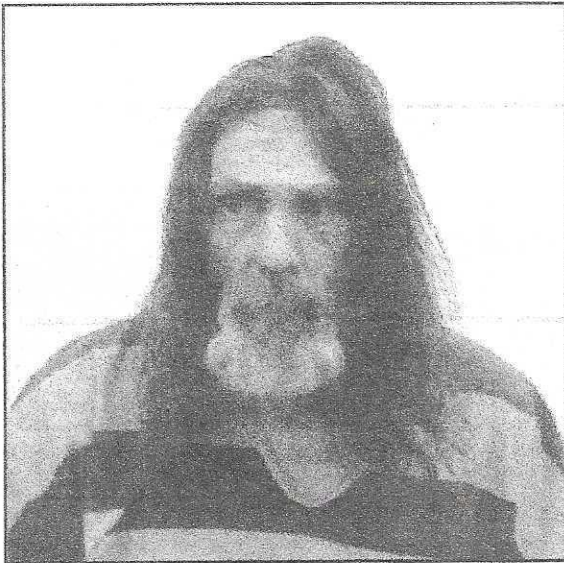

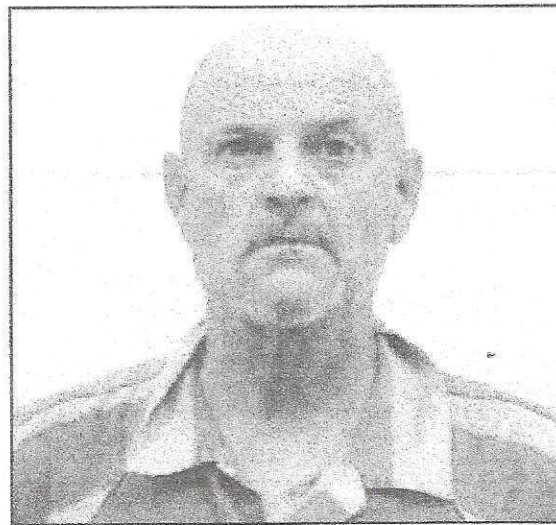

## Memphis Man Sentenced To Over 15 Years For Firearms Offense

Mario Delaine, 39, of Memphis, was sentenced to 188 months in prison by the Honorable Charles E. Atchley, Jr, United States District Judge, in the United States District Court for the Eastern District of Tennessee at Chattanooga. Following imprisonment, Delaine will be on supervised release for five years.

As part of the plea agreement filed with the court, Delaine agreed to plead guilty to an indictment charging him with possession of a firearm

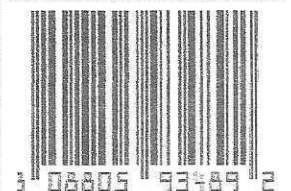
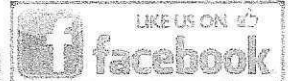

## Charged

Leland Tipton, 31, Watson Lane Harriman, was charged with, Reckless Endangerment, Evading Arrest, Vandalism, Assault Against First Responded or Nurse, and Driving on Revoked/Suspended License.

Deputy Watson LCSO, was notified that Roane County was in pursuit on Interstate 40 eastbound. The deputy got to the off-ramp at the 364-mile marker and observed a silver sedan traveling eastbound exiting on the ramp at a high rate of speed. Roane County had only 1 unit involved in the pursuit at this time. Dep-

uty Ezell and Watson joined the pursuit that continued on Highway 321 into Lenoir City. The vehicle then reentered the interstate on I-75 Northbound. The vehicle continued back to I-40 and went eastbound. The suspect vehicle exited onto the 369-mile marker (Watt Road) and went right toward Kingston Pike. Deputies continued the pursuit to approximately 501 Watt Road when the suspect made a U-Turn and attempted to go back toward I-40 in the wrong lane. Due to the extremely dangerous driving behavior that the suspect had already exhibited, and the other units that were still coming up Watt Road attempting to catch

up to the pursuit, Deputy Watson positioned his patrol vehicle in front of the suspect to stop him from continuing in the wrong lane and he struck his patrol vehicle. Once the suspect struck the patrol vehicle, the deputy exited and the suspect was taken into custody. No injuries were reported by any party due to the accident. The

suspect did receive medical attention on scene due to telling officers that he ingested drugs during the pursuit. The Rockwood Police Department was the primary pursuing agency. The suspect was transported to UT Hospital by Knox County EMS. Charges are being filed due to this incident. This did occur in Loudon County, TN.

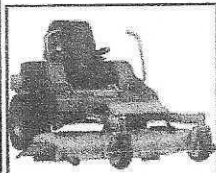

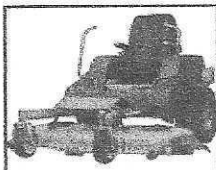

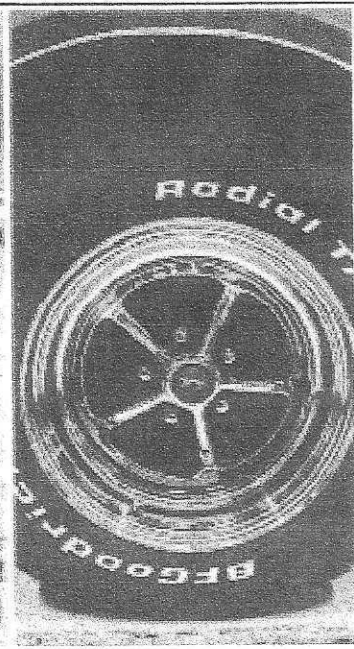

Regina Helton, 45, Abbott Road Lenoir City, was charged with Misuse of 911 Emergency.

Deputy B. McCall, along with Deputy J. Turpin LCSO, was dispatched to Abbott Road in reference to a misuse of the 911 emergency system. Loudon County 911 Dispatch advised that the offender, Regina Helton, had called 911 stating she was an investigative reporter, that there was a missing inmate from the jail, and that no one would provide her with information. Dispatch further advised that Mrs. Helton had called 911 three times overnight without a legitimate emergency. Deputies had previously spoken to her by phone and advised her not to call 911 unless it was an actual emergency. Upon arrival, Mrs. Helton refused to come to the door to speak with me. Based on the in-

formation provided and her repeated misuse of the emergency system, the deputy is charging Regina Helton with a violation of TCA 7-86-316, Misuse of the 911 Emergency System. This incident occurred in Loudon County, Tennessee.

**Delaine**

as a felon, in violation of Title 18 United States Code, Sections 922(g)(1). Because Delaine had three previous convictions for violent felonies committed on occasions different from one another, he was subject to enhanced penalties under the Armed Career Criminal Act, which requires a mandatory minimum 15 years imprisonment.

According to filed court documents, in November 2022, Chattanooga Police Department Officers responded to reports of gunfire coming from a third-floor room of the Motel 6 on Williams Street. Upon arrival, officers heard and observed gunshots being actively fired out of a third-floor window. Officers entered the hotel,

located the room, and ordered the occupant(s) to exit. As officers took cover, an additional gunshot was fired through the door into the hallway. Officers maintained their position and Delaine eventually exited the room and surrendered. Officers located a Glock 9-millimeter pistol, multiple spent 9-millimeter cartridge cases, and bullet holes in the exterior window and interior door.

U.S. Attorney Francis M. Hamilton III of the Eastern District of Tennessee made the announcement.

The criminal indictment was the result of an investigation by the Bureau of Alcohol, Tobacco, Firearms, and Explosives Chattanooga Field Office and the

Chattanooga Police Department.

Assistant United States Attorneys Kevin T. Brown and Luke McLaurin represented the United States.

This case is part of Operation Take Back America, a nationwide initiative that marshals the full resources of the Department of Justice to repel the invasion of illegal immigration, achieve the total elimination of cartels and transnational criminal organizations (TCOs), and protect our communities from the perpetrators of violent crime. Operation Take Back America streamlines efforts and resources from the Department's Organized Crime Drug Enforcement Task Forces (OCDETFs) and Project Safe Neighborhood (PSN).

Earl Roll, 66, Station Court Georgia, was charged with, DUI, Mfg/Del/Sale or Poss. of Meth.

Deputy Willis along with Corporal Jon Sartin LCSO, responded to the area of Highway 70 in reference to several calls that came into Loudon County Dispatch for a possible intoxicated driver. The callers gave a vehicle description of a blue Ford F-150 with Georgia registration all over the roadway. While traveling on Highway 70 a vehicle matching that description passed me traveling the opposite way. The deputy turned around and when he caught up with the vehicle Cpl. Sartin was behind it. Cpl. Sartin and deputy Willis turned on their emergency equipment and initiated a traffic stop on the vehicle at Highway 70 and Abbott Road due to Cpl. Sartin observing the vehicle in his lane

while negotiating a curve. Cpl. Sartin approached the driver's side of the vehicle and came into contact with the Offender Earl Edward Roll. Cpl. Sartin had him turn the vehicle off and exit it. Mr. Roll was very unsteady on his feet having to use his vehicle to keep himself from falling. Cpl. Sartin asked for consent to search his person to which he agreed. During the search, the deputy located a clear baggie with a crystal-like substance in his right jacket pocket believed to be Methamphetamine. The deputy then placed Mr. Roll into Cpl. Sartin's patrol vehicle and transported him to the Loudon County Jail. Once at the jail, the deputy asked Mr. Roll if he would perform the Standardized Field Sobriety Test to which he agreed. Mr. Roll performed poorly on all tests and even had to tell me he could not complete some of them. The deputy then read Mr. Roll Implied Con-

sent, and he consented to a blood draw. Cpl. Sartin took possession of the suspected Meth, weighed it, and placed it into evidence. The deputy transported Mr. Roll to Fort Loudon Medical Center where the blood draw was completed. The deputy then transported him back to the Jail. Mr. Roll's vehicle was towed by Malones Wrecker Service. Mr. was charged with Driving Under the Influence and Manufacture Delivery Sale or Possession of Methamphetamine. The BAC was submitted to TBI for analysis.

Deputy Knight LCSO, was at Eaton's Food Mart on Highway 70 speaking with

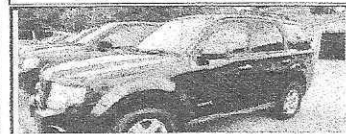

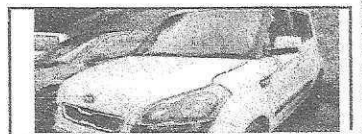

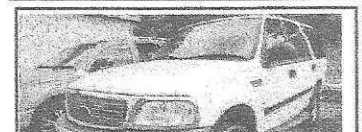

stopped. The deputy ordered the driver out of the vehicle. The deputy identified the driver to be Jason Waldrop and the passenger to be a female.
