A second incident of missing money also occurred which prompted an audit of the property and evidence rooms on October 19. 2020. Sharp did not show for work the day of the audit, and his employment was officially terminated on October 22, 2020.

Based upon this investigation, in August 2022, Steven Sharp was indicted by the Shelby County Grand Jury on one count of theft over \$2.500 and one count of official misconduct.

"Offices that maintain evidence must conduct periodic inventories to ensure that all

property is safeguarded," said Comptroller Mumpower. "It's also necessary to establish strong internal controls that help eliminate occasions when one person is left unattended with important and valuable assets."
