U.S. Attorney's Office To Work With Local Partners To Reduce Domestic Violence

U.S. Justice Department Designates the City of Chattanooga Under Section 1103 of the Violence Against Women Act, Prioritizing Firearms Prosecutions of Domestic Violence Offenders

Attorney General Merrick B. Garland has approved an initial set of 78 communities across 47 states, territories, and the District of Columbia for designation under Section 1103

of the Violence Against Women Act Reauthorization Act of 2022.

The Justice Department - through its United States Attorney's offices (USAOs) and Bureau of Alcohol, Tobacco, Firearms and Explosives (ATF) Field Divisions - will partner with each designated jurisdiction to develop a plan to reduce intimate partner firearm violence and to prioritize prosecutions of domestic violence offenders prohibited under 18 U.S. Code Section 922(g) from

owning firearms.

In making the announcement, Attorney General Merrick B. Garland explained, "Today, I designated an initial set of 78 communities across the country, with more to follow, where we will surge Department resources to combat firearm violence against intimate partners and children."

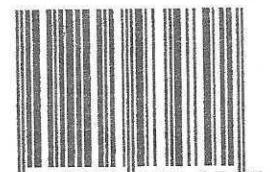

responded to a suspicious ve-
hicle call on Oakland Road.
Upon arrival, the deputy ob-
served a gold Toyota Sienna
van (South Carolina regis-
tration SNV26) in the ditch
with the airbags deployed.
While further investigating,
the deputy cut the airbags
out of the window to see if I
could see any occupants. The
only occupant of the vehicle
was a large white dog in the
very back of the van, stuck
between a large black tote and
the rear driver-side window.
Cpl. Wallen arrived on the
scene and assisted Brockwell
in getting the dog out of the
vehicle to make sure the dog
was not injured. We opened
the van's rear hatch to help the
dog out of the vehicle. When
we got the dog out of the ve-

hicle, we notified dispatch to
start the next scheduled tow
truck to our location because
the vehicle was totaled and
vacant. Upon inventorying the
vehicle, we observed a small
brown Amazon box contain-
ing packages labeled "psilo-
cybin mushrooms" giving us
probable cause to search the
vehicle further. While search-
ing the vehicle, we found 201
unlabeled resealable bags con-
taining gummies (1 was sent
for testing), 174 labeled "one
up" resealable bags containing
gummies (4 were sent for test-
ing), 19 empty pink-colored
resealable bags, 500 empty sil-
ver-colored resealable bags, 20
empty labeled "one up" reseal-
able bags, 3 large clear reseal-
able bags containing gummies
(all were sent for testing) and

1 1/2 vacuum sealed black bags containing a mushroom substance (the 1/2 bag was sent for testing). There was a large black tote with a yellow lid containing multiple household items to manufacture psilocybin mushroom gummies. At the bottom of that tote was \$2,700 in cash held together by a rubber band and 9 psilocybin mushroom candy bars. We then located a dehydration machine commonly used to manufacture psilocybin gummies. When we searched the front of the vehicle, we located a wallet with a South Carolina driver's license (driver's license #101098585) coming back to Hailey Elizabeth Fulton who was also the registered owner of the vehicle. The deputy then observed a folder in the vehicle containing important documents. All the evidence was taken and logged into evidence, and the vehicle was towed from the scene. The evidence we gathered was sent for testing awaiting results. While logging the evidence into the system, dispatch received a phone call from a gentleman named James stating that his friend, Hailey, was involved in an accident and that when they went back for the vehicle it was gone. Cpl. Wallen attempted to meet Hailey and James to gain more information on the investigation, but they never showed up to make a report on this matter. There is no evidence placing Hailey at the

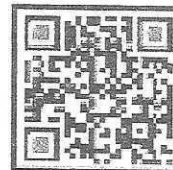
scene of the accident just her personal belongings being inside of the vehicle. The vehicle was towed by James Towing, and the dog was taken to the Loudon County Animal Shelter. On September 10, 2024, at approximately 1830, Deputy Brockwell was notified by dispatch that Hailey Fulton was on the line wanting to speak with me regarding her vehicle being towed. Deputy Brockwell explained to Fulton that her vehicle was left abandoned on the side of the road and it was totaled. She was very adamant about getting a personal friend to tow the vehicle back to South Carolina and Brockwell told her that her vehicle was on hold until someone could show proof of ownership for the vehicle. Deputy Brockwell then explained to her that she had to be the one to pick up her personal belongings because there were important documents that could only be released to her. Deputy Brockwell then asked Fulton if she was the one driving the vehicle and she stated that she was the one driving the vehicle and the reason for her wrecking was avoiding a deer in the middle of the road. At any point during this conversation, Fulton never asked about the dog that was in the vehicle or the well-being of the dog. All of this was on a recorded line through dispatch (see attached files for full audio of the phone call). Warrants are being filed on Fulton for leaving the scene of an accident, man/sell/del of schedule I (mushrooms), and cruelty to animals.

Deputy Ezell LCSO, was assisting Deputies with a traffic stop at Sugarlimb Road and Hotchkiss Valley Road West When the deputy was informed by Deputies that a suspicious vehicle had turned onto Hotchkiss

Valley Road West. Deputies stated that the driver of the vehicle attempted to conceal their face and the vehicle appeared to be missing its registration. 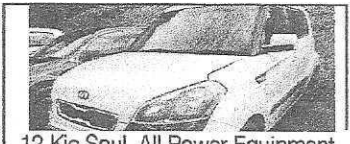

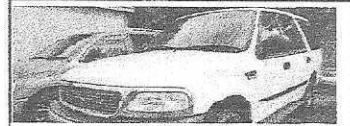

Jose Huerta-Ariza, 25, Blue Springs Lane Knoxville, was charged with, DUI, and Open Container.

Deputy Watson LCSO, responded to the area of Interstate 75 at the 72 exit in reference to a reckless driver that was traveling on Interstate 75 Northbound.

The complainant stated that the vehicle was swerving and going from one side of the road to the other. The deputy observed the vehicle matching the description of the suspect vehicle and started observing it. The vehicle failed to maintain lane and almost struck a semi. The deputy stopped the vehicle in the area of the 74-mile marker. The deputy made contact with Jose Huerta-Ariza in the driver's seat of the vehicle. Mr. Huerta-Ariza was the

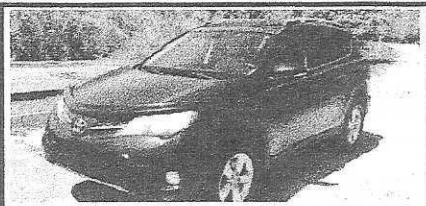

Chattanooga was designated. "The cooperation and partnership between federal and state law enforcement in Chattanooga has always been strong," said United States Attorney Francis M. Hamilton III, of the Eastern District of Tennessee. "Our office supports the Department of Justice's designation of Chattanooga as a community where federal prosecutors and agents will continue to work beside our local counterparts and community stakeholders to further target the most violent individuals, including violent domestic abusers. In collaboration with our state and local partners, we will continue to hold armed domestic violence offenders accountable."

"ATF recognizes the role firearms play in violent crimes and, more specifically, domestic violence." ATF Special Agent in Charge, Marcus Watson stated. "We at ATF are committed to aggressively pursuing prohibited possession of firearms due to domestic violence convictions and will continue to work with our partners to remove convicted domestic abusers who possess firearms from our communities."

Locally, the United States Attorney's Office regularly assists with the prosecution of violent individuals who illegally possess firearms. Federal prosecutors routinely collaborate with Chattanooga-area assistant district attorneys general to evaluate strategies to maximize the effective prosecution of firearms crime in both state and federal court. Prosecutors estimate at least 50 percent of those individuals identified for federal prosecution for these offenses have a previous domestic violence arrest or conviction.

Designated areas across the country include rural areas, suburban areas, urban areas, and Tribal communities. The designation represents the partnership and coordination between the department and the local jurisdiction to ensure federal resources are being leveraged effectively to address intimate partner firearm violence.

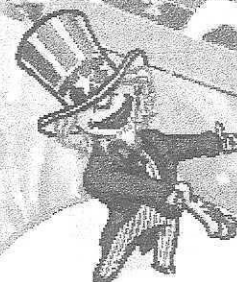

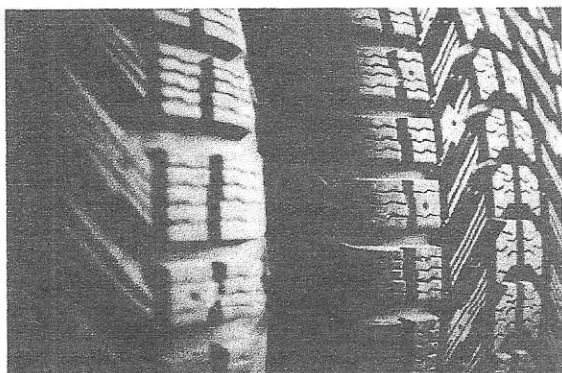
