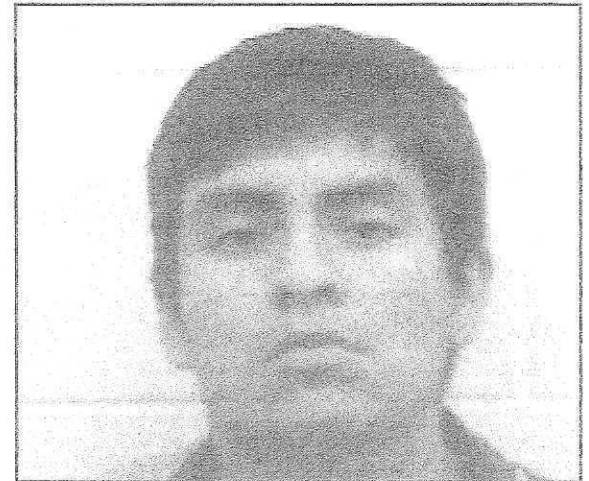

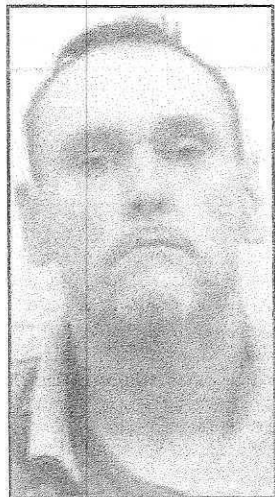

## U.S. Attorney's Office For The Eastern District Of Tennessee Observes Domestic Violence Awareness Month

U.S. Attorney Francis M. Hamilton III joins the U.S. Department of Justice, the Office on Violence Against Women (OVW), advocates, survivors, victim service providers, justice professionals, police and first responders, and communities across the U.S. in observing October as Domestic Violence Awareness Month (DVAM).

Domestic violence is more prevalent than many realize. The devastating consequences of domestic violence can cross generations and last a lifetime. Approximately one in four women and one in seven men will experience severe domestic violence in their lifetimes; however, rates are disproportionately higher for American Indian and Alaska Native populations, women of

Color, lesbian, gay, bisexual, transgender, queer, intersex, and two-spirit people, and people with disabilities. DVAM provides an opportunity to spread awareness about domestic violence and encourage everyone to play a role in ending gender-based violence.

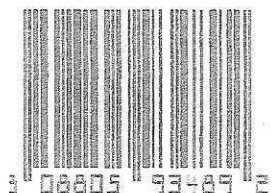

Cassidi Davis, 32, James Asbury Drive Cleveland, was charged with Driving on Revoked/Suspended License, Resisting Arrest, Assault, Child Abuse or Neglect/Endangerment x2, and Public Intoxication.

Deputy R. Fleming LCSO, was dispatched to a DAV motorist assist at Interstate 75 North at the 69-mile marker, for a female standing by the road jumping up and down trying to flag someone down in a white sedan. Deputy observed a White Lincoln sedan on the left side of the interstate in the median of the location that the caller advised. Deputy made contact with Cassidi Davis the offender. Deputy observed she had urinated her pants when she approached him. The offender advised Deputy she ran out of gas, and she had to go really bad. Deputy then noticed she had a little girl the victim, who was 7 years old in the vehicle. Deputy asked the offender if she had a driver's license, or some type of identification and she got hostile and

Pesterfield and Deputy, then tried to speak with the offender more but she was uncooperative and being very aggressive and started yelling and growling at us. Deputy then placed the offender into custody, while walking to his unit she started pulling away from Deputy and falling on the ground while cussing at him and Sgt. Pesterfield. Deputy was able to get her back up and put her in the back of his car but before she went in, she looked at her daughter and

said, "F&^% you, you have nobody now". The victim stated to Sgt. Pesterfield that she hadn't eaten or had any water all day. While a Speaker is temporarily discharging the powers and duties of the governor, the Speaker would not be required to resign as Speaker or to resign as a member of the legislature; but the Speaker would not be able to preside as Speaker or vote as a member of the legislature. A Speaker who is temporarily discharging the powers and duties of the governor would not get the governor's salary but would get the Speaker's salary. participate in Domestic Violence Awareness Month as an opportunity to increase awareness of the dangerous dynamics of domestic violence and its prevalence," said U.S. Attorney Francis M. Hamilton III.

Additionally, the U.S. Department of Justice's Office on Violence Against Women (OVW) announced the expansion of its Firearm Technical Assistance Project (FTAP) to help communities across the county reduce domestic violence homicides and injuries committed with firearms.

The FTAP grant will allow a multidisciplinary team of community leaders, victim service providers, law enforcement agencies, and judicial staff to collaboratively troubleshoot the implementation and safety issues around firearm dispossession for domestic violence offenders in criminal sessions and civil court. Our office is pleased to announce that the Young Woman's Christian Association (YWCA) of Knoxville and the Tennessee Valley was selected to participate in this project expansion.
