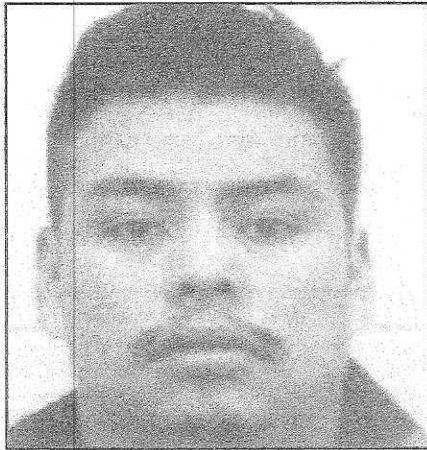

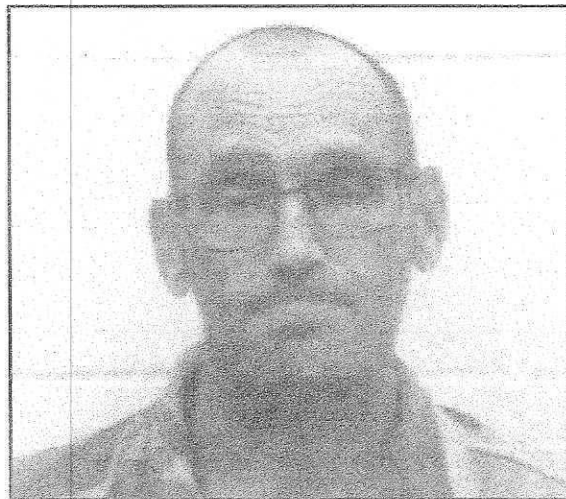

Justice Department Seeks Forfeiture Of Property Used In Attacks On Planned Parenthood And Federal Building

The Justice Department filed a civil complaint seeking the forfeiture of a sedan, a pickup truck, and one firearm alleged to have been utilized in a series of attacks by Mark Thomas Reno, formerly of Jefferson City, Tennessee.

According to court documents, it is alleged that on Jan. 22, 2021, Reno utilized a sedan and a shotgun to fire an incendiary round into the entrance to the Planned Parenthood - Knoxville, Tennessee, Health Center (the Center); on Dec 31,

2021, Reno utilized a pickup truck to set fire to the Center, resulting in the Center burning down; on June 18, 2022, Reno utilized the same pickup truck and a .22 caliber rifle with an illegal suppressor to shoot

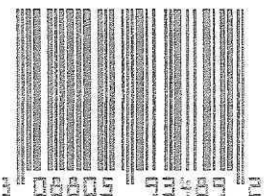

Austin Traylor, 27, Butcher Lane Maynardville, was charged with Criminal Impersonation.

Officer Carroll LCPD, was advised by the Jail that a previous arrest involving a male subject who stated his name was Simmons, was actually identified as Austin Earl Traylor. Mr. Traylor did intentionally give false information to try, and hide his true identity. Officer Carroll did receive a flock hit on a stolen vehicle. The vehicle was a white Dodge Ram 2500 driven by Mr. Traylor, who at the time advised his name was Kelling. After being placed in custody, and enroute to the jail, Mr. Traylor then advised his real identity was Simmons out of the state of Florida. Mr. Traylor had given false

information numerous times trying to hide his identity. Mr. Traylor was charged with Criminal Impersonation for giving false information. This did occur in Lenoir City, TN without any further incident.

Domestic Charge

Andrea Packett, 30, Pineridge Drive Lenoir City, was charged with Domestic Assault.

Officer H. Wilkes LCPD, was dispatched to the Ramblin Acres Trailer Park, in reference to a physical domestic. Upon my arrival, Officer made contact with a victim, who had a black eye. While speaking with the victim, she advised him that her and her sister-in-law, Andrea Packett, got into a physical fight. The victim stated that they had plans to paint a pumpkin, but Ms. Packett

wanted to carve the pumpkin. The victim had went inside to get a drink and candy, and when she came out she observed Ms. Packett carving the pumpkin with broken kitchen utensils.

During this time, Ms. Packett and victim began making comments towards each other and an argument started. Victim stated that she went inside and Ms. Packett followed her, causing victim to fear for her safety. At that time, a physical altercation started. Ms. Packett advised me that victim pushed her first, and victim advised Officer that Ms. Packett pushed her first. While this was happening, a witness, came out of a different room and observed Ms. Packett on top of victim, punching her several times.

Packett had multiple scratch marks on her chest, but she refused medical assistance. Victim had a black eye, and medical services arrived on scene to treat her. Officer was able to determine that Ms. Packett was the primary aggressor during this incident, and caused victim bodily injuries.

At that time, Officer placed her into custody. Ms. Packett had two children on scene, and the children's grandmother came and retrieve the children. The witness and the victim agreed to write a written statement for officers. Ms. Packett was transported to the Loudon County Jail without further incident.

All of the above did occur in Lenoir City, Loudon County, Tennessee.

Duncan Federal Office Building in downtown Knoxville; and again on July 3, 2022, Reno utilized the same sedan and the same .22 caliber rifle to shoot the windows at the John J. Duncan Federal Office Building in Knoxville. The complaint seeks the forfeiture of both vehicles and the firearm used during the shootings on June 18, 2022, and July 3, 2022.

The FBI arrested Reno on July 18, 2022. He was released from custody for health reasons on Aug. 14, 2022, and passed away on Aug. 15, 2022.

Assistant Attorney General Kristen Clarke of the Justice Department's Civil Rights Division and U.S. Attorney Francis M. Hamilton III for the Eastern District of Tennessee announced the complaint.

The FBI, ATF and U.S. Marshals Service investigated the criminal case, with substantial assistance from the Knoxville

Fire Department. Assistant U.S. Attorney Casey T. Arrowood for the Eastern District of Tennessee and Trial Attorney Kyle Boynton of the Criminal Section of the Justice Department's Civil Rights Division prosecuted the criminal case.

Assistant U.S. Attorney Arrowood is representing the United States in the civil forfeiture action.

The claims made in the civil complaint are allegations only, and there has been no determination of liability.
