

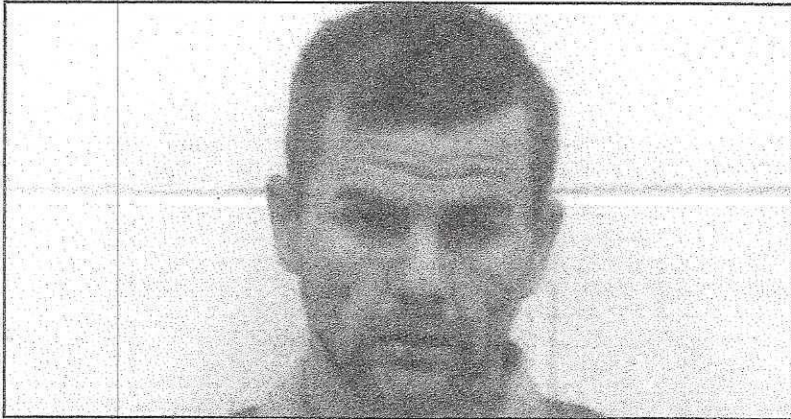

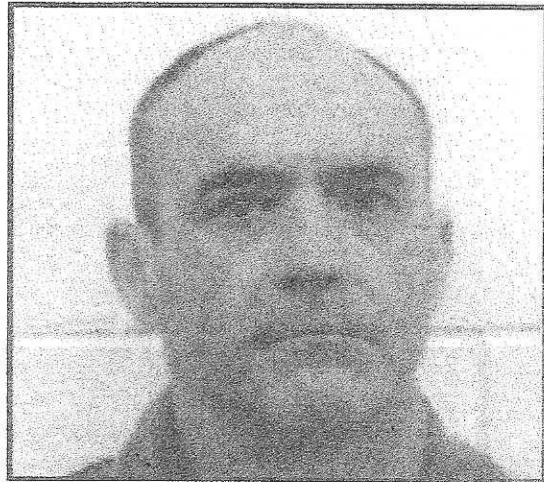

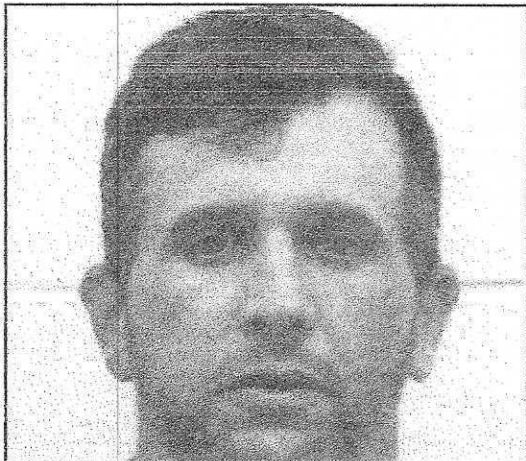

What Do You Do With that Ticking Time Bomb in the Attic?

Trained Teams Safely Dispose of Decades-Old Military Explosives Found in Homes

Some families of aging U.S. war veterans are finding unexpected, and highly dangerous, souvenirs among their loved ones' belongings—ticking time bombs.

Service members either brought the devices home from their combat service or purchased them later. Most of the devices

found today come from World War I (which the U.S. entered 105 years ago this month), World War II, Korea, Vietnam, or the Gulf War.

Known as military ordnance, these devices can remain intact for decades but explode without notice. They are highly dangerous, and only a trained

bomb technician should handle them.

That's exactly what the FBI's bomb technicians do.

FBI bomb squads have disabled explosive material from as early as the Civil War; the Army Corps of Engineers found

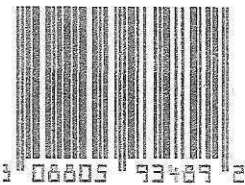

Joshua Hauther, 33, Price Road Loudon, was charged with Capiasx2, Simple Possession x3, Criminal Impersonation, and Poss. Of Drug Para.

Officer R. Miller LCPD, responded to the area of Highway 321 (Holiday Inn Express) in Lenoir City, TN in regards to a welfare check on a male subject passed out in his vehicle. Upon my arrival Officer made contact with the vehicle, Black Toy-

ota Sedan, which was located in the front parking lot of the Holiday Inn Express. When Officer approached the vehicle he observed a male subject slumped over in the driver's seat which a hypodermic needle in his lap. Officer announced his presence at which time the male woke up and stated that he was just sleeping. The male gave the name Josh S Hauther with the date of birth of 1988. Dispatch advised that no name or date of birth matched what

the subject provided, but did locate a name of Joshua Riley Hauther with the date of birth of 1988 which was the correct identity. HAUTHER at first denied that his middle name was RILEY and stated again that it was STEVEN. HAUTHER also gave an incorrect social when asked what his social was. Dispatch was able to confirm that HAUTHER had two active warrants one out of Lenoir City and the other out of Loudon County. Officer

placed HAUTHER under arrest at which time Officer then conducted a probable cause search of the vehicle. A subsequent search of the vehicle resulted in 0.2 grams of a brown powder like substance, HAUTHER, stated was possibly heroin, 1/2 of a suboxone pill, 7 methylphenidate hydrochloride pills, 2 glass pipes with residue and 4 hypodermic needles. HAUTHER was transported to the Loudon County Jail.

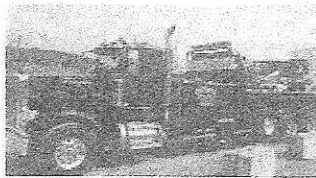

Dustin Akers, 38, Ridgecrest Drive Knoxville, was charged with Mfg/Del/Sale or Poss. Of Meth, Man/Sell/Del/Resale Sch. I, Poss. Of Drug Para., Driving while in Possession of Meth, Simple Possession x2, and Unlawful Carrying of a Weapon.

Officer R. Miller LCPD, was conducting a routine patrol in the area of Highway 321 South in Lenoir City,

TN. During patrol duties Officer observed a black in color Nissan Maxima with heavily tint windows to the point that you could not see into the vehicle traveling south on Highway 321 in Lenoir City. Officer then initiated a traffic stop on the vehicle.

Upon traffic stop Officer made contact with the driver/owner of the vehicle, Dustin Akers, and passenger, Roger Hundley, both

residents of Knoxville, TN. The windows on the vehicle registered at 2% which is violation of T.C.A. 55-9-107 Window Tint. While speaking with both subjects Officer noticed several indicators of nervous behavior. Officer also noticed several open alcohol pads throughout the entire vehicle which Officer know from training and experience are commonly associated with hypodermic needle usage.

While conducting his business in regards to the traffic stop, Officer requested for Deputy C. Gray and his K-9 partner Kora from the Loudon County Sheriff's Office to assist and conduct an open air sniff of the vehicle. On scene K-9 Kora positively alerted to an odor of narcotics coming from inside of the vehicle. A probable cause

search of the vehicle revealed a black box containing a crystal-like substance believed to be methamphetamine, a brown powder-like substance believed to be heroin, and a green-leafy substance believed to be marijuana. Both subjects were then placed under arrest. A search of AKERS person revealed a crystal-like substance believed to be methamphetamine, a white and gray powder like substance believed to be heroin, a paper-like substance with a design on it believed to be LSD - Acid Strip, and two hypodermic needles.

The total amount of methamphetamine located was 8.90 grams. Total amount of marijuana located was 1.43 grams. Total amount of heroin located was 0.88 grams. Total amount of LSD Strips was 42.

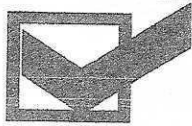

cannonballs from that era at the bottom of the Mississippi River when they were dredging in January.

The FBI Eastern Missouri Bomb Task Force did a controlled detonation of a Civil War-era cannonball in January 2022. A total of three cannonballs were found when the Army Corps of Engineers dredged the Mississippi River.

"Usually what happens is when a veteran passes away, and family members are cleaning out their items, usually in a basement, garage, or attic, they'll come across something that they know or suspect is a military ordnance," said Special Agent Patrick Carolan, a bomb technician with the FBI's St. Louis Field Office. "They call their local police, and we work with the police depart-

ment's bomb squad."

Carolan explains that if the ordnance is a U.S.-made device, the bomb squad has the experience and knowledge to handle it. They place it in a containment vessel and take it to a bomb range for safe disposal. If the device was manufactured in another country, the bomb squad often calls in the U.S. military for expert assistance.

The FBI's St. Louis Field Office typically gets about one call per week for suspected military ordnance. That number has accelerated in recent years with large numbers of elderly veterans now dying.

The office was so concerned about the safety risks that they launched a public campaign in January. They asked for the public to call in if they recognized any of these devices in their own

homes. The bomb squad received 17 calls that week, and more came in in subsequent weeks as a result of local media coverage.

Carolan said people are often a little shocked and concerned to realize they or their loved ones have been living with such a dangerous item in their home, sometimes for decades.


"They are usually very surprised and relieved that we can take it off their hands,"

he said.

Carolan encourages anyone who thinks they may have ordnance to call their local police department or 911 immediately.

"People are sometimes hesitant to call us because they think they're putting us out. That is not the case. This is our job," Carolan said. "We'd much rather come take a look at it and have it be nothing. We don't want anyone to get hurt."





Gun

Jamey Lynn who has stolen from children and a single mother and was caught selling the items along with his now dead mother has been charged after pulling a gun on victims. He was also charged with the theft of major construction equipment when the Jeep Dealership was being built in Lenoir City. Mr Lynn is a convicted felon and despite numerous reports of his gun ownership he was never charged until now with the guns. Hopefully this menace to society will be kept behind bars for good but it seems he gets out over and over and is allowed to continue his criminal behaviors including having guns.

Jamey Lynn, 52, Huntsville Hollow Road Lenoir City, was charged with Aggravated Assault x2, and Convicted Felon in Possession of Firearm.

Deputy S. Gaumer LCSO, responded to a domestic involving an armed person call at Huntsville Hollow Road. When Deputy arrived on scene, he found a male, later identified as, the victim, standing outside arguing with another female. Deputy came to find out the female that victim1 was arguing with was, the other victim 2.

At this point, Corporal Z. Frye 916 had already made contact with the another male involved, Jamey Lynn, the offender on the front porch of the residence. It was confirmed that the above listed residence was Mr. Lynn's. While speaking with victim 1, Deputy learned that he and victim 2 had come down to the above listed residence to pick up a female, witness and mother to victim 2.

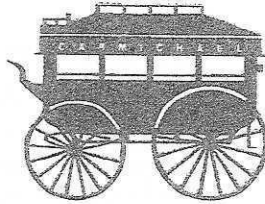
According to victim1, earlier in the evening, Mr. Lynn had driven down to the residence of a family friend and "beat up" an uncle. After that interaction, Mr. Lynn sped

away, almost hitting two juvenile male's in the driveway. Mr. Lynn then went back to his residence and had a physical altercation with witness, which prompted the two victims to come and attempt to pick the witness up. When they arrived at Huntsville Hollow Road, victim 2 attempted to enter the residence to get the witness, but Mr. Lynn was blocking the door. A verbal altercation ensued, culminating in Mr. Lynn going back to his bedroom and retrieving a "shotgun". At this point, victim2 said Mr. Lynn pointed the weapon at her and victim 1, who was standing near her in the yard. Victim 2 yelled "run" and that was when they both left the front porch of the residence and called 911. Deputy spoke with witness who confirmed that Mr. Lynn did go to the bedroom and retrieved a .22 caliber long rifle and pointed it at victim 2. The rifle was found near the front door when deputies arrived on scene. Due to a language barrier, her statement was recorded on body camera.

It should also be noted that victim 2 and 1, and the witness were all interviewed separately. Each of their statements were nearly identical. When speaking with Mr. Lynn, he denied having ever had an altercation with either of the two victims and said he never touched a weapon during the verbal altercation. Due to the statements of all witnesses and victims, Deputy placed Mr. Lynn under arrest with two counts of aggravated assault.

Upon reviewing Mr. Lynn's criminal history, Deputy found him to be a convicted felon. Due to this, Deputy also charged him with felon in possession of a firearm. All occurred in Loudon County, TN.
