



Chadwick Jetton, 30, Concord Farms Lane Knoxville, was charged with Public Intoxication, Resisting Arrest, and Criminal Littering.

Deputy Bengel LCSO, along with Cpl. Gray, were working security at the Tiki Hut/Calhoun's in Lenoir City. During the evening Cpl. Gray and Deputy observed the Offender, later identified

as Chadwick Jetton, consuming multiple alcoholic beverages. It was later determined that Jetton was at the Tiki Hut with his young daughter (approximately 3-4 years old). After witnessing Jetton consume multiple alcoholic beverages, he became severely intoxicated. Jetton was seen stumbling around, heard slurring his words, and almost falling several times. Jetton made his way to the

volleyball court next to the restaurant and began to roll around in the sand with his daughter. Countless patrons and employees came to Cpl. 

#### Assault

Jason Broyles, 51, D Street Lenoir City, was charged with Assault, and Resisting Arrest.

Officers with the Lenoir City Police Dept. were dispatched to D St for a disturbance related call. A male called 911 and stated that he had a female at his house and that she was "acting stupid" and when asked if it was medical related the male stated to dispatchers that "he wasn't a doctor". Upon arrival Officers spoke with a female/ victim who was bleeding from her hand and told officers that her Husband (Jason Broyles) had locked her out of the house during an argument, and when she tried to get back inside knocked to hard on one of the doors glass panes causing it to break and cut her hand. At that time she stated that Jason reached through the opening and grabbed her by the hair and pulled her head to the door. Officers did notice the victims hair to be bunched up in the front as if it had been pulled. Contact was made with Jason who was hostile towards officers, not wanting to cooperate other than stating his wife was stupid and he "didn't put hands on her" He stated that she wanted to go out with a friend, which caused an argument between the two and locked her out of the house when she went outside and that she did break the pane when trying to get back in. Jason appeared to be intoxicated and admitted to officers that he had drank 5 or more beers. Officers determined Jason to be a primary aggressor and was asked to step outside to be placed in custody due to a large dog being in the house and refused to do so. Officers attempted to place Jason in custody and resisted causing officers to sween senarate, cook, and chill,

kick his legs into a controlled fall onto the ground and officers were able to get cuffs on without further incident. Both children of the couple were present at the time but stated that they did not witness the incident occur between their parents. The victim refused medical treatment and the male was transported by Officer Eldridge to the Loudon Co Jail.
