





Darrell Morgan, 38, Dolivar Kentucky, was charged with Aggravated Assault, False Imprisonment, and Fugitive from Justice.

Officer Parmer LCPD. was dispatched to Kings Inn Motel, Hwy 321 N, room 144, in regard to subjects screaming. Upon my arrival, Officer observed the door of room 144 to be partially open. Oficer knocked on the door and a male subject, later identified as 38-year-old Darrell Morgan, opened the door. Mr. Morgan was very fidgety, agitated, had claw marks on his neck and before any questions were asked, Mr. Morgan stated that the screaming was coming from next door and immediately shut the door on officers. After Mr. Morgan shut the door, Officer could hear a female voice from inside room 144 state "please let me go." Officer knocked on the door

again to which Mr. Morgan came back. When Mr. Morgan opened the door Officer could see a female, sitting on the floor, in the corner of the room, crying and in a fetal, protective position.

Officer told Mr. Morgan to step outside and immediately detained him. Contact was then made with the female, identified as the victim. The victim neck was red, and she had busted blood vessels around her throat. Victim was visibly shaken and kept informing officers that she just wanted to go home.

Officer asked victim what happened, and although hesitant, she informed him that she and Mr. Morgan had been in a physical altercation. Victim stated that she had found a text message on Mr. Morgan's phone which implied that he was cheating. Vic-

tim confronted Mr. Morgan about the message and when confronted, Mr. Morgan began to strangle victim to the point that she could no longer breathe.

Mr. Morgan was subsequently placed into custody and when his driver's license was ran through central dispatch, he came back with a full extradition war-

rant out of Indiana for a Probation Violation on a Felony Domestic Assault Charge. Mr. Morgan was transported to Loudon County Jail without incident.


The victim was transported to a safe place by Officer La-Force.

Sgt. Rogers LCSO, observed a red sedan traveling on Muddy Creek Rd. that had an obstructed tag that expired 10/2022. Deputy paced the vehicle at 45mph in a 35mph zone and initiated a traffic stop near Martel Rd. Upon contact with the driver, Ms. Bre Davidson, she stated she had a small amount of marijuana in the vehicle. As Deputy started to search the vehicle Ms. Davidson further stated she had Cocaine and Heroin in her gray purse in the back seat. Deputy did located the gray purse that contained a bag with 0.8 grams of a white substance, a bag with 0.8 grams of an off-white substance, and another bag of 4.6 grams of Marijuana. 





Rickey Kilby,51, South Cherry Street Lenoir City, was charged with Interfere with Emergency Call, and Domestic Assault.






