

Natasha Bright, 31, Homeless Lenoir City, was charged with Vandalism, Evading Arrest, and Poss. Of Drug Para.

Ronald Yarbrough, 32, Martel Road Lenoir City, was charged with Accessory after the Fact, Assault, Criminal Responsibility for the Conduct of Another, and Poss, of Drug Para.

Officer DeLand LCPD. was in the parking lot next to Casey's on Broadway. A clerk from the store walked up to his patrol vehicle and advised a female had just vandalized the men's restroom inside the convenience store. Prior to this conversation, Officer observed a female come out of the store and walk away with a male standing in the parking lot next door to Casey's. They walked away towards the railroad tracks. While Natashia was in the bathroom, the clerks heard loud

banging noises coming from the restroom. After she left the store, the clerk went into the men's restroom and saw where Natashia had busted a hole in the wall, causing \$2000.00 of severe damage to their property (Picture-1).

Ronnie was standing in the parking lot, knowing Natashia was committing felony vandalism to the property. Officer advised other Officers about the incident and to patrol the area they walked towards. Officer Ketner and Pistole located the subjects walking north on the railroad tracks near Maple Street. While assisting them in climbing up an embankment next to the tracks, Natashia and Ronnie ran from them into the woods.

A perimeter was set up around the subjects. Officer Miller and Pistole were in the woods, running towards them. Officer Pistole made contact with Ronnie in the woods. While he was reaching for his handcuffs, Ronnie turned towards Pistole and pushed Officer Pistole to the ground, and fled away again. Ronnie then ran into Officer Ketner and Deland at the wood line near Maple Street.

He was then placed into custody. Officer Miller and Reagan located Natashia nearby and placed her in cus-

Officer Miller located a backpack both subjects were carrying during the chase. Inside it was a small bag with a metal spoon and needles inside it (Picture-2).

Both were arrested and transported to the Loudon County Jail.

This did happen in Lenoir City, Tennessee.





Sean Hatcher, 28, Sandy Shore Drive Lenoir City, was charged with Man/Sell/Del/Resale Sch. VI & IV, Unlawful Inhaling, Giving, Selling of GL, DUI, Driving on Suspended License, Poss. Of Drug para., and Leaving the Scene of Accident.

Sgt. Rogers LCSO, was asked to respond to the Surestay on Hwy 321 in reference to a possible impaired driver that Lenoir City Police Department had contact with. Upon arrival Officer Parmer LCPD, advised the attendant at the Surestay called 911 due to a male who showed up with a vehicle that had extensive damage. Officer Parmer found the male in question sitting in the driver's seat. Once on scene Sgt. made contact with the driver, Mr. Sean Hatcher and mirandized him. Mr. Hatcher stated he was coming from a friends

house in Knoxville when he fell asleep and collided with several Interstate signs. Mr. Hatcher stated he had a drug problem that included Adderall, Vyvanse, Xannax. Marijuana, Alcohol and Nitrous Oxide (all of which he stated he had used in the last 2-thrs). Mr. Hatcher consented to SFST/ARIDE testing and performed poorly. Officer Parmer conducted a search of the vehicle that produced 29.7 grams of THC wax, 1.4 lbs of Nitrous Oxide and 52 Xanax with no prescription. Based on the totality of the circumstances Sgt. took Mr. Hatcher into custody of DUI and then read him Tennessee Implied Consent to which he did consent to a blood draw. Officer Parmer assumed all other charges appropriate for the incident in it's entirety. Sgt. transported the offender to the Fort Loudoun ER, where the blood draw took place, and then to the Loudon County Jail.



cases every day to identify all those who used deception to steal public funds."

"Those charged today acted out of pure greed," said FBI Pittsburgh Special Agent in Charge Mike Nordwall. "These loans were intended to help business owners struggling from the impact of the pandemic. Instead, the indictments allege these actors saw it as an opportunity to rip off the program. Everyone should know the FBI and our partners will pursue those who defraud programs like PPP and hold them accountable for their crimes."

Dalton Haas is alleged to have made false representations regarding organizations with which he was affiliated in order to obtain CARES Act funding. Specifically, Haas is charged with making false statements about the gross revenues, the cost of goods sold, and the number of employees for the Lebanese Restaurant & Bakery, the Wheeling Wine Festival, the West Virginia Hockey League, and the Wheeling Hockey Association.

James Nolte is charged with submitting false tax documents, payroll reports, and business records in order to obtain Paycheck Protection Program (PPP) loans. The indictment alleges that Nolte improperly secure loans for PGO Veteran Services, PG Health, RJS Catering, and Dental Care Plus, for total fraud in the amount of \$645,717.

Shawn Murphy is alleged to have applied for and received unemployment compensation through the CARES Act even though he was still gainfully employed as a machine operator at businesses in Marshall County.

David Boyd is charged with submitting false information in support of his application for PPP funding, including misrepresenting the gross income of a business known as the Seafood Hut. Boyd is also charged with lying to an FBI agent about his loans.

Jodi Headley is alleged to have applied for and receiving unemployment benefits despite being employed by Hancock County schools.

Assistant U.S. Attorney Jennifer Conklin is prosecuting the cases. The matters were investigated by the FBI and WorkForce West Virginia.




