Former White County Chief Deputy Clerk Stole More Than \$12,000

An investigation by the Tennessee Comptroller's Office has resulted in the indictment of Laura Gardner, the former Chief Deputy Clerk in the White County Clerk's office. The office's daily operations include registering vehicles, issuing vehicle tags and titles, renewing vehicle tags, and collecting vehicle sales tax.

A began after auditors from the Comptroller's division of Local Government Audit uncovered questionable deleted transactions.

Investigators subsequently determined that Gardner stole at least \$12,312.60 by improperly deleting 64 transactions from the clerk office's accounting software. These deletions gave the false impression that the

money was never collected by the clerk's office.

By voiding the cash and check transactions, Gardner was able to remove money from the office's daily collections and use it for her personal expenses. In a statement given to investigators, Gardner admitted to her scheme.

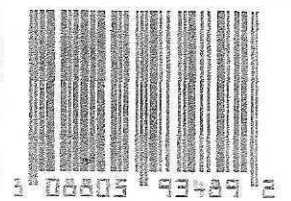
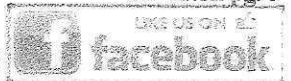

Esaias Chrisco, 19, Barkwood Road Knoxville, was charged with Man/Sell/Del/Resale Sch. VI, Driving on Revoked/Suspended License, and Possession of a Firearm.

Officer J. Ketner LCPD, ran the Tennessee registration 9Z03W9 that came back on a white Nissan Altima. The Criminal Justice Portal showed that the driver, Es-

ai'as Quadre Chrisco, was suspended. Officer stopped and identified the driver as Mr. Chirsco and the passenger. While Officer was speaking with Mr. Chrisco he could smell an odor of marijuana coming from the vehicle. Officer asked Mr. Chrisco to step out of the vehicle. When Officer asked him about the marijuana he got nervous and stated that he may have a couple of "nug-

gets" (marijuana) under the seat. He also stated that him and the passenger "smoke" (marijuana). A search of the vehicle was conducted. Six (6) individual bags of marijuana (61.3 grams), one set of digital scales (with residue) and one Glock 23 40 cal. with one full magazine in the gun and one loaded

magazine were located inside a backpack in the back floorboard. Mr. Chrisco claimed ownership of the items. He stated that the gun was for protection and the marijuana was personal use. Mr. Chrisco was transported to the Loudon County Jail.

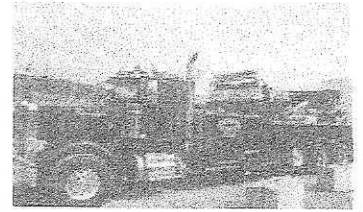

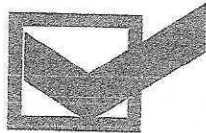

John Lambert, 60, Rex Lane Friendsville, was charged with Driving on Roadways Laned for Traffic, Poss. Of Drug Para., Simple Possession, and Mfg/Del/Sale or Poss. Of Meth.

Pamela Mullins, 62, High Ridge Road Kingston, was charged with Poss. Of Drug Para.


Deputy Clay Jenkins LCSO, conducted a traffic stop on a red Ford Ranger TN registration 092BFFQ at the intersection of Old Midway Rd and Shaw Ferry Rd due to vehicle failing to maintain the lane of travel. Deputy then made contact with driver John Lambert and passenger Pamela Mullins. While speaking to Mr. Lambert Deputy asked him to empty his pockets in which

he pulled a clear glass pipe used to smoke crack cocaine out of his right pocket. After a probable cause search of the vehicle, Deputy then located 1 glass crack cocaine pipe in a bag belonging to passenger Pamela Mullins. In the bed of the truck in a bag belonging to Mr. Lambert Deputy then found a glasses case which contained 2 more glass cocaine pipes. In the same bag inside of a Tito's vodka sock, Deputy then found 2 separate baggies of a crystal like substance (meth) weighing approx. 1.1 grams and 1 baggy contained a grayish powder (fentanyl) weighing approx. 0.5 gram. Both were then taken into custody and transported to the Loudon County Jail by Deputy Flemming. Lt. Ezell 937 then tested the

crystal like substances with the TruNarc which then tested positive for Methamphetamine (scan #1688) and tested the grayish powder which tested positive for Fentanyl (scan #1689). All of this did occur in Loudon County, TN.

Brittany Williams, 23, Paint Rock Creek Road Philadelphia, was charged with Domestic Assault x2, Vandalism, Theft of Property, and Poss. of Drug Para.

Deputy Bengel LCSO, responded to Browder Hollow Rd for a Domestic Assault that occurred on Foster Rd. Deputy located the Offender, Britney Williams, walking in the 1300 block of Browder Hollow. Williams gave Deputy a verbal and written statement, within both she included that she hit her boyfriend, the Victim, when he tried to stop her from taking his phone.

Williams made a spontaneous utterance stating she damaged victim windshield and then, "but he has forgiven me for that and we slept together yesterday". Deputy asked Williams for her ID, opened her wallet and Deputy could smell a strong odor of Marijuana coming from her wallet and when she reached into her wallet and handed him her ID, it had a green leafy substance that Deputy believed to be Marijuana. Sgt. Smith made contact with victim on Browder Hollow, close to the original scene and notified Deputy that Williams was supposed to have possession of victim phone. Deputy asked Williams if she had victim's phone and she said "yes, but its not his, its his mom's and he didn't pay the bill".

Deputy asked Williams if she had any Marijuana on her and she said no, handed me her wallet and gave unsolicited consent to search it. Deputy opened the wallet and found 2 Marijuana cigarettes inside. Victim said that Williams' accused him of being unfaithful and wanted to go through the phone. Williams snatched victims phone and he attempted to take it back. Williams punched victim in the face, got out of the car, and fled the scene on foot

with victims phone. The victim without a phone and his 2 toddlers in the car, flagged down a passerby and called 911. Victim also had a video documenting a Domestic and Vandalism that occurred on 8/21/22 on Hwy 72 in front of McDonalds. Williams had kicked out the windshield of victim car as they were driving down the Hwy and after a short time she hit victim, knocking his phone out of his hand.

Williams is being charged with Domestic X2, Theft, Vandalism and Drug Paraphernalia. Said events occurred in Loudon County, TN.

Clerk

By deleting transactions from the office's accounting software, vehicle tag and registration renewals were never reported to the Tennessee Department of Revenue. This potentially exposed affected motorists to vehicle registration violations.

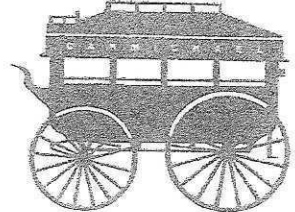
Gardner's employment was terminated on June 21, 2019 by the White County Clerk when the malfeasance was discovered.

Based upon this investigation, in August 2022, the White County Grand Jury indicted Laura Ann Gardner on one count of theft over \$10,000, and one count of violation of the computer act.

"The White County Clerk must routinely review the office's accounting software logs to be sure that all deletions and changes are appropriate," said Comptroller Jason Mumpower. "By not questioning this activity, the former chief deputy clerk was able to divert funds from 2014 through 2019 without detection."
