



Deputy Parks LCSO, observed a silver Nissan Altima traveling on Highway 70 west with the passenger not wearing his seatbelt. When the vehicle passed Deputy position the passenger's head snapped toward Deputy and his mouth dropped open.

Deputy initiated a traffic stop on the vehicle at 408 Highway 70 West and approached the vehicle from the passenger's side. Deputy made contact with the passenger, Mr. Eric Gann, and the driver, Ms. Tera Love, and advised them of the reason for the stop. While talking with the occupants Ms. Love began smoking a cigarette. Mr. Gann provided his social security number for identification due to his license being suspended. Deputy asked Ms. Love if she had her license on her person and she presented it to him.

Deputy advised dispatch to conduct a warrant check of the two individuals and approached their vehicle once again. When asked if there were any illegal narcotics in the vehicle, Mr. Gann broke eye contact and began staring at the floor.

Ms. Love advised there was nothing illegal in the vehicle and advised she did not consent to a search when asked. Deputy then called for a K9 to respond to his location for an open air sniff. While waiting for the K9 to respond dispatch advised there was an active Order of Protection out of Roane County by Ms. Love against Mr. Gann (06/24/2022-10/05/2022).

The report further noted. Deputy asked Mr. Gann to step out of the vehicle and placed him under arrest. K9 Deputy Jenkins arrived on scene and Ms. Love was asked to exit the vehicle. Deputy Jenkins deployed his K9 on the vehicle and the K9 positively alerted on the vehicle. During the search of the vehicle, deputies on scene located a meth pipe, loaded marijuana bowl, and a snort straw in a bag on the middle console.

Both occupants denied possession of the paraphernalia, therefore both were charged. Due top Ms. Love's history of failing to appear in court she was placed under arrest. The evidence was seized and bagged on scene. The vehicle was then inventoried and towed from the scene by Malones Wrecker Service. Both subjects were transported to the Loudon County Justice Center without incident. The drug paraphemalia was placed into evidence.

All of the above occurred in Loudon County, Tennessee.



sets at his personal residence, without proper authorization and any legitimate purpose.

Under the former chief's oversight, two of town's electric utility carts were left at a repair shop for at least two years.

Some town assets and \$900 from a trailer sold at auction could not be found or could not be verified as

being received.

Investigators have also questioned whether the former chief fully complied with the requirements of the Law Enforcement Support Office (LESO) and the Federal Surplus Personal Property Donation Program (FSPPDP) – programs he used to purchase assets on behalf of the town.

Additionally, investigators reported that a town alderman, who was also a part-time employee of the town's street department, used the town's lawnmower for his personal use and retained the town's bush hog at his personal residence.

Furthermore, the town recorder improperly paid at least four duplicate invoices, and paid an invoice for items the town never received.

Investigators have also raised questions about a bull-dozer that the town attempted to sell at public auction. Although the bulldozer sold at auction for a total cost of \$50,893.75, the high bidder

was unable to pay, and the sale was cancelled. The next month, the bulldozer was solder to the former Hardeman County mayor for a total cost of \$35,000. Although the mayor claimed to be the second highest bidder at the initial auction, investigators could not substantiate this information, and therefore question if the bulldozer was sold through proper bidding procedures at the highest possible price.

The results of this investigation were communicated to the Office of the District Attorney General of the 25th

Judicial District.

"The Town of Toone's annual audits have disclosed problems with the town's handling of LESO and FSP-PDP assets since at least fiscal year 2015. The town has failed to correct these issues," said Comptroller Jason Mumpower. "This investigative report should serve as the final catalyst for the town board to improve its oversight and implement policies that protect taxpayer dollars and resources...


