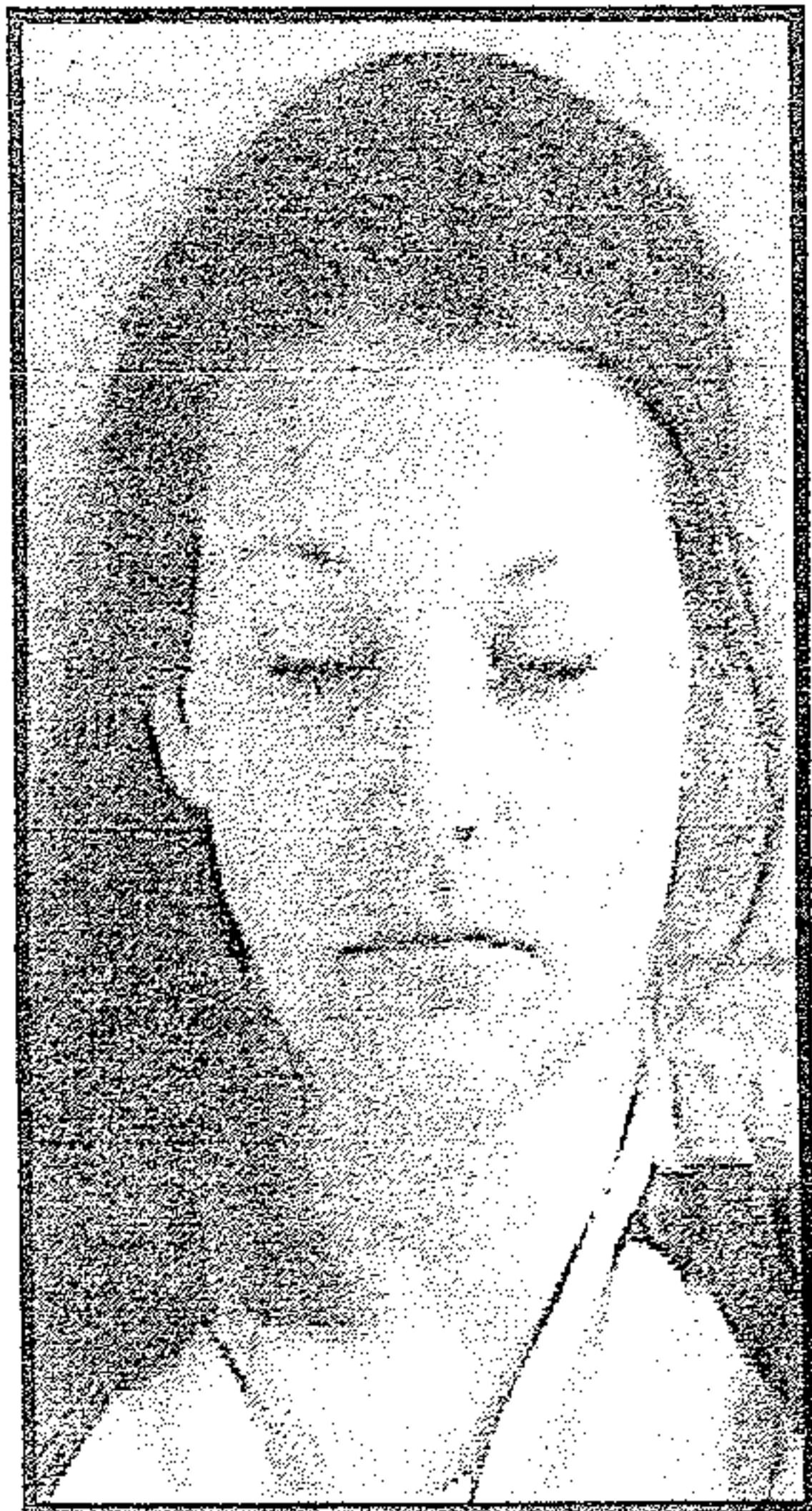

CARSON NATHAN MARTIN SENTENCED TO OVER TWENTY-EIGHT YEARS IN FEDERAL PRISON FOR PRODUCING AND DISTRIBUTING CHILD PORNOGRAPHY

On August 29, 2017, Carson Nathan Martin, 38, of Knoxville, Tennessee, was sentenced by the Honorable Thomas A. Varlan, Chief U.S. District Judge, to serve 345 months in prison for producing child pornography. Following his release from prison, Martin will be supervised by the U.S. Probation Office for the rest of his life and required to register with the sex offender registry in any state in which he resides, works, or attends school. Martin pleaded guilty in March 2017 to federal charges stemming from his use of a minor female to make pornographic videos and pictures and his distribution of these materials.

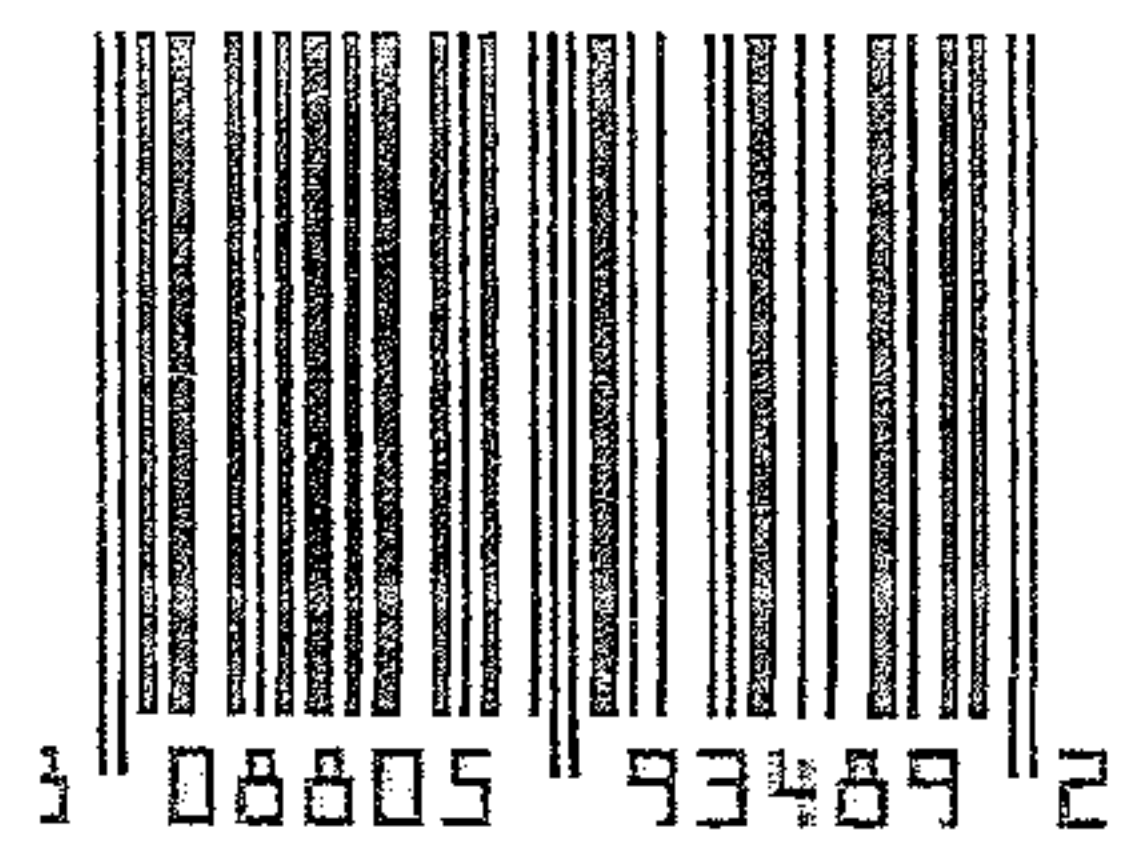

Angela Plemons, there was a strong odor of alcohol omitting from the vehicle. Ms. Plemons was asked to exit the vehicle, and Deputy could smell a strong odor of alcohol coming from her. Deputy asked how much she had to drink and she stated that she had 2 of the Mikes Hard Lemonade at approximatley

7:00pm. Deputy asked if she could perform field sobriety tasks and she said she could. Deputy did check the Horizontal Gaze Nystagmus on Ms. Plemons eyes. This task did show levels of intoxication with involuntary jerking of the eyes throughout the the task. She was then asked to perform the 9 step walk and turn and the one leg stand where she performed

bution of those depictions to others via the Internet. Investigators with the Massachusetts State Police discovered depictions of the of the sexual abuse of the minor that Martin had made and alerted investigators with the Knoxville Police Department's Internet Crimes Against Children Task Force (KPD-ICAC) that someone in the Knoxville area was circulating child pornography. A search of Martin's residence resulted in the seizure of evidence confirming that he had been sexually abusing the minor and recording the abuse on his cellular telephone. He was arrested and has been in custody since the search of his residence.

This investigation was conducted by KPD-ICAC and the U.S. Department of Homeland Security. Assistant U.S. Attorney Matthew Morris represented the United States.

This case was brought as part of Project Safe Childhood, a nationwide initiative to com-

bat the growing epidemic of child sexual exploitation and abuse launched in May 2006 by the Department of Justice. Led by U.S. Attorneys' Offices and the Criminal Division's Child Exploitation and Obscenity Section, Project Safe Childhood marshals federal, state and local resources to better locate, apprehend and prosecute individuals who exploit children via the Internet, as well as to identify and rescue victims. Hurricane Harvey Avoid Fraudulent Charitable Contribution Schemes

Federal authorities are issuing warnings to potential donors wishing to aid victims of Hurricane Harvey that unscrupulous scammers may set up shop in the storm's wake.

The Federal Trade Commission (FTC) and the U.S. Computer Emergency Readiness Team (US-CERT) this week warned that phishing scams

and bogus e-mail solicitations may target potential givers. US-CERT warned users to be cautious when handling unsolicited e-mails with subject lines, hyperlinks, and attachments related to Hurricane Harvey. And the Department of Justice (DOJ) on Wednesday issued a reminder to be vigilant about potentially fraudulent activity on the heels of a disaster.

"E-mails requesting donations from duplicitous charitable organizations commonly appear after major natural disasters," said US-CERT, an organization within the Department of Homeland Security that analyzes and responds to emerging cyber threats.

"Be alert for charities that seem to have sprung up overnight in connection with current events," the FTC warned.

The National Center for Disaster Fraud, which was established

by the Justice Department to investigate fraud in the wake of Hurricane Katrina, said in press release this week that tips regarding suspected fraud should be reported by phone to (866) 720-5721 or online at disaster@leo.gov. Suspected Internet-based fraud can also be reported to the FBI's Internet Crime

Complaint Center, or IC3, at www.ic3.gov.

To assist those seeking guidance, the Federal Emergency Management Agency (FEMA) tweeted a link to "trusted sources for helping out with #Harvey," which takes users to the website for National Voluntary

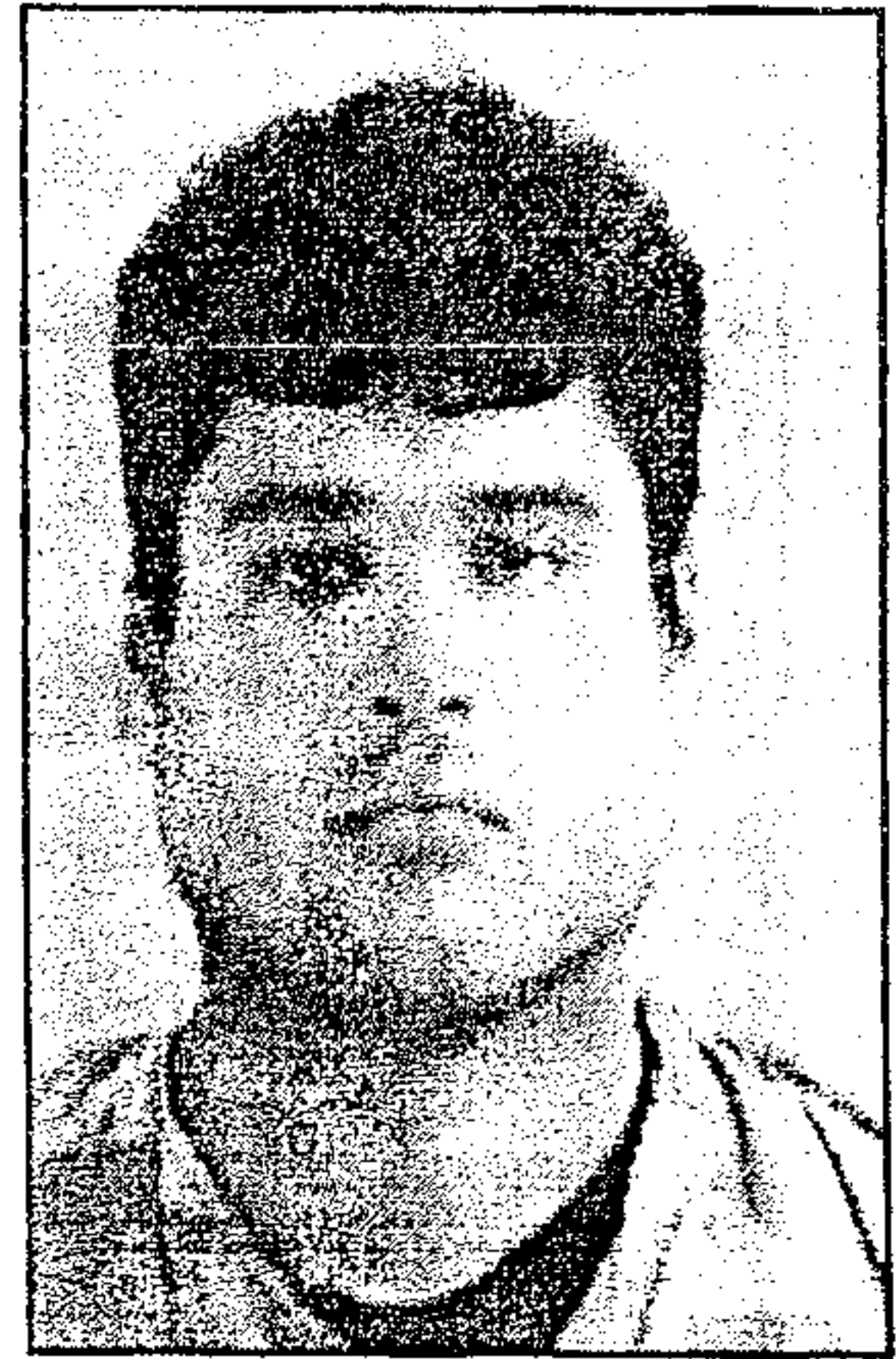
Aguilera Bryant, 22, Mulberry Street Loudon, was charged with Poss. of Drug Para., Contributing to the Delinquency of a Minor, and Violation of Community Correction.

Roberto Gonzalez, 20, Old Lee Hwy Philadelphia, was charged with Poss. of Drug Para., and Contributing to the Delinquency of a Minor.

Jessica Bahr, 35, Sitzler Road Philadelphia, was charged with Poss. of Drug Para., and Contributing to the Delinquency of a Minor.

Officer Jonathan Yates LPD, responded to Mulberry St in reference to a complaint of people in the garage using meth and causing a disturbance. Upon arrival Officer spoke with the homeowner who told him to deal with the people in the garage. Officer looked through the open window of the garage and saw four people inside. Jessica Bahr, Roberto Gonzalez, a juvenile and Bryant Ramirez Aguilera was pouring out gasoline and throwing things around. There was an open flame (lit candle) burning inside

the garage. We made contact and the entire garage was filled with gas fumes. Officer removed all four for their safety and saw several items of drug paraphernalia in plain sight. They included aluminum foil-bent and burnt for consuming meth-, glass pipes commonly used to smoke meth and several small plastic baggies with powder residue. Bryant Aguilera removed a meth pipe from his front right pocket as Officer attempted to pat him down. He was arrested. All four showed signs of recent meth use and were in close proximity to the items found. There was also a juvenile present who was reported as a runaway on second shift. They were all arrested and charged. Said happened in Loudon TN.

Organizations Active in Disaster. The Virginia-based non-profit group describes itself as an "association of organizations that mitigate and alleviate the impact of disasters" and counts many well-known national aid organizations among its members. FEMA also

posted a link to a list of the organization's members in Texas.

"Criminals can exploit disasters, such as Hurricane Harvey, for their own gain by sending fraudulent communications through e-mail or social media."- National Center for Disaster Fraud

The agencies offered these tips (among others) to individuals who are considering making donations:

Donate to charities you know and trust.

Designate the disaster to ensure your funds go toward disaster relief.

Never click on links or open attachments in unsolicited e-mail.

Officer Green LCPD, responded to McDonalds in Lenoir City in reference to a possible drunk driver who

was hitting on the drive thru window. Upon arrival Officer located the described vehicle and conducted a traffic stop in the parking lot. Once Officer made contact with the driver, Pablo Tino, Officer observed he had red watery eyes, slurred speech, and smelled a strong odor of an alcoholic beverage. Officer also

observed several Budweiser bottle caps scattered throughout the vehicle. Officer asked the driver if he had consumed any alcohol previous to driving, he stated he drank a six pack of beer and came to McDonalds to get something to eat. Officer asked the driver to step out of the vehicle to perform Standard Field Sobriety Tests. Officer performed the Horizontal Gaze Nystagmus test. Officer observed a lack of smooth pursuit, distinct and sustained Nystagmus at maximum deviation as well as onset of Nystagmus prior to 45 degrees. Next Officer performed the Walk and Turn test. Officer observed the driver was unable to maintain balance in the starting position, could not maintain heel

to toe contact, stepped off the line several times almost falling to the ground. Officer felt as if the driver was not safe to perform the rest of this test without injuring himself so he halted the tests and placed the driver under arrest for driving under the influence of alcohol. Officer read Mr. Tino the implied consent form, he stated he would consent to a blood test. Officer transported Mr. Tino to Fort Loudon Medical Center to have his blood drawn. Officer observed the registered nurse at the hospital, draw Mr. Tinos blood. After receiving the blood samples Officer transported Mr. Tino to Loudon County Jail. All the above occurred in Loudon County.
