FBI Jacksonville's Historic Search for Justice

Effort underscores the Bureau's unwavering commitment to justice for victims

Five years ago, a murder victim's story was buried under 7,200 tons of landfill debris. In January 2020, the FBI's Jacksonville Evidence Response Team (ERT) leveraged their scientific expertise, critical partnerships,

and relentless determination to recover the remains of missing Clay County, Florida, woman Susan Mauldin.

This historic case marked the FBI's first successful landfill search for covered re-

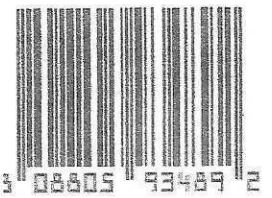

James Campbell, 34, Highland Park Drive Sevierville, was charged with, Mfg/Del/Sale or Poss. of Meth, Poss. of Drug Para., and Violation of Parole.

Nikki Cruze, 39, Highland Park Drive Sevierville, was charged with, Simple Possession, Mfg/Del/Sale or Poss. of Meth, and Poss. of Drug Para.

Officers with the Lenoir City Police Department, responded to the area of Home Depot located at 250 Abbie Drive in Lenoir City, TN in regards to a wanted subject, James Campbell. JAMES was wanted for outstanding warrants out of Knox County, TN and also by the state of Tennessee for a parole violation. While in the area the officer was able to locate a white Ford F150 that JAMES was known to drive parked in the parking lot of the Home Depot. During the time the officer was in the parking lot he visually identified JAMES exiting the front doors of Home Depot where he walked to his truck. As JAMES got into the pickup truck, the officer activated his emergency equipment and conducted a stop on the pickup truck. At this time officers began

giving JAMES verbal commands to step out of the truck. JAMES along with a female passenger who was identified as Nikki Cruze complied with officer's commands and exited the truck where they were detained. Once both subjects were detained a strong odor of marijuana emitting from inside of the truck was noticed. Assisting during the attempt to locate was K9 Inv. C. Gray of the Loudon County Sheriff's Office and his partner K9 Kora. K9 Kora was deployed around the truck to conduct and open-air sniff where the officer was notified that she had positively alerted to an odor of narcotics coming from the truck. A probable cause search of the truck was then conducted where a glasses container located underneath the drives side seat was found. Inside of the glasses container was a glass pipe with a charred bottom along with a plastic green container that contained a crystal-like substance believed to be methamphetamine and which tested positive for methamphetamine using the Tru Narc Drug Analyzer. The approximate weight of the crystal-like substance along with the container that it was contained inside of was (12.15 grams).

Steven Stringer, 24, Country Lane Lenoir City, was charged with Aggravated Assault.

Officers with the Lenoir City Police Department were dispatched to the area of Crisp Road in reference to a possible domestic with firearms involved. Upon arrival officer J. Green, LT. C. Butler, and officer D. Mendez, made contact with the victim at his house of Crisp Rd.

The victim advised them that his ex-girlfriend came to pick up their son from his house when an argument ensued. During the argument he advised her to leave multiple times and that he would just see her in court. He then advised that the girlfriend new boyfriend Steven Stringer came to get the boy and place him in the car.

After doing so a slight altercation ensued with both men shoving each other and then Mr. Stringer pulled a handgun from his waistband and pointed it at the victim's face. The victim then stepped

backwards opening his car's side door, grabbing a rifle but never pointed it at him. Officers then asked if they could see the video camera footage to which he agreed, and they could see the incident take place. What the victim stated did occur word for word on the camera footage. Officers then Located the other party at the Silver Ridge Baptist Church where they detained Steven Stringer and another male.

The officer then arrived at the church and showed LT. Butler the video to confirm. Mr. Stringer was then placed into custody and transported to the Loudon County Jail, while enroute to the jail Mr. Stringer advised the officer that the victim was placing his hands on the girlfriend and that the camera could not see it, and he only pulled his gun out in self defense to which the officer advised him that he approached the victim not the other way around. Mr. Stringer was then transported to the Loudon County Jail without further incident.

All the above did occur in Loudon County, Tennessee.

Jake Smith, 25, Eat Highway 11 Lenoir City, was charged with, DUI, Violation of Implied Consent, and Lights required on Motor Vehicle

Deputy Owens LCSO, observed a Blue Cadillac pass him with its left headlight not operating. The deputy pulled out behind the vehicle as he was preparing to stop the car. While observing the vehicle, the deputy saw the car swerve to the right of the road, causing the car's tire to blow out. The vehicle then swerved back onto the road. The deputy conducted a traffic stop on the car bearing TN registration 359-BNJT on Highway 11 E at Garnet Hill Drive. When the vehicle came to a stop, the driver immediately exited the car. I ordered the driver to get back inside the vehicle. I had to order the driver to get back inside multiple times. I made contact with the driver, who was identified as Jakeb Smith. The deputy asked Smith if he had anything to drink due to his erratic driving,

and he initially said he did not have anything to drink. The deputy got Jakeb out of the vehicle and proceeded with his investigation. While speaking with Jakeb, the deputy could smell the odor of an alcoholic beverage emitting from his person. The deputy asked Jakeb again if he had been drinking due to what he was smelling, and he said he had one beer with some co-workers approximately four hours prior. Jakeb later stated he had a couple of beers with family earlier in the day. The deputy asked Jakeb if he would consent to complete standardized field sobriety testing, and he agreed to perform them. Nystagmus was observed in both of Jakeb's eyes, and he performed poorly on the walk and turn and the one-leg stand. An implied consent form was read to Jake, and he agreed to give a breath sample. Jake was transported to the Loudon County Jail, where the breath test was attempted. Jakeb intentionally blew into the intoximeter with little to no force, which caused

insufficient samples. The deputy demonstrated with his hand to Jakeb how to correctly blow into the intoximeter. After doing so, he still failed to blow correctly with the force necessary to get accurate results. Jakeb's results returned

as an insufficient sample. Jakeb was then charged with violation of implied consent. Jakeb's car was towed by Malone's Wrecker Service due to his arrest. All of the above did occur in Loudon County, Tennessee.

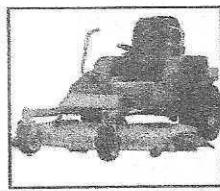

mains and underscores the Bureau's unwavering commitment to justice for victims, said FBI Special Agent Lauren Regucci, senior lead of the Jacksonville Evidence Response Team.

On October 25, 2019, Florida's Clay County Sheriff's Office responded to a missing person's report for 65-year-old Mauldin. Her friend told investigators that Mauldin had recently argued with her contractor, Corey Binderim, over an unfinished bathroom remodel and a

\$12,000 payment.

Binderim, who was named a person of interest, confirmed the dispute but claimed he gave Mauldin a \$1,200 check on October 24. Surveillance footage and further investigation revealed key details: Binderim purchased contractor bags and concrete that morning, visited Mauldin's home at 8:00 a.m., and, by 9:20 a.m., had disposed of 300 pounds of waste at a local waste facility, which was later transferred to a landfill in Georgia.

Critical collaboration

The timing was critical,

said FBI Special Agent William Logan. Four days after Mauldin went missing, Clay County investigators recognized the complex scale of the case and reached out to the FBI for help. They understood early on that both Bureau personnel and the specialized expertise of the FBI's Evidence Response Team and Laboratory assets including the Technical Hazards Response Unit would be necessary in what was about to become a massive, multi-agency effort.

"This rapid response was made possible by the incred-

ibly quick, professional, and thorough work of the Clay County Sheriff's Office Robbery Homicide Unit," said Logan. "Their efforts allowed us to confidently report to FBI executive management that Mauldin's body was likely in the landfill, and that we would find her."

Investigators identified and sectioned off an area about the size of a baseball diamond with depths that ranged from four feet to 25 feet—within the nearly 1,000-acre Chesser Island Road Landfill

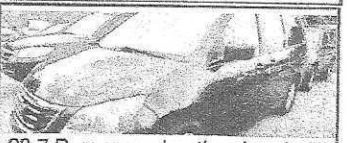

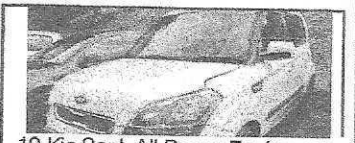

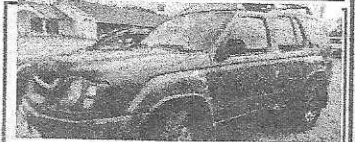

in southeast Georgia, where they believed Mauldin's remains were located.

After months of meticulous planning and collaboration with local law enforcement and waste management officials, the FBI Evidence Response Team, led by FBI Jacksonville and supported by members of the Clay County Sheriff's Office, the State Attorney's Office Investigators, and FBI Jacksonville Task Force Officers, launched a grueling, physically demanding search in

January 2020.

Regucci explained FBI Jacksonville had done a similar landfill search for human remains in 2018 and were able to lean on what they had just learned, as well as their strong relationships.

But for Regucci and the team, the mission was about more than just recovering human remains—it was about ensuring that Mauldin, a widow from the United Kingdom with no family to advocate for her, received the justice she deserved.

the power tools were not his. At this point Mr. Lazenby was detained and read Miranda pending further investigation. Officers then brought the homeowner to the scene to identify his belongings. The victim was able to positively confirm possession of the power tools, household goods, collectible cards, and other various items that were within Mr. Lazenby's possession. Due to the totality of the circumstances, Clayton Lazenby was charged with Theft of Property and transported to the Loudon County Jail without further incident.

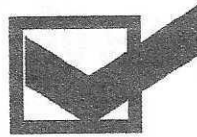

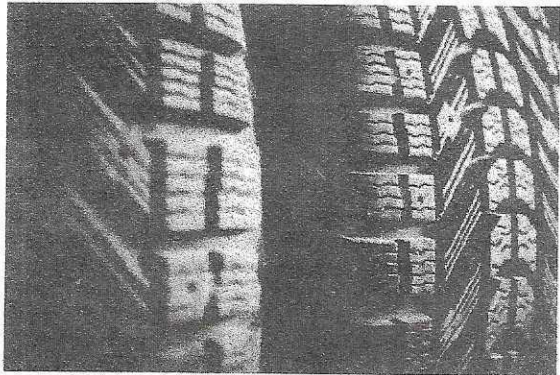

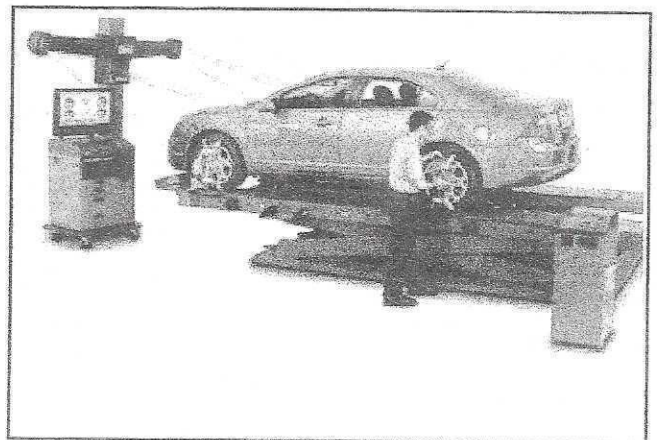
