



and advised it was in there. Deputy looked inside his pocket and observed a baggie of methamphetamine. Deputy said, "That looks like meth." He replied, "Yeah." It weighed at 8.8 Grams. His picture was taken and sent to the victim, they did not identify the male to be involved in the theft. Search incident to arrest was conducted in the arear Mr. Upton was positioned in the vehicle. In plain

view was a burnt glass pipe in the center of the back seat. next to where Mr. Upton was sitting. A probable cause search was then conducted on the vehicle. In the pocket located on the back of the passengers seat was a glasses case. Inside the case was 87 pressed, blue, circle pills labeled "M 30" also known as "Oxycodone" inside two separate small baggies. 17 pressed, blue, oval pills labeled "Y 20" also known as "Alprazolam" in a small

baggie. 3 325 milligram pressed, white, oval pills labeled "M522" also known as "Oxycodone" inside a small biggie. Inside the pocket where the glasses case was found was a green "Crown Royal" bag, inside this bag was several small baggies and 4.8 Grams of marijuana. In the glovebox located in front of one female, burnt tinfoil was located, burnt tinfoil was located in the front passenger's side door and inside


