

Mario Delaine, 39, of Memphis, was sentenced to 188 months in prison by the Honorable Charles E. Atchley, Jr. United States District Judge, in the United States District Court for the Eastern District of Tennessee at Chattanooga. Following imprisonment, Delaine will be on supervised release for five years.

As part of the plea agreement filed with the court, Delaine agreed to plead guilty to an indictment charging him with possession of a firearm

Leland Tipton, 31, Watson Lane Harriman, was charged with, Reckless Endangerment, Evading Arrest, Vandalism, Assault Against First Respond-Revoked/Suspended License.

Deputy Watson LCSO, was notified that Roane County was in pursuit on Interstate 40 eastbound. The deputy got to the off-ramp at the 364-mile marker and observed a silver sedan traveling eastbound exiting on the ramp at a high rate of speed. Roane County had only 1 unit involved in the pursuit at this time. Dep-

uty Ezell and Watson joined the pursuit that continued on Highway 321 into Lenoir City. The vehicle then reentered the interstate on I-75 Northbound. The vehicle continued back to I-4() and went eastbound. The ed or Nurse, and Driving on, suspect vehicle exited onto the 369-mile marker (Watt Road) and went right toward Kingston Pike. Deputies continued the pursuit to approximately 501 Watt Road when the susnect made a U-Turn and attempted to go back toward I-40 in the wrong lane. Due to the extremely dangerous driving behavior that the suspect had already exhibited, and the other units that were still coming up Watt Road attempting to catch

up to the pursuit, Deputy Watson positioned his patrol vehicle in front of the suspect to stop him from continuing in the wrong lane and he struck his patrol vehicle. Once the suspect struck the patrol vehicle, the deputy exited and the suspect was taken into custody. No injuries were reported by any party due to the accident. The suspect did receive medical attention on scene due to telling officers that he ingested drugs during the pursuit. The Rockwood Police Department was the primary pursuing agency. The suspect was transported to UT Hospital by Knox County EMS. Charges are being filed due to this incident. This did occur in Loudon County, TN.





Regina Helton, 45, Abbott Road Lenoir City, was charged with Misuse of 911 Emergency.

Deputy B. McCall, along with Deputy J. Turpin LCSO, was dispatched to Abbott Road in reference to a misuse of the 911 emergency system. Loudon County 911 Dispatch advised that the offender, Regina Helton, had called 911 stating she was an investigative reporter, that there was a missing inmate from the jail, and that no one would provide her with information. Dispatch further advised that Mrs. Helton had called 911 three times overnight without a legitimate emergency. Deputies had previously spoken to her by phone and advised her not to call 911 unless it was an actual emergency. Upon arrival, Mrs. Helton refused to come to the door to speak with me. Based on the information provided and her repeated misuse of the emergency system, the deputy is charging Regina Helton with a violation of TCA 7-86-316, Misuse of the 911 Emergency System. This incident occurred in Loudon County, Tennessee.

as a felon, in violation of Title 18 United States Code, Sections 922(g)(1). Because Delaine had three previous convictions for violent felonies committed on occasions different from one another, he was subject to enhanced penalties under the Armed Career Criminal Act, which requires a mandatory minimum 15 years imprisonment.

According to filed court documents, in November 2022, Chattanooga Police Department Officers responded to reports of gunfire coming from a third-floor room of the Motel 6 on Williams Street. Upon arrival, officers heard and observed gunshots being actively fired out of a third-floor window. Officers entered the hotel.

located the room, and ordered the occupant(s) to exit. As officers took cover, an additional gunshot was fired through the door into the hallway. Officers maintained their position and Delaine eventually exited the room and surrendered. Officers located a Glock 9-millimeter pistol, multiple spent 9-millimeter cartridge cases, and bullet holes in the exterior window and interior door.

U.S. Attorney Francis M. Hamilton III of the Eastern District of Tennessee made the announcement.

The criminal indictment was the result of an investigation by the Bureau of Alcohol, Tobacco, Firearms, and Explosives Chattanooga Field Office and the Chattanooga Police Department. Assistant United States Attorneys Kevin T. Brown and Luke McLaurin represented the Unit-

ed States.

This case is part of Operation Take Back America, a nationwide initiative that marshals the full resources of the Department of Justice to repel the invasion of illegal immigration, achieve the total elimination of cartels and transnational criminal organizations (TCOs), and protect our communities from the perpetrators of violent crime. 


