FBI Investigation Leads to Historic Hate Crime Sentencing



In a landmark hate crime case, a trial jury found Daqua Lameek Ritter guilty in the 2019 murder of Dime Doe, a Black transgender woman. Ritter was sentenced to life in prison on hate crime, firearms, and obstruction charges.

crimes, where individuals are targeted with violence due to their protected characteristics," said Supervisory Special Agent Anthony Sneed, Jr., of the FBI's Civil Rights Unit. "We want to stress to these communities that the FBI is listening. We hear you, we stand with you, and we will use every resource we have to seek justice for victims, their families, and all communities."

Evidence presented at trial, including messages sent over text and social media, showed Ritter was upset over rumors about his sexual relationship with Dime Doe. On August 4, 2019, Ritter lured Doe to a remote area in Allendale, South Carolina, and shot her three times in the head. Ritter then

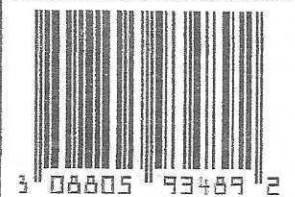

Scammer

Loudon County Sheriff's Office Detectives and Deputies arrested Valerie Soki Hangi, from Quebec Canada, on Thursday, October 17th 2024. Hangi took part in scamming at least \$60,000 in cash from three separate victims between Loudon and Monroe Counties.

LCSO has received multiple calls about a new scam that is currently targeting grandparents.

The scammer will call, act as if they are the grandchild of the victim, and convince the victim that they (the supposed grandchild) have been arrested and need mon-

ey for bail. The scammer is even using the same nicknames that the grandchild would call the grandparent (Grandpa, Mamaw, ect.) that helps further convince the victim that they are actually the victim's grandchild. The scammer then puts their "attorney" on the phone with the victim for them to give information about the "case" that the supposed grandchild was involved in.

After convincing the unsuspecting victim to withdraw cash, the scammer sets up a time to have a courier (in this particular case, the courier was Valerie Hangi) drive to the victim's home and pick up the large sum of cash. Un-

fortunately, the reports that the Loudon County Sheriff's Office and the Monroe County Sheriff's Office have taken were for \$20,000 each.

Valerie Soki Hangi was arrested yesterday from a traffic stop while on her way to make another \$20,000 cash pickup. Inside the maroon Kia Forte, Hangi was driving, was a large sum of money that is consistent with the amounts and denominations scamed from the victims. Hangi and the Kia Forte she was driving were identified by the victims in these cases.

During this investigation, it was learned that Hangi flew into Nashville Interna-

tional Airport on Monday, October 14th, 2024. Hangi began making cash pickups as early as Tuesday, October 15th, and continued making cash pickups until she was arrested on Thursday, October 17th.

LCSO is confident that there are more victims that have been scammed by Valerie Hangi. If you or anyone you know were scammed by Hangi, please call our non emergency dispatch at 865-458-9081. The cases referenced in this release took place in the Tellico Village Community.

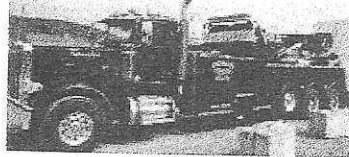

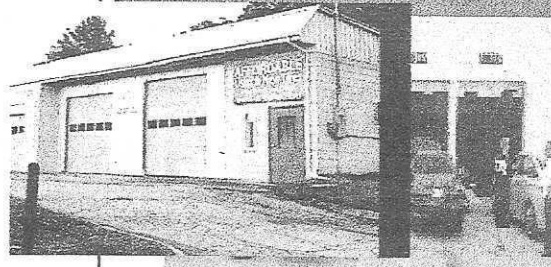

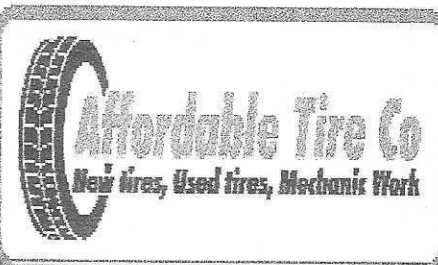

Charged

Tavon Crawford, 31, Galyon Drive Lenoir City, was charged with Domestic Assault.

Deputy Brockwell LCSO, arrived at Galyon Drive for a domestic. The deputy spoke with the victim, about what occurred. The victim stated that her boyfriend Tavon Crawford, the offender, came to her house intoxicated and kicked her door in. When he got inside the house, she confronted him and that is when he started striking her in the head and then left the residence. This is all the information that the victim could provide. The deputy then asked the victim if she had received any injuries, and she stated that the right side of her face was hurting. The victim had a red mark across the right side of her face that was starting to swell. The deputy asked the victim if she needed any

medical attention, but she refused. Crawford was trespassed from the residence, and the deputy explained to the victim the process to get an Order of Protection against Crawford. Warrants are being filed on Tavon Crawford for Domestic Assault. This did happen in Loudon County, TN without further incident.

Deputy Brockwell and Cpl. Wallen observed the offender, Tavon Crawford, get into a black Lexus sedan. This vehicle was described to us by the victim in a domestic case (case #20241030813) to be driven by the offender who had an active warrant out of Loudon County, TN for domestic assault. Cpl. Wallen and Brockwell initiated a traffic stop on this vehicle leaving the residence at the intersection of Galyon Drive and Highway 11. They made contact with Tavon Crawford and placed him under arrest

for the active warrant. His vehicle was driven from the scene by a family member, and Crawford was transported to the Loudon County Detention Facility. This did happen in Loudon County, TN without further incident.

FBI

burned the clothes he was wearing, disposed of the murder weapon, and repeatedly lied to law enforcement.

At trial, the government proved beyond a reasonable doubt that Ritter murdered Doe because of her gender identity. "In this case, the jury's verdict appeared to indicate that 'but for' the fact that Doe was transgender, the defendant would not have killed her," said an FBI Columbia lead case agent.

This historic case marks the first time a defendant has been found guilty by trial verdict for a hate crime motivated by gender identity

under the Matthew Shepard and James Byrd, Jr., Hate Crimes Prevention Act. Passed in 2009, the Shepard-Byrd Act allows federal criminal prosecution of hate crimes motivated by the victim's actual or perceived sexual orientation or gender identity.

"The Shepard-Byrd Act gives the FBI the authority to investigate crimes like this, and that's vital," said Snead. "Just 15 years ago, we did not have the authority to investigate this horrific act of violence."

Why the FBI investigates hate crimes

The FBI is the primary federal agency responsible for investigating possible violations of federal civil rights statutes. Since its earliest days, the FBI has helped protect the civil rights of the American people, and that remains one of the Bureau's

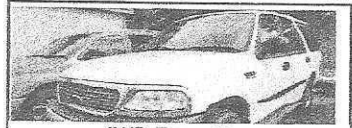

top priorities.

Federal civil rights violations fall into several categories, including hate crimes. Hate crimes are not only an attack on the victim, but they also threaten and intimidate an entire community.

"It is crucial for the FBI to share information to the public on what a hate crime is and how to get help should a member of the public find themselves a victim of a hate crime or a witness to one," said Snead. "Hate crimes are severely underreported due in part to the public's lack of awareness of what constitutes a federal hate crime."

At the federal level, a hate crime is defined as a criminal offense—like murder, arson, or vandalism—motivated in whole or in part by the offender's bias against a race, religion, disability, ethnic or national origin, sexual

orientation, gender, or gender identity. The crime must have been committed because of the protected class; a subject does not have to "hate" the victim or the victim's protected class to be charged or convicted.

"This case is a testament to years of hard work and our prioritization of civil rights investigations, to include hate crimes, where individuals are targeted with violence due to their protected characteristics."

How the FBI investigates hate crimes

Using all its investigative and intelligence capabilities, the Bureau works closely with its partners to prevent and address hate crimes. The FBI has also established and maintains relationships with state and local law enforcement agencies, prosecutors,

non-governmental organizations, and community groups. Together, the FBI and its partners work to improve the reporting of hate crimes, promote the benefits of sharing information and intelligence, and help prevent bias-motivated acts of violence.

The FBI Columbia Field Office investigated the case against Ritter with the assistance of the South Carolina Law Enforcement Division, Allendale County Sheriff's Office, and the Allendale Po-

lice Department. Additionally, the FBI New York Field Office assisted with apprehending Ritter.

The collaborative investigation makes clear the FBI's mission to protect the civil rights of the American people.

"It was a team effort from beginning to end," said the FBI Columbia lead case agent. "Each agency brought its own capabilities, experience, and expertise."
