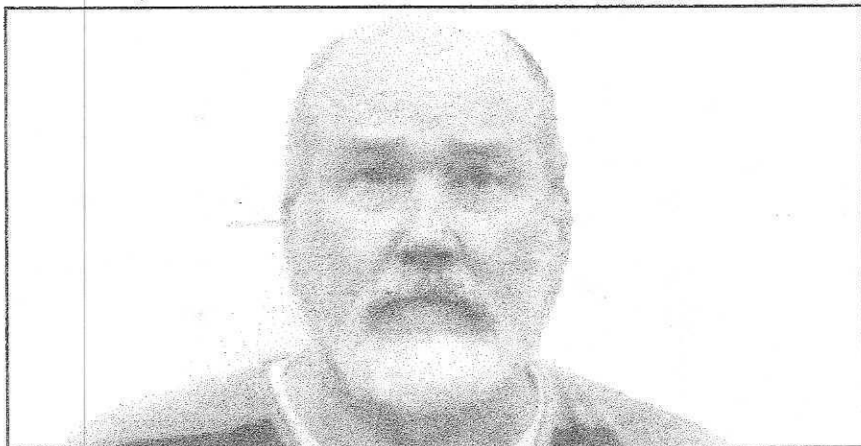

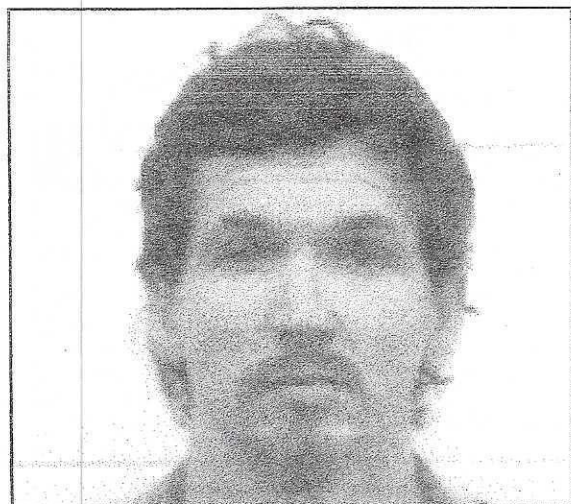

Flavored products, disposable devices, and a wide variety of brands threaten the health of our nation's youth

A study released from the U.S. Food and Drug Administration and the U.S. Centers for Disease Control and Prevention (CDC) found that 2.55 million U.S. middle and high school students reported current (past 30-day) e-cigarette use in 2022, which includes 14.1% of high school students and 3.3% of

middle school students. Nearly 85% of those youth used flavored e-cigarettes and more than half used disposable e-cigarettes.

Among youth who currently used e-cigarettes, 14.5% reported their usual brand was Puff Bar, followed by Vuse (12.5%), Hyde (5.5%), and SMOK (4.0%); more than one fifth (21.8%) reported their usual brand was a brand other than the 13 listed in the survey.

The findings, published in the Morbidity and Mortality Weekly Report, are based on data from the 2022 National Youth Tobacco Survey (NYTS), a cross-sectional, self-administered survey of U.S. middle (grades 6-8) and high (grades 9-12) school students, which was administered January 18-May 31, 2022. 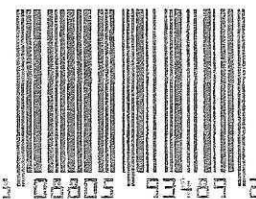

Terry Cole, 67, Taylor Drive Lenoir City, was charged with Aggravated Assault.

Officer Carroll LCPD, was dispatched to Walk by Faith church on Industrial Park drive for an armed subject call. Upon arrival, Officer spoke with the victim, who advised while helping a female, her cell phone started ringing, and the female asked the victim to answer the phone for her since she was busy. Victim did answer the phone, and it was female ex-husband Terry Cole on the phone. Mr. Cole became irate that victim had answered the phone, and he told the victim that he would be on his way to the church, and Mr. Cole stated "I've got something for you." Mr. Cole did arrive at the church, and started to curse, and yell at victim in the parking lot. Mr. Cole did then grab his handgun from his waistband, and point it at victim. The victim also drew his handgun from his waistband, and point it at Mr. Cole to protect himself. Victim was yelling

"don't you do it" to Mr. Cole. Mr. Cole then, closed his car door, and left the scene prior to Officer arrival. While on scene, Officer did watch a video of the altercation that victim had recorded on his phone. It was very clear that Mr. Cole was the primary aggressor, and that he did show up at the church with the intent to harm victim. Officer also spoke to a witness while on scene. The witness did provide a written statement about what he observed, and his story did match victim story. While on scene, Mr. Cole had called back in, and advised he would meet officers at the Lenoir City Police Department, and give his side of the story. Officers did arrive at the police department, and Mr. Cole was taken into custody. Dispatch did advise Officer that Mr. Cole stated to them while on the phone "that if he had had a round chambered, that he would have blown the victim away, and that he has a sniper rifle, and would take care of victim." Mr. Cole was transported to the jail without any further incident.

Michelle Ketron, 40, Chaloni Lane Loudon, was charged with DUI, Violation of Implied Consent, Legend Drugs, Misuse of Evidence of Registration, and Resisting Arrest.

Officer T. LaForce LCPD, got behind a silver vehicle with a displayed registration TN Tag 4X64V5 with an expiration date of March 2022. After confirming the tag with dispatch, the vehicle came back not on file. Officer got behind said vehicle and the driver began to attempt to turn around, the driver continued to look at him with suspicious behavior. Officer attempted to stop the vehicle with his lights the driver hesitated to stop and continued to the ramp not coming to a complete stop, then slowed

down attempted to stop but continuously keep rolling until approximately 100yds from initiating his lights the vehicle stopped. nessee Implied consent form and refused to sign. Officer Eldridge did find a pill that was identified to be Adderall no prescription located in her fanny pack that was removed from around her waist. An inventory search of the vehicle resulted in officers finding a cup containing an unknown liquid that had the smell of alcohol emanating from its contents in the center console. Transported to the Loudon County Jail.

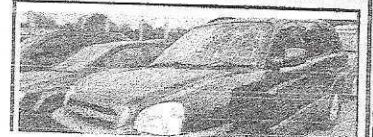

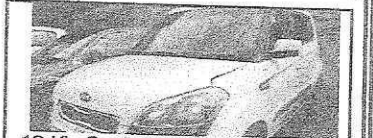

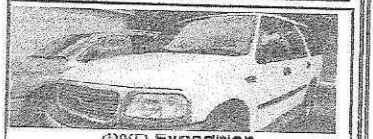

assessed current use (on one or more of the past 30 days) of e-cigarettes; frequency; and use by device type, flavors, and usual brand.

“This study shows that our nation’s youth continue to be enticed and hooked by an expanding variety of e-cigarette brands delivering flavored nicotine,” said Deirdre Lawrence Kittner, Ph.D., M.P.H., director of CDC’s Office on Smoking and Health. “Our work is far from over. It’s critical that we work together to prevent youth from starting to use any tobacco product – including e-cigarettes – and help all youth who do use them, to quit.”

**Other Key Findings**

**Frequency of Use:** Among youth who currently used e-cigarettes, more than one in four (27.6%) used them daily and more than four in 10 (42.3%) used them on 20 or more of the past 30 days.

**Device Type:** Among youth who currently used e-cigarettes, the most commonly used e-cigarette device type was disposable (55.3%), followed by prefilled or refillable pods or cartridges (25.2%), and tanks or mod systems (6.7%). Additionally, 12.8% reported not knowing the type of device used.

**Flavored E-cigarettes:** Among youth who currently used e-cigarettes, 84.9% used flavored e-cigarettes, i.e., with flavors other than tobacco, including 85.5% of high school and 81.5% of middle school students reporting use. Overall, the most used flavors were fruit (69.1%); candy, desserts, or other sweets (38.3%); mint (29.4%); and menthol (26.6%).

“Adolescent e-cigarette use in the United States remains at concerning levels, and poses a serious public health risk to our nation’s youth,” said Brian King, Ph.D., M.P.H., director of the FDA’s Center for Tobacco Products. “Together with the CDC, protecting our

nation’s youth from the dangers of tobacco products—including e-cigarettes—remains among the FDA’s highest priorities, and we are committed to combatting this issue with the breadth of our regulatory authorities.”

Due to changes in methodology, including differences in survey administration and data collection procedures in recent years due to the COVID-19 pandemic, the ability to compare estimates from 2022 with those from prior NYTS waves is limited; differences between estimates might be due to changes in methodology, actual behavior, or both.

**Addressing Youth Tobacco Product Use**

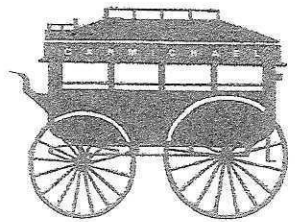
Youth use of tobacco products in any form, including e-cigarettes—is unsafe. Such products contain nicotine, which is highly addictive and can harm the developing adolescent brain. Using nicotine during adolescence might also increase risk for future addiction to other drugs.

Since 2014, e-cigarettes have been the most used tobacco product among U.S. youth. As the tobacco product landscape continues to change, the sustained implementation of comprehensive tobacco prevention and control strategies at the national, state, and local levels, coupled with FDA regulations, is critical to prevent and reduce youth access to and use of e-cigarettes.
