

He then says he'll just show her right here and exposes his genitals to her. She tells him he needs to stop, he walks over to her, and straddles her. He then forcibly grabs

Nakeesha Berry, 35, Rausin Road Philadelphia, charged with Theft of Property.

Deputy Green LCSO, was traveling South on Interstate 75 approaching mile-marker 68. Deputy observed a silver Nissan Altima traveling in the slow lane between two semi-trucks with no traffic in the left lane.

As Deputy approached the vehicle he observed the vehicle travel along the fog line and drift into the shoulder. This vehicle made an abrupt exit off of the interstate at exit 68 and traveled at an extremely low rate of speed. This vehicle stopped at the stop sign for an extended period of time.

Deputy conducted a traffic stop and made contact with the occupants of the vehicle,

(Driver) and Nakeesha Berry (Front Left Passenger). Deputy advised the driver of the reason for stop and while speaking to both occupants

Deputy observed a series of nervous behavior. Deputy requested the driver to exit the vehicle to gather information while issuing a citation. While speaking with Ms. Berry he observed continued nervous behavior. Deputy asked Ms. Berry if there was anything illegal inside the vehicle which she responded with uncertainty. Deputy made contact with Ms. Berry and asked basic questions in regards to their origin and destination.

Ms. Berry and the driver stories did not corroborate. Deputy asked Ms. Berry if there was anything illegal inside the vehicle and she stated no. I asked a series

of questions such as illegal drugs, cash, or firearms. Ms. Berry stated no to all items but hesitated when asked about firearms.

Ms. Berry eventually stated she possessed a firearm that was under her seat. Deputy asked both parties for consent to conduct a search of the vehicle which they granted. Upon search of the vehicle, Deputy located a black Ruger .380 pistol in a black case under the front left passenger

seat. Deputy ran the serial number through dispatch which returned stolen out of Cocke County. This NCIC entry was confirmed. The firearm is currently valued at approximately \$259.99. Deputy took Ms. Berry into custody and transported her to Loudon County Jail without incident where she was charged with Theft of Prop-
