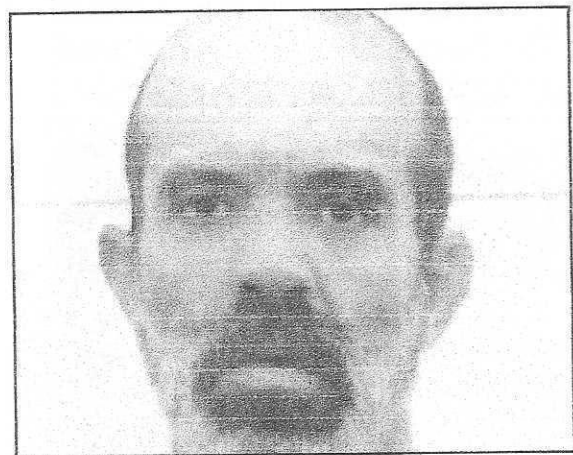

Former Columbia Power & Water Technician Indicted for Theft of Gas

An investigation by the Tennessee Comptroller's Office has resulted in the indictment of Christian Nash, a former broadband technician for Columbia Power and Water Systems (CPWS) in Maury County.

Investigators determined Nash misappropriated at least \$1,905.94 in utility-purchased gas using a CPWS fuel

card.

Nash made 78 unauthorized gas purchases between October 21, 2022 and May, 12, 2024. He used a fellow CPWS employee's fuel card identification number to make these purchases.

On multiple occasions, a local gas station's video surveillance footage showed Nash in possession of

at least two five-gallon cans when he made personal gas purchases. Investigators confirmed with CPWS that Nash had no reason to purchase gasoline since he drove a diesel-powered CPWS truck.

Christian Nash's employment was terminated in May 2024. Based upon this investigation see Theft pg. 5

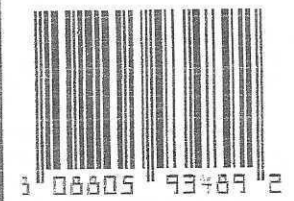
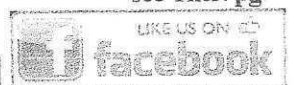

Levone Mcspadden, 34, Chestnut Street Sweetwater, was charged with, Aggravated Assault, and Driving on Revoked/Suspended License.

Deputy Owens LCSO, was dispatched to a domestic at Blue Springs Road. A civilian who was passing by stated she was flagged down by a female who then advised her to call 911 because her boyfriend was assaulting her. Upon arrival, contact was made with the victim and Levone Mcspadden. Upon speaking with the vic-

tim she stated Mcspadden picked her up at a home located in Monroe County and while in the vehicle she said that Mcspadden hit her multiple times. The victim said once on Blue Springs Road Mcspadden stopped the car and started to assault her, she then exited the vehicle and when she did so she was grabbed and slammed to the ground by Mcspadden injuring her shoulder and busting her lip. The victim said Mcspadden then forced her back into the vehicle and he continued to drive the car. The victim said Mcspadden pinned

her down in the passenger seat as he was driving and that led to him running the car into a ditch at Blue Springs Road. The victim then exited the vehicle and began screaming trying to get someone's attention so they would call the police. The victim said she waved down a car and told them to call 911 because she needed help. The victim could not use her right arm due to the injury she sustained from Mcspadden. The victim was evaluated by EMS on scene and the paramedics stated she sustained broken bones along with her shoulder being dislocated, she was

transported to Sweetwater Hospital. Mcspadden was placed under arrest for aggravated domestic assault and transported to the Loudon County Jail without incident. A check of Mcspadden's driver's license showed him to be revoked in the State of Tennessee. Later it was learned that Sweetwater Police Department had issued a BOLO for the vehicle that Mcspadden was driving to check the welfare of the victim. Sweetwater advised they also have charges for Mcspadden. All of the above did occur in Loudon County, Tennessee.

Marty Mills, 42, Homeless Lenoir City, was charged with Criminal Trespassing.

Deputy Reagan LCSO, responded to Hwy 11 E in reference to a suspicious male who was causing a disturbance inside the business. Upon arrival, the deputy made contact with Marty Mills (Arrestee). Dispatch advised that he had been trespassed from the business in October of this year by Deputy McCall. Deputy Curtis and Deputy Brewer stood with Mills outside while the deputy made contact with the complainant. The deputy made contact with complainant inside the store. She stated that Mills continually comes in and out of Redtop Market daily, and while being there, he shouts and makes threats towards people who are not visible to others. She also stated that he also prowls around the back of the store. The deputy went back out to speak with Mills, and he admitted to walking into the store. At that time, the deputy placed Marty in custody. The deputy was approached by an

owner of Hwy 11 Mini Storage and was informed that Mills regularly walks around the storage buildings. They also requested that he be trespassed from their business as well. 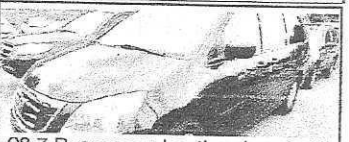

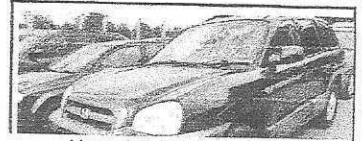

A true bill means there was enough evidence to allow for a trial by jury. A no bill means there was not enough evidence for a case. A resubmittal is a case that has been presented again to the Grand Jury. A continued on bound over means the case will be presented at a later date. A scheduled to plea by information means the defendant intends to plead to the charges they have been given.

There are also sealed indictment which are not contained on the report. Those indictments are not made public until the suspect has been taken into custody and charged with the indictment. All those charged are presumed innocent until proven guilty in court.
