

In 2019, nursing home facilities reportsearch and Education ed spending about \$9.8 million for healthcare staffing agencies. This rose to \$16.6 million in 2020 and \$52.5 million in 2021. So far, during the first half of 2022, nursing home facilities have already spent \$52.2 million on temporary staff.

The new study focuses on how these rising

costs for temporary staff may affect the **TennCare** program. The state government annually administers approximately \$1 billion in funding at nursing facilities and approximately \$12 million for care provided at assisted care living facilities.

Andrew Leek, 33, Stinnett Road Lenoir City, was charged with Reckless Endangerment, Reckless Driving, Due Care, Speeding, and Driving on Roadways Laned for Traffic.

Officer R. Miller LCPD, was dispatched to a wreck with injury with reports of a female driver pinned inside of her vehicle that was on fire.

On scene Officer observed a small blue Nissan sedan in the west bound lane of Harrison Road with heavy smoke coming from the front end. Officer quickly made contact with the female driver who was pinned inside of the vehicle and could not get out.

Fire and medics arrived on scene and were able to extract the female from the driver's seat of the vehicle.

Medics on scene advised that the female had two injuries to her lower extremity which were two compound fractures one on each leg. The Female was transported to UT Medical Center due to her significant injuries (EMS Run# 117431).

Further According to the report, Multiple witnesses in the area at the time of the collision stated that they observed the dark blue Ford pickup truck traveling at a high rate of speed and driving recklessly. One witnessed observed the pickup truck exiting the parking lot of the Loudon County Vocational School out onto Harrison Road at a high rate of speed and stated that the pickup truck was spinning its tires and fishtailing. The

same witness stated that he observed the pickup truck spin his tries and accelerate at a high rate of speed at after stopping at the four-way stop sign at Harrison Road and Norwood Road, where he stated that the pickup truck continued down the hill of Harrison Road at a high rate of speed.

Other witnesses stated that they observed the pickup truck accelerate at a high rate of speed after stopping at the four-way intersection and stated that the pickup truck was accelerating so fast that it began spinning its tries and finally losing control where it came into contact with the blue Nissan sedan head on.
