Abraham Iqbal, 30, Avery Street Lenoir City, was charged with Aggravated Assault.

Officer Carroll LCPD, made contact with the (victim). The victim advised that a male subject named Abraham Jacob Iqbal(offender) pointed a handgun at him. Victim was able to describe the handgun as a black gun. Victim did advise that he was afraid, and feared that Mr. Iqbal might harm him. While on scene, Officer also spoke to the owner of the residence (witness). Witness did advise that her daughter (other involved), and Mr. Iqbal were in an argument, and things got heated, and both of them started yelling. Witness advised that victim is the neighbor, and he heard the yelling, and came over to make sure everything was alright, and that is when Mr. Iqbal got irate, and pointed the weapon at victim. Witness also stated to Officer Ketner that Mr. Iqbal told her "if you don't let me see your daughter, then you will be covered
