



Gary Bivens, 46, West 3rd Ave Lenoir City, was charged with DUI, Violation of Implied Consent, Simple Possession, and Possession of Handgun while Under the Influence.

Officer Law LCPD, was dispatched to an Assault at West 3rd Ave. The complainant/victim stated her best friends husband "Gary Bivens", just physically assaulted her and was leaving the property in his GMC Sierra. Officer Ethan Carroll was in the area of H Street, when he observed a vehicle matching the description. Officer Carroll then conducted a traffic stop on a Silver GMC Sierra 1500 (TN Tag BCD-1903) and identified the driver to be Mark Bivens. Upon speaking with Mr. Bivens, Officer Carroll observed a strong odor of an alcoholic beverage omitting from his persons as well as blood shot waterv eyes

and dilated pupils. When Mr. Bivens exited the vehicle, an open container was observed in the door of the truck. Officer Law, arrived on scene and requested SFST on Mr. Bivens, Mr. Bivens did consent. While conducting SFST. Mr. Bivens did perform poorly on HGH, due to the totality of circumstances Mr. Bivens was placed under arrest. After placing Mr. Bivens under arrest, Officer located .24 grams of a white powdery substance that Mr. Bivens stated was cocaine located in his cigarette pack. Also located in the vehicle was Hi-Point 9mm C9 (P1611014) in the center console, and a Black Smith and Wesson Rifle (SP92554) located underneath the backseat. Mr. Bivens was then read the Tennessee Implied Consent in which he refused to a blood draw, as well as refused in signing the Implied Consent. Mr. Bivens was then transported to the Loudon County Jail without incident.



Catalino Saucedo-Figueroa, 45, Homeless Lenoir City, was charged with Criminal Trespass.

Officers with the Lenoir City Police Dept. were conducting a property check on West Broadway, a property that has been condemned by the City of Lenoir City due to unfit living conditions. Upon arrival, officers observed a male, identified as 62 year old Norman Gilreath, at the back porch of the residence. While speaking with Mr. Gilreath, a female, identified as 30 year old Ashley Munsey, was seen sitting by a shed near the back porch of the residence. Both parties were then placed into custody. Officers asked if there were any other individuals inside of the residence to which Ms. Munsey informed officers there was a hispanic male sleeping inside the house. Officers preformed a search of the building and located a male, identified as 45 year old Catalino Saucedo-Figueroa, asleep inside a bedroom of the residence. Mr. Saucedo-Figueroa was then placed into custody and removed from the residence. Mr. Gilreath has been allowed to be at the residence, during daylight hours, to remodel the house, however, when Mr. Gilreath was located it

was not daylight. Mr. Gilreath was also informed that no other person was to be at the residence. The residence is clearly posted stating of the unfit nature of the house and states no one is to be there. All three subjects were subsequently arrest and transported to Loudon County Jail without incident. The above did occur in Lenoir City, Loudon County, Tennessee.

This case was brought as part of Project Safe Childhood PSC), a nationwide initiative to combat the growing epidemic of child sexual exploitation and abuse launched in May 2006 by the Department of Justice. Led by U.S. Attor-neys' Offices and the Criminal Division's Child Exploitation and Obscenity Section, PSC marshals federal, state and local resources to better locate, apprehend and prosecute individuals who exploit children via the Internet, as well as to identify and rescue victims. 




