

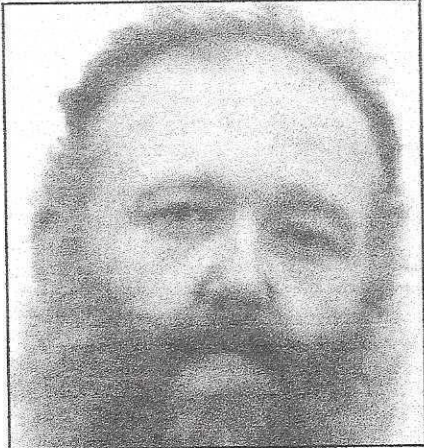

No Seatbelt and Lights Out Gets Driver Stopped

Work Vehicle Used for Uber, Lyft, and Door Dash in Hamilton County

Former Hamilton County Schools Transportation Director Indicted

An investigation by the Tennessee Comptroller's Office has resulted in the indictment of David Eaves, the former transportation manager for Hamilton County Schools. The investigation began after Hamilton County Schools officials reported the problem.

Investigators determined that Eaves used his work-assigned vehicle to per-

form work for commercial food delivery and rideshare services on at least 933 occasions during school work hours. Eaves spent at least 23,914 minutes working on behalf of these services during work hours which is equal to \$18,368.19 of misappropriated salary payments to Eaves.

Investigators discovered that he began misappropriating time to work for commercial

food delivery and ride-share services during Hamilton County Schools' work hours on March 20, 2017, the first day he was employed with Hamilton County Schools.

Eaves admitted to Hamilton County Schools officials that he used his work-assigned vehicle to make commercial food de-

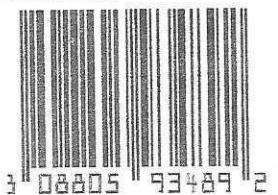

Crystal Brazzell, 41, Old Cemetery Road Madisonville, was charged with Aggravated Criminal Trespass, and Burglary.

Michael Cuel, 39, Summer Street Loudon, was charged with Aggravated Criminal Trespass, Burglary, Poss. of Drug Para., and Mfg/Del/Sale or Poss. of Meth.

Deputy Reagan LCSO, responded to Christensen Inlet in reference to suspicious persons. The complainant/Victim stated that he observed two people on his cameras walking around and entering the storage build-

ing. Upon arrival, the deputy made contact with a Red GMC Sierra (365BGRC). Deputy Brewer arrived on scene, and they attempted to find the opening where people could enter the building. Deputy Brewer drove around the building, and deputy Reagan walked over to the vehicle. While looking at the vehicle, he observed a soft glasses case with a suspected narcotics pipe inside. While searching around the building and looking at the vehicle, Michael Cuel (Arrestee) approached him. While speaking with Cuel, he admitted that he and Crystal Brazzell

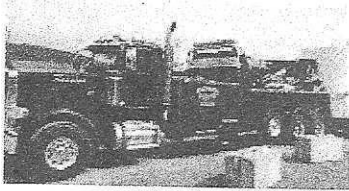
(Arrestee) had driven from Madisonville to the storage building. He stated that they both entered the building through a damaged panel on the left side of the exterior wall. Cuel stated that Crystal was likely still inside the building. When asked about the pipe, Michael stated that he had used methamphetamine earlier on this date. Deputy Brewer and Reagan went over to the side where Cuel stated that they had entered and attempted to make commands for Crystal to exit with no response. At that time, Reagan placed Michael under arrest. Deputy Brewer transported him to the Loudon County Jail. While waiting for James Towing to remove the vehicle, the deputy discovered a white crystal-like substance believed to be meth inside the soft glasses case. The deputy continued to wait for Crystal to return to her vehicle, but she did not. James towing left with the vehicle,

called dispatch, and advised that they observed a female walking down HWY 411 toward Vonore. The deputy left Christensen Inlet to attempt to make contact with her. While driving, the deputy did not see her, but when he circled back, he observed her walking down the road. When the deputy stopped and approached her, she admitted that she heard and saw my vehicle and went over the guard rail and sat down. While speaking with her, she admitted to traveling from Madisonville with Michael. She also admitted to being inside the building and causing damage to get inside. Crystal stated that she did not want to be there, and that is why she left without Michael through the woods. At that time, the deputy placed Crystal into custody and transported her to the Loudon County Jail without further incident. This did happen in Loudon County, TN.

Deputy Watson LCSO, observed a sedan pass him traveling 55 mph in a 45 mph zone and failed to dim his bright lights. 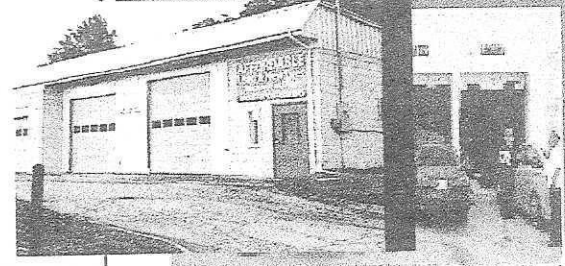

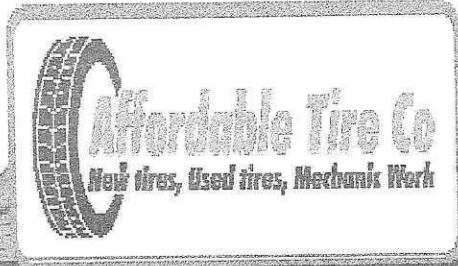

Kayle Marcum, 22, Copenhaver Road Lenoir City, was charged with Simple Possession x2, Tampering/Fabricating with Evidence, Poss. of Drug Para., and Contraband in Penal Institution.

Officer R. Miller, with the Lenoir City Police Department, conducted a traffic stop on a gold Honda SUV for a seatbelt violation (front seat passenger) and a light law violation (both brake lights were not functioning) in the area of A Street at 7th Avenue in Lenoir City, TN. Upon the traffic stop the female passenger was identified to be Kayley Marcum and the male driver was identified as Dylan Parson. While speaking with both subjects the officer noticed signs of nervous behavior. During the roadside investigation the officer requested a Loudon County K9 to respond to his location at which time K9 Investigator Clay Jenkins arrived on scene within a reasonable amount of time. K9 Inv. Clay Jenkins con-

ducted an open-air sniff of the vehicle with his K9 partner Déjà Vu at which time he stated that she alerted to a positive odor of narcotics coming from inside of the vehicle.

A probable cause search of the vehicle was then conducted. During the subsequent search of the vehicle the officer located a green digital scale that contained crystal-like residue on it believed to be methamphetamine residue sitting in the center console of the vehicle. The officer also located an additional scale that had the same crystal-like residue on it in a backpack which was sitting on top of the center console. These scales were located within reaching distances of both parties. Located in the glove box of the vehicle were two orange and white capsule pills labeled (AN 1317) which were identified to be Pregabalin and are registered as Schedule V Controlled Substance. During the time of the investigation there were no prescriptions for the Pregabalin

pills located. The two pills were located within reaching distances of both parties.

The officer also located sev-

eral corner cut bags along with a box of opened sandwich bags where are commonly used to distribute narcotics with.
