FBI Houston Field Office Special Agent Charge (SAC) Douglas Williams announced the addition of Giovanni Vicente Mosquera Serrano to the FBI's Ten Most Wanted Fugitives list. Mosquera Serrano, 37, is the first Tren de Aragua (TdA) member featured on the notorious list. SAC Williams was joined by U.S. Attorney for

of Texas Nicholas Ganjei, who provided remarks on the federal charges Mosquera Serrano faces.

Fugitive Giovanni Vicente Mosquera Serrano, an alleged senior leader of Tren de Aragua, is wanted for numerous federal charges. He is the 536th addition to the FBI's list of notorious fugitives and the first TdA member to ap-

"Being outdoors in severe heat can be extremely dangerous, especially for the elderly and young children,



Christopher Hively, 56, Hinton Avenue Knoxville, was charged with, Evading Arrest, Reckless Driving, and Driving on Revoked/Suspended License.

Officer R. Miller, with the Lenoir City Police Department, was in 1000 Block of Highway 321 North in Lenoir City, TN. While in the area he observed a black in color Nissan sedan baring the Tennessee Registration of (242BPYQ) traveling north on Highway 321. As the officer was attempting to merge into traffic onto Highway 321 from a business, he observed a white male driver operating the Nissan sedan through the front windshield of the vehicle. As the vehicle passed in from of his fully marked police cruiser, the window tint on the vehicle appeared to be darker than the Tennessee State Law of 35%, based on his training and experience. As the officer pulled out into traffic behind the Nissan

sedan it made an abrupt lane change in between two vehicles and engaged its brakes. The officer then initiated a traffic stop on the Nissan sedan in which the officer active his equipped emergency lights. The Nissan sedan immediately made an abrupt right hand turn from Highway 321 onto Creekwood Park Blvd and then made another abrupt left hand turn across oncoming lanes of traffic on Creekwood Park Blvd attempting to pull into the Ez Stop Gas Station. The Nissan almost struck another vehicle in oncoming traffic as it was making the turn into the gas station parking lot. The Nissan sedan continued to disregard the officer activated emergency lights after pulling into the gas station parking lot and continued by exiting the parking lot at a high rate of speed out on Highway 321 North. The officer continued behind the Nissan sedan with his emergency lights activated where it continued north on Highway 321 at a high rate

of speed where it made a right hand turn from Highway 321 onto Interstate 75 North Bound. A registration check was conducted on the vehicle where it showed it was registered to Clifford Hively out of Knox County, TN. During the investigation the officer was able to confirm and identify the operator of the motor vehicle to be CLIFFORD HIVELY. CLIF-FORD was also showing to be driving on a suspended drivers license status. CLIFFORD was stopped in Lenoir City while in the same vehicle back on June 6th of 2025 and issued a warning ticket.

Once the Nissan sedan continued north on Interstate 75, the officer terminated the pursuit where he stopped his police cruiser on the shoulder of Highway 321 and then met with Lt. C. Dragon in the parking lot. On 06/17/2025, Officer R. Millet,

with the Lenoir City Police Department, was in 1000 Block of Shonev's.

On 06/17/2025, Officer J. Green 429 received a FLOCK alert notifying him that Clifford Hively had passed Paisley Reece Lane with the same tag as above on a different vehicle. The vehicle the tag was on was a silver 1996 Chevrolet Blazer. The officer located the vehicle parked at Jim Hartsook Drive in front of apartment. The officer knocked on the door and Mr. Hively answered, the officer then asked him to step outside to which he complied and advised him of why he was there. The officer had Dispatch confirm the warrants with the jail and then placed Mr. Hively into custody and transported him to the Loudon County Jail. All the above did occur without further incident in Lenoir City, Tennessee.
