

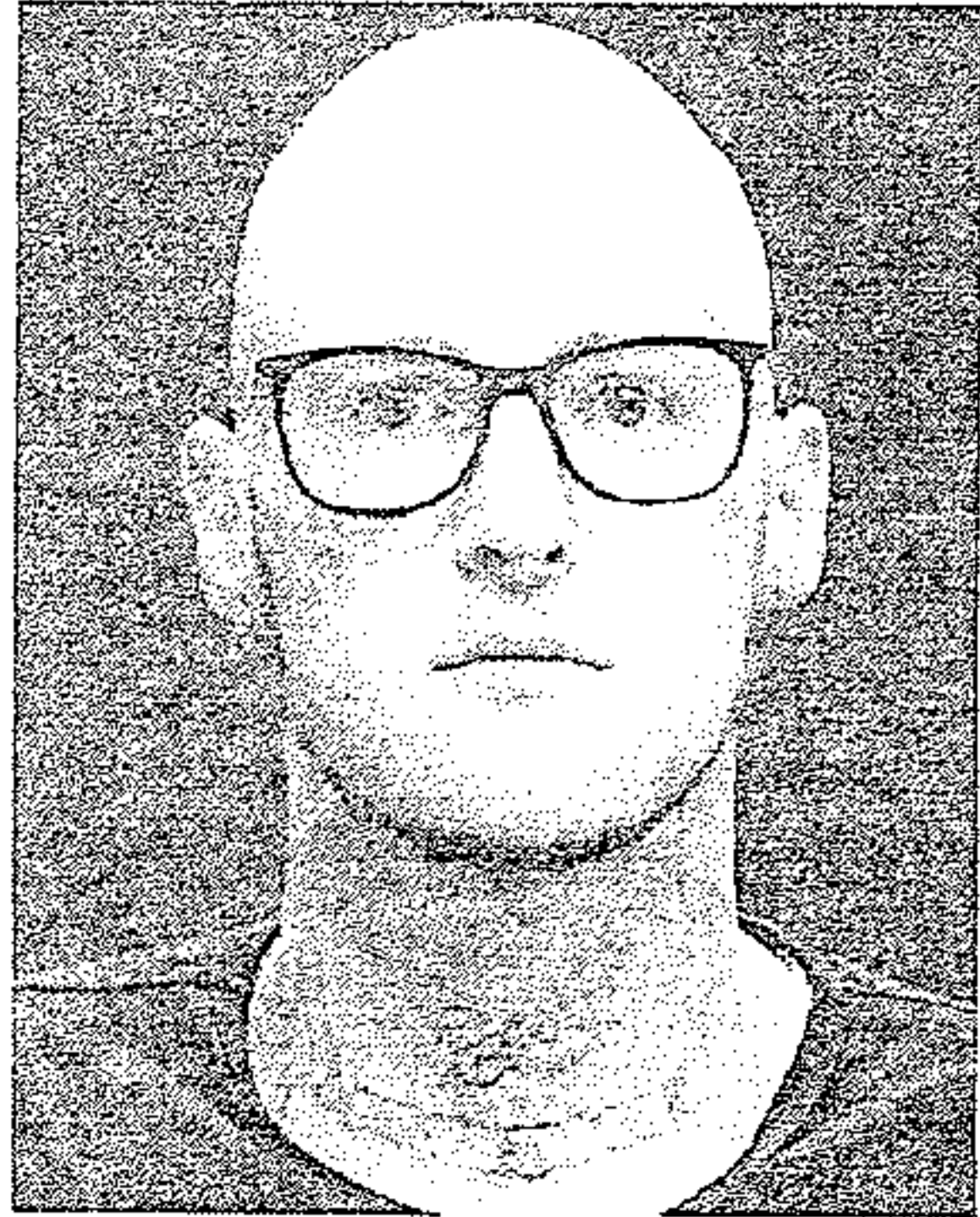

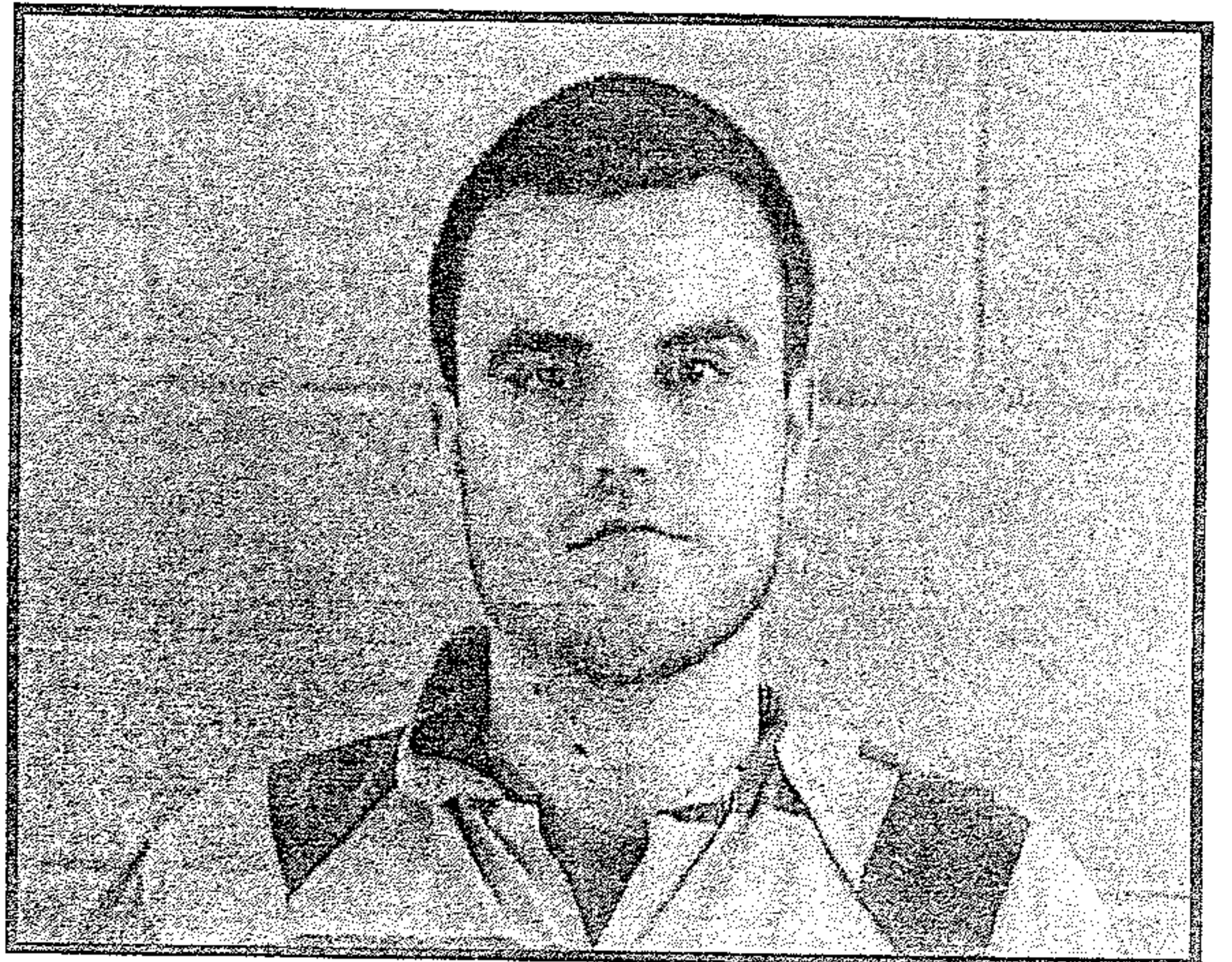

In the Safe Online Surfing (SOS) Internet Challenge, students navigate through various games and activities on their grade-appropriate island. The SOS website is accessible year-round, but the testing and competition is only open to registered teachers and schools from Sep-

tember through May. The FBI's Safe Online Surfing (SOS) Internet Challenge—a free, educational program for children that teaches cyber safety—has been redesigned for the 2017-2018 school year, with new graphics and updated content.

On 5/10/2017 Officers with the Loudon Police Department responded to 201 Hill Street in reference to a deceased body that was reported as a possible heart attack.

When officers arrived at the scene it was evident that the deceased individual,

James Johnson (02/04/1964) had been the victim of foul play, due to an apparent gunshot wound.

The Loudon Police Dept. with assistance from the Loudon County Sheriff's Department,

The Tennessee Bureau of Investigation and The Rhea County Sheriff's Department has been able to de-

velop evidence to support the indictment of three individuals on charges of First Degree Murder, Especially Aggregated Robbery, Theft and being Felons in Possession of a Firearm, in relation

to the death of Mr. Johnson. Were all indicted. Brown and Porter were arrested shortly after being indicted. Orr fled the area and was arrested on 9/12/2017 in the Denver Colorado area.

gram, created for students in third through eighth grades, covers age-appropriate topics, such as cyberbullying, passwords, malware, social media, and more. The program also provides teachers with a curriculum that meets state and federal Internet safety mandates.

While taking the course, participating students "surf" their way through a variety of Internet safety challenges at each grade level, with characters guiding them through the games. The latest version of SOS allows the program to work on more devices, including tablets. The content has also been refreshed to address current cyber safety challenges, and the island-theme graphics have been updated.

"Just as we teach our children to lock the front door for their physical safety, we have to teach them the online equivalents of those things in the dig-

ital age, like creating a strong password," said Unit Chief Jonathan Cox of the FBI's Office of Public Affairs. "SOS helps to make students better digital citizens in a fun and educational way."

Last school year, more than 700,000 students across the country completed the program and took the test, a 41 percent increase from the previous school year. More than 1.5 million students have participated and taken the exam since the original program was launched in 2012.

The SOS activities are open to anyone, though to participate in the testing and challenge, teachers must register their classes. Teachers manage their students' participation in the program; the FBI does not collect or store any student information. Each month from September through May, the classes with the top exam scores nationwide receive an FBI-SOS certificate and,

when possible, they are visited by local FBI personnel to congratulate them.

William Trezise, 51, Glenbrook Drive Lenoir City, was charged with Aggravated Assault.

Officer S. Runyan of the Lenoir City Police Department was dispatched to 324 Glenbrook Drive to a Domestic call involving a Husband that had pointed a shotgun at his Wife, she had called 911 and was advised to leave the residence. She stated he was armed possibly in the master bedroom and possibly going to commit suicide. Officers arrived on scene and made contact with victim who stated the same to us. **Dr. Oleg Manaev to discuss Vladimir Putin on September 27**

Public invited to Library's Books Sandwiched In program at the East Tennessee History Center

Knox County Public Library invites the public to join Dr. Oleg Manaev for a Books Sandwiched In discussion of The Man without a Face: The Unlikely Rise of Vladimir Putin by Masha Gessen at 12:00 p.m. on Wednesday, September 27 in the East Tennessee History Center auditorium, 601 S. Gay Street. Books Sandwiched In is sponsored by the Friends of Knox County Public Library. Reading the book is optional. Attendees may bring lunch. Drinks are available to purchase.

Manaev has an insider's perspective of Eastern European politics. When in 2010 the leadership of the Belarusian State University—on order from the KGB—pressured Manaev to resign, 130 well-known scholars from 30 countries sent a letter of protest to the Belarus President Alexander Lukashenko, preserving his position. Manaev was arrested the following year by the Minsk Riot Police and was called "a pawn of the West" by President Lukashenko. Finally, Manaev's contract with the University was cancelled, ending his 40-year tenure. Manaev has held visiting professorships at universities in the United States, Canada, Brazil, Europe and Japan. He has authored 200 scholarly articles and 20 books on media, political process, and democracy. Currently Manaev serves as a Global Security Fellow at the University of Tennessee Institute for Nuclear Security.

"I'm really impressed by how Gessen's book flows on multiple tracks, tracing Putin's life back to boyhood, the story of his hometown of St. Petersburg, his KGB experience, and finally the last quarter-century of Russian history," Manaev said. "Even though many interpretations remain controversial, this book helps to understand modern Russia."

Vladimir Putin had been

a former deputy mayor of St. Petersburg and briefly a director of the secret police, but had very little governmental or administrative experience. When the "family" surrounding Boris Yeltsin went looking for a successor to the ailing and increasingly unpopular president, Putin nevertheless seemed the perfect choice: a "faceless" creature whom Yeltsin and his cronies could mold in their own image.

"Not only the White House and the Congress, the Department of State and the Pentagon, mass media and civil activists, but many fellow Americans think and talk about Russia today," Manaev said. "Was Russia really meddling in the 2016 election, and colluded with the Trump campaign? Does Russia seriously threaten the USA and the existing world order? And more fundamental question: why after

collapse of Communism and the end of the Cold war 25 years ago, instead of building democracy, market economy and rule of law Russia has built a new aggressive autocracy?"

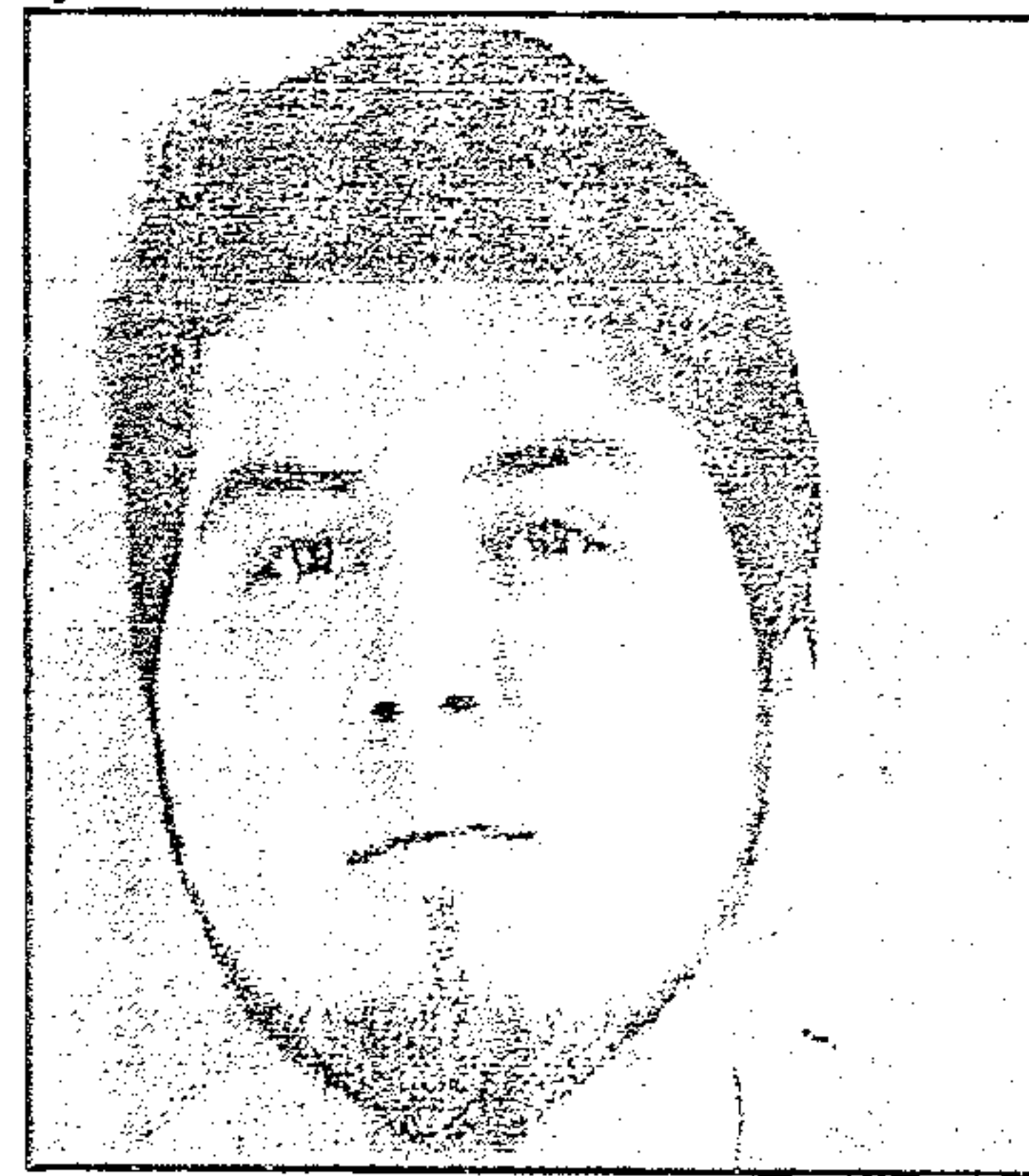
