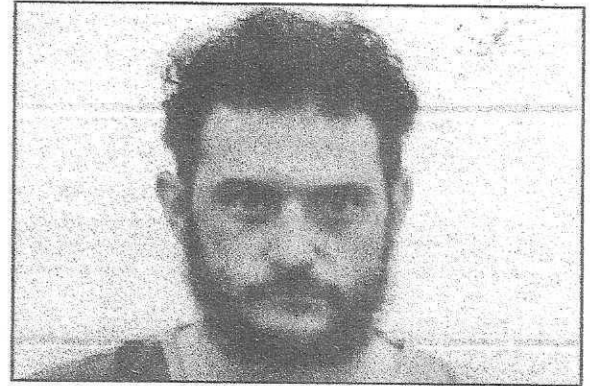

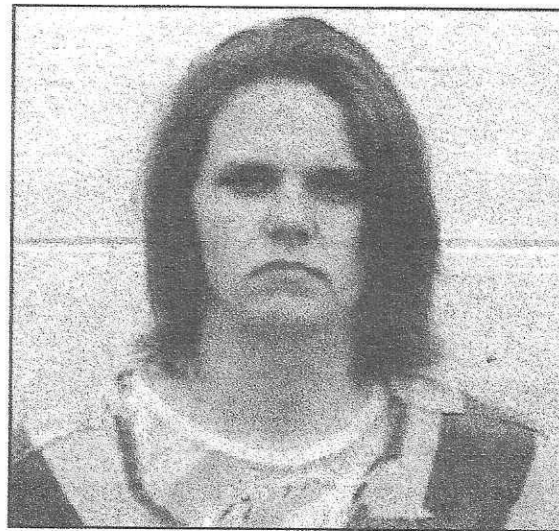

Restitution Claims Process to Open for Former Patients of HRC Medical Centers

Tennessee Attorney General Jonathan Skrmetti today announced the official opening of the claims process for providing limited restitution to former patients of HRC Medical Centers, which deceptively advertised hormone therapy treatments.

The Tennessee Attorney General's Office has worked for more than a decade to recover funds for consumers. The Office

Riley Burgess, 31, Royal Palm Lane Lenoir City, was charged with, Aggravated Assault x2, Aggravated Burglary, Public Intoxication, Resisting Arrest, Vandalism, and Poss. of Handgun While Under the Influence.

Officers with the Lenoir City Police Department were dispatched to the Days Inn in reference to a vandalism. Upon arrival, Officer D. Mendez and I

Officer J. Green contacted the complainant inside the Days Inn reception lobby.

They stated that a man named Riley Burgess kicked in the door to room 202 and brandished a gun to the occupants, they also stated that he left in a white truck.

While standing in the lobby, Officer Green, observed a white truck pulling back into the parking lot and he asked the employee if that was him and they stated yes. They then

started to question Mr. Burgess about the incident, and he stated that "the three guys staying in that room upstairs were messing with him and coming down to their trucks and keeping their hands where he could not see them." He then stated that "he thought he heard a kid screaming upstairs in their room, so he then went up there and kicked the door in to confront them."

Mr. Burgess was staying in room 105, which is

below room 202. We then asked Mr. Burgess if he had pointed a gun at them and he said "no, after Burgess talked to them, they threatened me, so Burgess came down to his truck and stuck it in the air." Two out of three room occupants observed this action and stated they were in fear for their life.

The officer then transported Mr. Burgess to Loudon County Jail without further incident.

All the above did occur in Lenoir City, Tennessee.

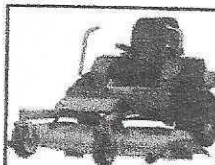
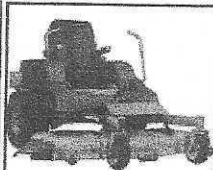

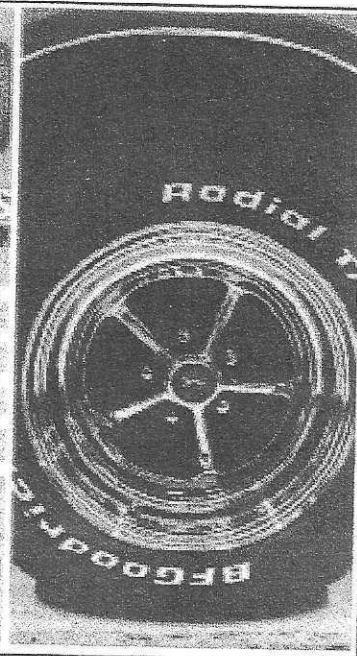

Vandalism

Andrew Kotronias, 31, Waller Ferry Road Lenoir City, was charged with Vandalism.

Deputy Owens LCSO, was dispatched to Waller Ferry Road about vandalism. Upon arrival, the deputy could hear what sounded like glass breaking coming from the side of the residence. On the side of the house, the deputy observed a male identified as Andrew standing beside the house with a metal rod. Commands were given to Andrew to drop the rod, which he did. Andrew was then detained. Upon speaking with Andrew's father, who was identified as the victim, he stated that Andrew had broken two of the windows to the residence. The victim said he believed Andrew to be under the influence of an intoxicant. The victim said he wanted to press charges against Andrew. Andrew was placed under arrest for vandalism. Andrew was previously placed under arrest for the same charges on 12/29/2024. While transporting Andrew to the jail, he complained of a rapid heart-beat and trouble breathing. The deputy requested EMS to come and evaluate him at Weigel's located at 4567 Hwy 321 N. Andrew was cleared by EMS. He was then transported to the Loudon County Jail without incident. All of the above did occur in Loudon County, Tennessee.

Claims

sued HRC Medical Centers in 2012, alleging that HRC made numerous deceptive statements in the advertising of its bioidentical hormone replacement therapy treatments, and obtained an \$18 million judgment against the company in 2017. After years of additional litigation to maximize collection of the judgment amount, the Office believes it has collected all currently available assets of the defendants and is commencing distribution of the approximately \$1.5 million it has been able to collect to the consumers who were harmed by HRC's deception.

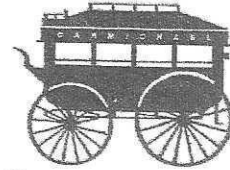
"For more than a decade, our office has worked hard to protect consumers and secure restitution from HRC Medical Centers for misleading Tennesseans about the safety and efficacy of life-altering treatments," said Tennessee Attorney General Jonathan Skrmetti. "While we are disappointed we could not recover more, we've known for a long time that funds would be limited and we fought to obtain every possible dollar for consumers."

Consumers who purchased bioidentical hormone replacement therapy treatments from one of HRC's three Tennessee locations in Nashville, Knoxville, and Memphis are eligible for restitution. The restitution fund will be split among all consumers who file a valid claim, with a maximum of \$2,250 recovery for each individual consumer. The lawsuit did not address medical malpractice or negligence claims, so the restitution payments will not include compensation for any medical injuries consumers may have sustained.

The mother, stated that her and Dakota got into a verbal argument regarding

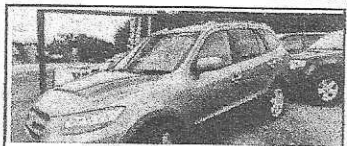

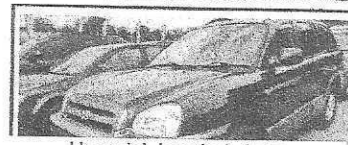

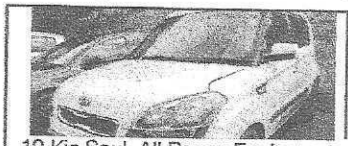

Dakota acting out and entering one of her episodes. Officer Tatham, Sergeant Lyon and the officer have observed Dakota in this state before in a previous call for service last week. Dakota was observed to be talking to herself, anxious, pacing, and unable to rest. Dakota also becomes agitated and aggressive during these episodes. Dakota does have a history

of using narcotics. Daphne explained that she wanted Dakota to leave for the night and get a ride because she was causing her to lose sleep, causing a disturbance for the hotel and becoming confrontational.
