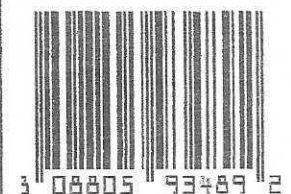
## Potential public health risk among individuals ordering counterfeit prescription medications from online pharmacies

The Centers for Disease Control and Prevention (CDC) is informing public health officials, clinicians, and affected patients, their families, and caregivers about a potential public health risk among individuals ordering what they believe to be prescription medications from online pharmacies. On September 30, 2024, the U.S. Department

of Justice (DOJ) announced an indictment against individuals running illegal online pharmacies. According to the DOJ, these individuals are advertising, selling, manufacturing, and shipping millions of unregulated counterfeit prescription pills to tens of thousands of individuals in the U.S. The counterfeit pills frequently contain fentanyl, a synthetic opioid that is up to 50 times

stronger than heroin and 100 times stronger than morphine, and methamphetamine. Individuals who ordered drugs from these illegal pharmacies could be at risk for an overdose.

The U.S. Food and Drug Administration warns that there are online pharmacies that claim to sell

Carlos Hernandez, 35, Browder Hollow Road Lenoir City, was charged with, DUI, Violation of Implied Consent, Driving Non Resident Revoked/Suspended License, and Financial Responsibility.

Officer Cole LCPD, while on routine patrol within the western patrol zone the officer observed evidence that a vehicle lost control on the west bound lane of Harrison Road. There was property damage consisting of two broken mail boxes and chipped pavement along where the vehicle lost con-

trol indicating a high rate of speed. Furthermore, the vehicle was leaking a significant amount of fluid allowing for officers to locate a direction of travel. Officers located a vehicle at Browder Hallow Road Lot 14 that had significant damage. Officers made contact with Carlos Hernandez-Romero who advised he had been in a wreck tonight on Harrison Road. He admitted to consuming alcohol prior to wrecking the vehicle. Officers observed Mr. Hernandez was unsteady on his feet and performed unsatisfactory on HGN. It was confirmed that Mr. Hernandez

did not have a driver license nor did he have insurance on the vehicle. Mr. Hernandez declined to give a sample of his blood and was explained the legal consequences. Due to the totality of the circumstances, Mr. Hernandez was placed into police custody and charged with DUI; he was transported to the jail without further incident. All of the above did occur in Lenoir City.



prescription drugs at deeply discounted prices, often without requiring a prescription. These internet-based pharmacies often sell unapproved, counterfeit, or otherwise unsafe medicines outside the safeguards followed by licensed pharmacies. Individuals should only take medications prescribed by a licensed healthcare provider and dispensed by a licensed pharmacy.

According to the National Association of Boards of Pharmacy, nearly 95% of websites offering prescription-only drugs online operate illegally.

If you or someone you know has purchased pills from an online pharmacy:

Check to see if the pharmacy is U.S. state-licensed. Locate a State-Licensed Online

Pharmacy | FDA. If you have obtained medications from a pharmacy that is not U.S. state-licensed, do not consume the medication.

If you suspect you have counterfeit pills from an illegal online pharmacy, do not take them. Dispose of them safely. Beware of online pharmacies that:

Do not require a doctor's prescription.

Are not licensed in the U.S. and by your state board of pharmacy.

Offer deep discounts or prices that seem too good to be true.

Always have naloxone, an opioid overdose reversal drug, with you. Naloxone should be given immediately in response to any person who shows signs of an opioid overdose. Always have someone nearby whenever you are ingesting any un-

known substance or medication in case of emergency.

In case of a poisoning emergency, call 911 and seek medical attention immediately.

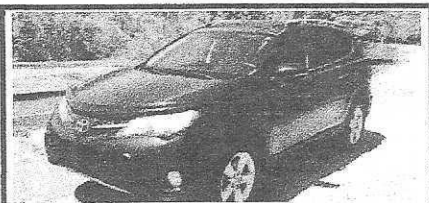

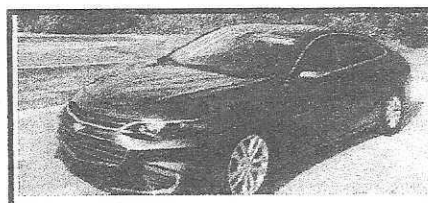

Leonard Leonard M. Franklin (Len) passed away on September 12, 2024 in his 94th year at home in Tellico Village in Loudon, TN. The weekend before his passing he was surrounded by all his family from across the country which he enjoyed immensely. Len was predeceased by his first wife, Eileen (Nelson) who passed away in 2003 after a marriage of 49 years, his sister Catherine Jennings and his brother, Edward Franklin. He is survived by his wife Lynne MacConnell of Webster, NY and Tellico Village, two daughters, Christine Drennon (Hank) and Maureen Gold (Robert), four grandchildren, Patrick and Liza Drennon, Kenna and Shaun Gold. Also a brother in law, John Ringwood of Tellico Village. Len was born in Norwich, NY on April 3, 1930. He graduated from Norwich High School in 1947. He served in the Regular Army for three years, being discharged in 1950 with a rank of Staff Sergeant. He served an additional three years in the Army Reserves. He was in the first graduating class of LeMoyne College, a Jesuit college in Syracuse, NY. He graduated in 1954 with a degree in Business Administration. Len was a long time resident of Webster, NY where he was a charter member of St. Paul's Catholic Church. He worked as a System's Analyst for Xerox Corporation until 1971 and then began a 38 year

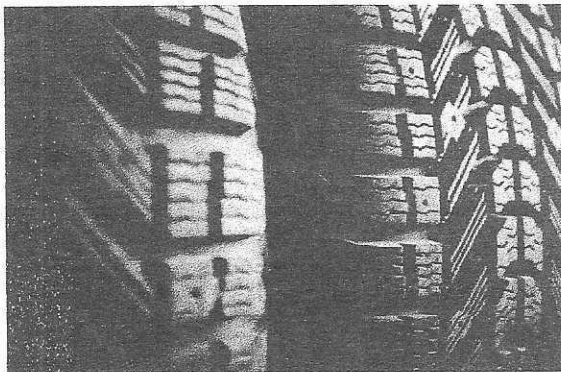

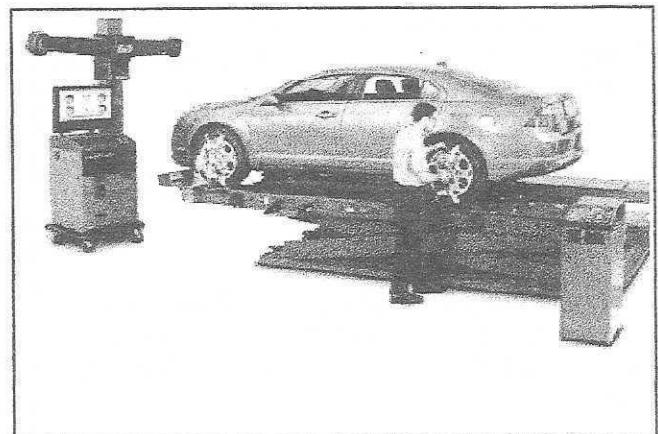
