House Boarded Up in LC As Nuisance by DA Johnson

Sons Board Up Home of Dad in Continuing Effort to Support Community

The residence of Bruce Windred Jenkins, located at 502 West 2nd Avenue has officially been evacuated and boarded up after a Criminal Court Order was issued at the request of District Attorney General Russell Johnson. The home was the location of some 30+ calls over the last few years including a stabbing and a shooting that resulted in death just recently. The home is also the childhood home of newly elected Commissioner William Jenkins of the 2nd District. Commissioner Jenkins has for years worked

with the DAs office when they had to board up a home and this time it was where he grew up. Jenkins stated he hoped his Dad would be able to get the help he needed but also wanted neighbors to know the community was a little safer now too.

Former West Knox Utility District Comptroller Indicted

Kim Green made unauthorized adjustments to leave balances

An investigation by the Tennessee Comptroller's Office has resulted in the indictment of Kim Green, the former comptroller of the West Knox Utility District (WKUD), which provides water and wastewater services to more than 27,000 customers.

Investigators determined that Green improperly adjusted her

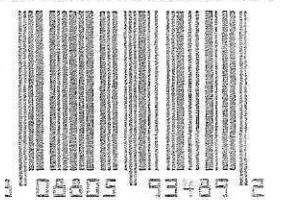
paid time off (PTO) leave balance by at least 227 hours between July 2018 and June 2021. These adjustments were made without management's approval or knowledge and had the effect of increasing the value of Green's leave balance by \$10,258.

Green also made unauthorized adjustments to her sick

leave balance by increasing it by at least 85.87 hours. Green redeemed these unauthorized hours in 2020 at a cost of \$3,756 based on her rate of pay at that time.

Additionally, Green made unauthorized PTO and sick leave balance adjustments to at least nine other

Jenkins

According to the DA and Police Chief Don White LCPD; the 502 W 2nd Avenue address has been the cause of a large amount of First responder responses over several years. The house has been closed previously in 2011 by the Loudon County Sheriffs Office after they conducted an investiga-

tion that resulted in an active methamphetamine lab followed by a prison term for the owner, Bruce Jenkins.

The property was bought back by Mr Jenkins and just in the past two years law enforcement has associated over 30 calls for service related to the same address including thefts, drugs, assaults, a stabbing, a homicide, wanted in-

dividuals, missing juveniles and countless interviews and contact regarding open criminal investigations.

Authorities went on to state the property has been a constant drain on first responders to handle the illegal activity occurring at the nuisance property as well as going to or coming from the nuisance property. The local community has had to stand by and watch as the property continues to decline and the illegal activities occur.

Despite numerous conversations with the property owner and the possibilities of court involvement the activity has not stopped and seems to have increased.

The 9th DTF has had a large growth in drug seizures in the district primarily in Loudon County since the beginning of this year including over 15,000 grams of meth, over 5600 grams of cocaine, over 4000 grams of Heroin/Fentanyl and over 840 lbs of marijuana and THC Vape Lab.

Gregory Griffith, 30, County Road 304 Sweetwater, was charged with Evading Arrest, Driving on Revoked License, Reckless Driving, and Driving Unregistered Vehicle.

According to the report, Officer R. Miller LCPD, was notified of a male subject on a black motorcycle traveling East on Broadway in Lenoir City, TN, the male subject was not wearing a helmet and had a mohawk.

While in the area Officer located the male subject with a mohawk on the black motorcycle leaving the EZ Stop Gas Station on Broadway. The male subject did not have a helmet on. Officer initiated his emergency equipment on his patrol vehicle at which time Officer also exited the vehicle and verbally commanded the male on the mo-

torcycle to stop. The male disregarded his emergency equipment along with verbal commands and continued West on Broadway in Lenoir City, TN.

Officer observed the male subject on the black motorcycle traveling at a high rate of speed and passing vehicles on the shoulder of the roadway in attempts to escape, putting those on the roadways life at risk. Officer did not give chase to the motorcycle due to extreme speeds. Sgt. Hamilton was traveling in the area of Broadway in Lenoir City when he observed the motorcycle that had fled from the traffic stop traveling at speeds, he estimated to be upwards to 100mph. The speed limit on Broadway in Lenoir City is 30mph posted.

The male subject and the motorcycle were shortly located at a factory in Lenoir City, TN by Agent Fritts.

Officer arrived on scene with Agent Fritts at Foley Products Company where the male who fled stated he worked. Officer immediately identified the male as the subject who fled from the traffic stop at which time, Officer placed him under

arrest.

The male was identified as, Gregory Griffith, of Taylors, South Carolina. GRIFFITH was found to be driving on a suspended driver's license. The black motorcycle was also deemed unregistered, and GRIFFITH did not have paperwork for it. GRIFFITH was placed under arrest and transported to the Loudon County Jail.

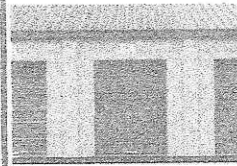

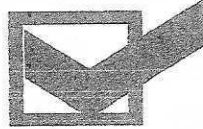

current and former employees' balances, which could have resulted in a cost to the district of approximately \$27,240. Some employees told investigators they neither requested nor were aware of these adjustments. District officials have corrected the balances for the current employees to properly reflect authorized leave balances.

The investigation began after utility district officials identified and reported questionable transactions to the Comptroller's Office. WKUD terminated Green's employment on July 20, 2021. The district used Green's final PTO leave balance to recover the unauthorized PTO (\$10,258) and sick leave (\$3,756) hours she had improperly given herself.

In May 2022, the Knox County Grand Jury indicted Kimberly Green on one

count of computer crimes, one count of forgery, and two counts of official misconduct.

"District officials should ensure one person isn't allowed to make leave adjustments without any oversight," said Comptroller Jason Mumpower. "The district should also ensure it documents any leave adjustments, and it should implement and enforce its approved leave policies."

Bradley Burnette, 33, Old Hwy 95 Lenoir City, was charged with Aggravated Assault.

Deputy Pesterfield LCSO, was dispatched to Old Midway Rd. for a 911 open line. Dispatch advised they could hear a male and female in the background arguing. Upon arrival, Deputy spoke with the victim.
