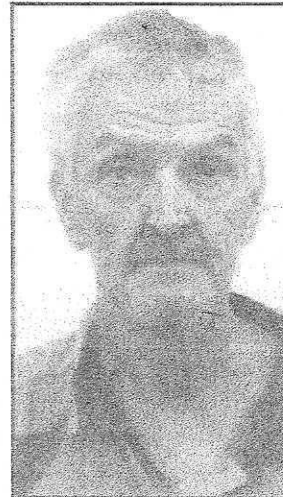

Former Local Attorney Sentenced to Life Plus 120 Months For Child Exploitation Crimes

The Honorable Thomas A. Varlan, United States District Judge for the Eastern District of Tennessee, sentenced Kent Lowery Booher, 67, of Harriman, Tennessee, to serve life plus 120 months in federal prison on child exploitation charges.

Booher, a disbarred criminal defense attorney and prior sex offender, was found guilty of child exploitation crimes by a federal jury in April 2021 in

violation of 18 U.S.C. §§ 2422(b), 2260A, 1591(a)(1), (b)(2), and 2251. Booher will also be ordered to pay restitution in an amount to be determined by the court at a later date.

According to the evidence presented at trial, Booher used a telephone, as well as Facebook and other electronic messaging platforms to communicate with an undercover officer that he thought was a 14-year-old girl. Over a five-day peri-

od, Booher engaged in sexually explicit communications with an officer that he believed to be minor. Booher arranged to meet the minor in person, at which time Booher was arrested by agents of the 9th Judicial District Attorney's Office and the Harriman Police Department. Additionally, at trial the jury convicted Booher of charges pertaining

Victor Garcia-Tellon, 36, Manhattan Ave Oak Ridge, was charged with, Child Abuse or Neglect/Endangerment, DUI, Violation of Implied Consent, Reckless Endangerment, Contributing to the Delinquency of a Minor, Driving without a Valid License, and Financial Responsibility.

Deputy Harrison LCSO, was dispatched to the area

of Highway 444 and Highway 321 in reference to a reckless driver. The complainant stated a white utility van with a ladder rack occupied by four males was in the opposite lane of travel heading towards Highway 11 on Highway 321. Deputy made contact with the vehicle on Highway 321 as it was making a right turn on Highway 11 towards the Red Top Market. Deputy conducted a traffic stop on the vehicle

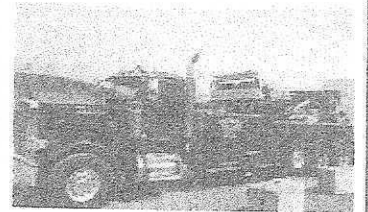

ing SFSTs on Garcia, Deputy Jenkins, and Cpl. Anderson made contact with the front seat passenger, 17yr old who was highly intoxicated as well. Juvenile exhibited bloodshot watery eyes, slurred speech, and was un-

steady on his feet. There was damage to the front of the van and when asked the back seat passenger stated the damage occurred somewhere on Highway 44 where Garcia ran the vehicle off the roadway and struck an object. Based on the totality of the circumstances,

Deputy placed Victor Garcia in custody, and Sgt. Espinoza arrived on scene to translate implied consent to which Garcia refused all tests. Loudon County Dispatched confirmed he did not have a valid license as well. Malones Wrecker service

arrived and towed the vehicle. Juvenile was released on scene to a family member and Deputy transported Victor Garcia to the Loudon County Jail without incident.

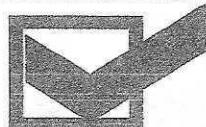

Gary Bivens, 46, West 3rd Ave Lenoir City, was charged with DUI, Violation of Implied Consent, Simple Possession, and Possession of Handgun while Under the Influence.

Officer Law LCPD, was dispatched to an Assault at West 3rd Ave. The complainant/victim stated her best friends husband "Gary Bivens", just physically assaulted her and was leaving the property in his GMC Sierra. Officer Ethan Carroll was in the area of H Street, when he observed a vehicle matching the description. Officer Carroll then conducted a traffic stop on a Silver GMC Sierra 1500 (TN Tag BCD-1903) and identified the driver to be Mark Bivens. Upon speaking with Mr. Bivens, Officer Carroll observed a strong odor of an alcoholic beverage omitting from his persons as well as blood shot watery eyes


and dilated pupils. When Mr. Bivens exited the vehicle, an open container was observed in the door of the truck. Officer Law, arrived on scene and requested SFST on Mr. Bivens, Mr. Bivens did consent. While conducting SFST, Mr. Bivens did perform poorly on HGH, due to the totality of circumstances Mr. Bivens was placed under arrest. After placing Mr. Bivens under arrest, Officer located .24 grams of a white powdery substance that Mr. Bivens stated was cocaine located in his cigarette pack. Also located in the vehicle was Hi-Point 9mm C9 (P1611014) in the center console, and a Black Smith and Wesson Rifle (SP92554) located underneath the backseat. Mr. Bivens was then read the Tennessee Implied Consent in which he refused to a blood draw, as well as refused in signing the Implied Consent. Mr. Bivens was then transported to the Loudon County Jail without incident.

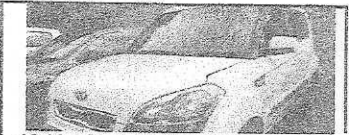

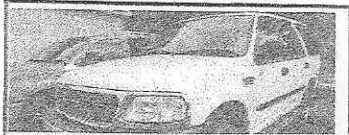

Ashley Munsey, 30, Homeless Lenoir City, was charged with Criminal Trespass.

Catalino Saucedo-Figueroa, 45, Homeless Lenoir City, was charged with Criminal Trespass.

Officers with the Lenoir City Police Dept. were conducting a property check on West Broadway, a property that has been condemned by the City of Lenoir City due to unfit living conditions. Upon arrival, officers observed a male, identified as 62 year old Norman Gilreath, at the back porch of the residence. While speaking with Mr. Gilreath, a female, identified as 30 year old Ashley Munsey, was seen sitting by a shed near the back porch of the residence. Both parties were then placed into custody. Officers asked if there were any other individuals inside of the residence to which Ms. Munsey informed officers there was a hispanic male sleeping inside the house. Officers performed a search of the building and located a male, identified as 45 year old Catalino Saucedo-Figueroa, asleep inside a bedroom of the residence. Mr. Saucedo-Figueroa was then placed into custody and removed from the residence. Mr. Gilreath has been allowed to be at the residence, during daylight hours, to remodel the house, however, when Mr. Gilreath was located it

was not daylight. Mr. Gilreath was also informed that no other person was to be at the residence. The residence is clearly posted stating of the unfit nature of the house and states no one is to be there. All three subjects were subsequently arrest and transported to Loudon County Jail without incident. The above did occur in Lenoir City, Loudon County, Tennessee.

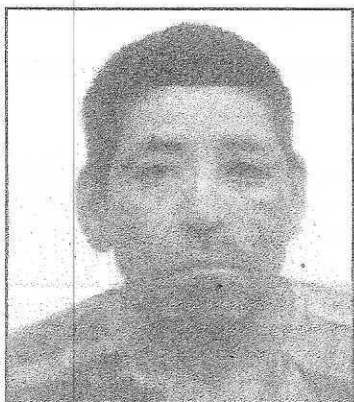

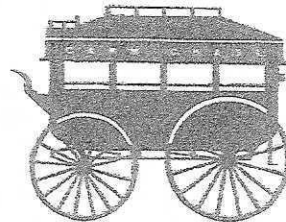
Assistant U.S. Attorneys Jennifer Kolman and Frank M. Dale, Jr. represented the United States at trial.
