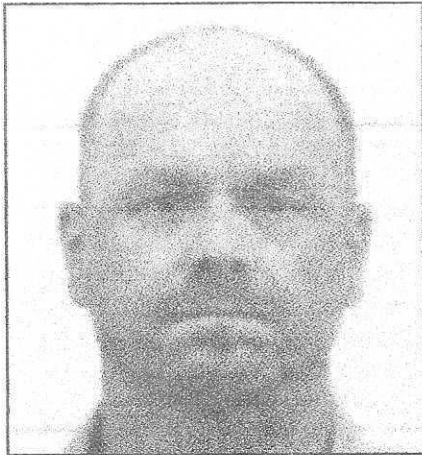

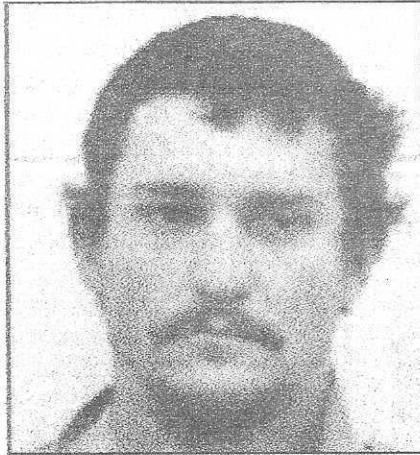

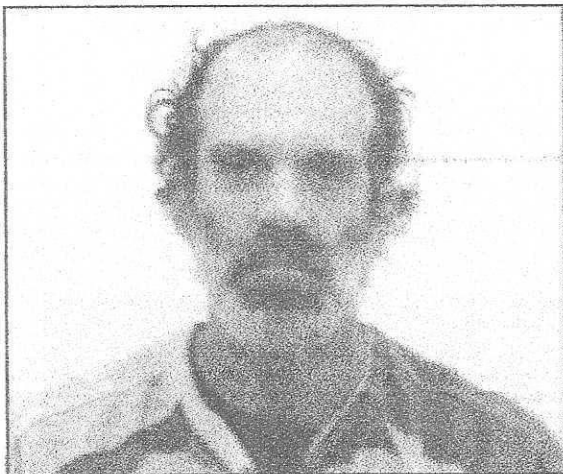

## Operation Clean House: New Orleans

*Violent crime of targeting the most violent individuals is part of long-term effort to uproot crime in the city and throughout Louisiana*

On June 27, FBI New Orleans announced the results of Operation Clean House, an intelligence-driven operation conducted in partnership with federal, state, and local agencies to target the most violent individuals on the city's streets.

For four weeks in June 2024, law enforcement teams spread across the city to combat the most prevalent types of violent crime, such as homicides, armed robberies, car

jackings, and shootings.

The operation officially ended on June 26, resulting in a combined 155 arrests, 54 firearms confiscated, 10 firearm switches, and 39 instances of illegal narcotics taken off the streets.

FBI New Orleans Special Agent in Charge Lyonel Myrthil explained that this operation is part of a long-term, methodical effort to uproot crime in New Orleans and throughout the state of Louisiana. "This is not a 'one and done' effort.

This is a sustained effort across law enforcement agencies to systematically reduce crime."

Though New Orleans has recently seen a downward trend in its violent crime rate, "[we] still have a lot of work to do to make sure the members of our community feel safe," noted Myrthil. "All the things that make this city and this community great can be overshadowed

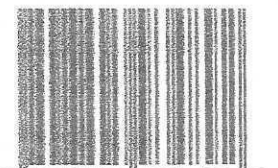

Officer R. Miller, with the Lenoir City Police Department, initiated a traffic stop on a Ford sedan with heavily tinted windows in the parking lot of Hardee's located in Lenoir City, TN for a window tint violation. Upon the traffic stop the front passenger side window registered at 20%. Officer Miller then

identified the driver of the vehicle to be David McAlister who was also the registered owner of the vehicle. While speaking with MCALISTER about the violation at the passenger's side window officer Miller could smell an odor of marijuana emitting from inside of the vehicle. Officer Miller then had MCALISTER step out of the vehicle to speak with him further about a citation. While speaking with MCALISTER, he stated that FREEZE did have marijuana and stated that he had a gun. A probable cause search of the vehicle was then conducted. During the subsequent search of the vehicle, officer Miller noticed marijuana residue through-

out the passenger's side of the vehicle where FREEZE was sitting. Located on the driver's side visor in a visor organizer was a bag containing a crystal-like substance believed to be methamphetamine - approximate weight (2.48 grams). Located in a suitcase in the back seat was a Taurus G2C 9mm handgun along with a jar of a green

leafy substance believed to be marijuana - approximate weight (3.14 grams) and a metal grinder that contained a green leafy residue believed to be residue from marijuana. The suitcase was identified to belong to FREEZE. MCALISTER was placed under arrest and transported to the Loudon County Jail without incident

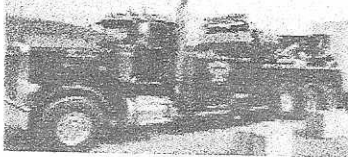

Marty Mills, 41, Miller Road Lenoir City, was charged with Criminal Trespassing.

Officer H. Wilkes LCPD, was dispatched to Food City Market Drive, in reference to a welfare check. The complainant advised central dispatch that a homeless male was outside of the business with an open container of alcohol. Upon arrival, the officer made contact with Marty Mills laying in the back of the Food City parking lot. From prior knowledge, the officer knew of Mr. Mills to be criminally trespassed from Food City - 300 Market Dr. The information was confirmed through a records search of Mr. Mills utilizing RMS, and he was subsequently taken into my custody. The alcohol that was in Mr. Mills possession was emptied on scene and thrown away. Due to the aforementioned, Mr. Mills was transported to the Loudon County Jail without further incident. 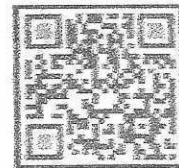
#### Police beat

Michael Cope, 25, Nicole Chase Lane Knoxville, was charged with DUI, Contributing to the Delinquency of a Minor x2. Deputy Brockwell LCSO, was advised by dispatch that Loudon City Police Department was looking for an older model blue Ford F150 for questioning for an incident that occurred at 409 Highway 11 East (Marathon gas station). Deputy Brockwell observed the described vehicle take a left onto Sugar Limb Road from Highway 11 and initiated a traffic stop on Sugar Limb Road just before Hotchkiss Valley Road West. Deputy Brockwell made contact with the driver, Michael Cope, and explained to him why he was stopping him. While talking to Cope, he was slurring his words

and had very glossy eyes. Deputy Brockwell gathered his information and ran him through dispatch. A Loudon City Officer arrived on scene and stated that they were out at the Marathon dealing with 2 intoxicated female juveniles. The 2 juvenile females stated that a blue Ford F150 dropped them off and that they have been drinking. Deputy Brockwell then asked Cope if he had consumed any alcoholic beverages, and he stated that he has not been drinking. At this time Deputy Brockwell asked Cope to step out of the vehicle and asked if he would be okay with performing a few tests to ensure he could safely operate his vehicle on the roadway. Cope stated that he was willing to perform the requested test. At that time Deputy Brockwell assisted and performed standardized field sobriety exercises. Based on the totality of the circumstances and poor Standardized Field Sobriety Tests (SFST) performance indicated that he was under the influence of a drug or intoxicant that impaired his ability to operate a motor vehicle on a public roadway safely. Deputy Brockwell then placed Cope under arrest for driving under the influence. While being handcuffed, Sgt. Pesterfield advised Cope of his rights and asked him questions of the incident that occurred at the Marathon. Cope stated that he did not know the 2 juvenile females were underage. The juvenile stated on a statement form that Cope bought and supplied the alcohol that they were drinking on the lake (see statement form in attached files). Cope was then charged with 2 counts of contributing to the delinquency of a minor. The vehicle was towed by moneymakers. This did happen in Loudon County, TN without further incident.

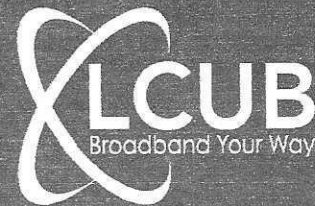

**Sex Offender**

Robert Lyle, 31, Homeless Loudon, was charged with Sex Offender Registry

Robert Lyle was released from the Loudon County Detention Center for violation of the Sex Offender Registry. Robert Lyle is required per the Tennessee Bureau of Investigations sexual offender registry to register within 48 hours of arrival and 48 hours prior to release, register, or report in person with the Sheriff or Sheriff's designee by completing and signing a TBI registra-

tion form under penalty of perjury. According to the TBI Sex Offender Registry database Sergeant Detective Carver was the last person to register Lyle on April 25th, 2024, and he did not report to any other agencies in this period. Based on this information, on June 25th, 2024 contact was made with Lyle's Parole Office and informed them of this violation. Between the time frame of 5:00 PM and 8:00 PM, the detective received over 20 phone calls and 7 voicemails threatening and harassing her stating she had a Vendetta against

him Lieutenant Detective Cosner made contact with Lyle through Dispatch which is also attached to this report explaining to him why he was in violation and that he needed to report to the Sheriff's Office by 8:15 AM on June 26th, 2024 or he would be absconded and in violation. As of today at 2:40 PM Lyle has not registered with any agency as he was advised to do so. Lyle

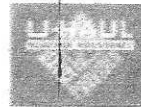
was provided a copy of his responsibilities through the TBI Instruction Form and signed this form when he registered in April. Lyle has been on the registry long enough to understand these responsibilities and has violated them twice in June. Lyle's Parole Officer disclosed that he was aware Lyle was in an unknown hotel in Lenoir city. This did occur in Loudon County TN

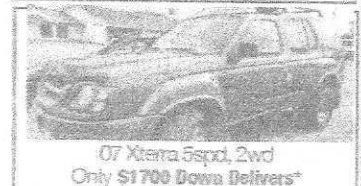

with pervasive violent crime. This is why it is important now, more than ever, to leverage our partnerships to reduce this activity."

To prepare for Operation Clean House, FBI New Orleans and its partners collaborated for months, identifying and prioritizing the most violent individuals in the Greater New Orleans area. They coordinated with federal, state, and local prosecutors and worked closely with the Orleans Parish Sheriff's Office to prepare for the increased arrests and detainees.

"Together, we focused on collective intelligence gathered from all our partners and what we were hearing from our own community members in the most affected neighborhoods," said Myrthil. "Community is particularly important to the culture in New Orleans, and this level of overt coordination between law enforcement agencies had an immediate positive effect."

Operation Clean House was implemented in two phases.

Phase One focused on a proactive strategy. Law enforcement teams were deployed in every district of New Orleans, engaging in real-time, intelligence-driven actions. Uniformed and unmarked units from multiple agencies received live analytical support as they moved into targeted areas.

Phase One resulted in 74 arrests; multiple dangerous drugs seized, including fentanyl, heroin, crack cocaine, and oxycodone; and 46 firearms and ammunition taken into evidence, including AK-47s, AR-15s, Glock switches, and multiple types of handguns.

"Each weapon and each bullet confiscated is potentially one less person potentially injured or killed," said Myrthil.

Phase Two focused on fugitive apprehension. During the planning phase, partner agencies submitted more than 400 outstanding arrest warrants to FBI intelligence analysts to review and determine whether to include as part of Operation Clean House. Analysts vetted warrants for consideration,

checking to see which ones were still active, whether the subject was already incarcerated, or, in some cases, whether the subject was deceased. The analysts narrowed the list of warrants to 76 of the most violent offenses, including attempted murder, assault by drive-by shooting, and aggravated battery or aggravated assault. The warrants were then divided among multi-agency teams to make arrests.

Phase Two resulted in 77 arrests, including 100% execution of all warrants, and the seizure of 11 firearms and additional ammunition.

"We saw significant results immediately, including the arrest of a 31-year-old man from Pennsylvania on gun and drug charges who was also wanted in Vermont for first-degree murder," said Myrthil. "At the time we arrested him, this suspected killer had two guns in his possession, including one with an extended magazine."

The operation led to one suspect being taken into custody within minutes of a shooting near a New Orleans neighborhood where agents, officers, and troop-

ers were already working. In another incident, state troopers and Homeland Security investigation agents provided life-saving support to a subject who had shot himself in the leg while fleeing from law enforcement.

Ultimately, Operation Clean House's successful results came down to the integration between intelligence and operational components, which ensured a smooth flow of validated information, and partnerships between law enforcement and local communities.

"The research and analysis conducted by the intelligence analysts were crucial to this operation and contributed to the likelihood of safe apprehensions," said Myrthil. "The tremendous partnerships the FBI enjoys with external federal, state, and local law enforcement agencies were key to success. We are proud to also recognize the support of the New Orleans community and its active interest in combating violent crime."





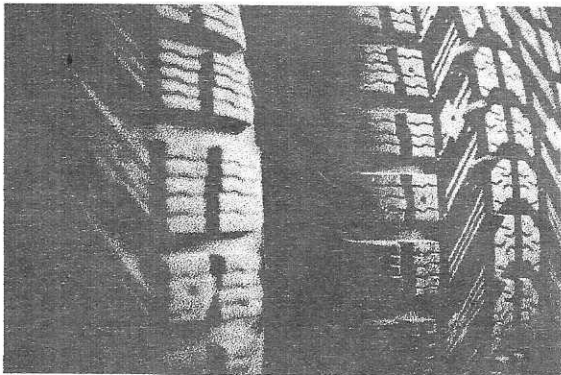
